7 320.0605 Certificate of registration; possession required;
8 exception.—

9 (1) (a) The registration certificate or an official copy
10 thereof, including an electronic copy in a format authorized by
11 the department, a true copy of rental or lease documentation
12 issued for a motor vehicle or issued for a replacement vehicle
13 in the same registration period, a temporary receipt printed

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14 upon self-initiated electronic renewal of a registration via the
15 Internet, or a cab card issued for a vehicle registered under
16 the International Registration Plan shall, at all times while
17 the vehicle is being used or operated on the roads of this
18 state, be in the possession of the operator thereof or be
19 carried in the vehicle for which issued and shall be exhibited
20 upon demand of any authorized law enforcement officer or any
21 agent of the department, except for a vehicle registered under
22 s. 320.0657. ~~The provisions of~~ This section does ~~de~~ not apply
23 during the first 30 days after purchase of a replacement
24 vehicle. A violation of this section is a noncriminal traffic
25 infraction, punishable as a nonmoving violation as provided in
26 chapter 318.

27 (b)1. The act of presenting to a law enforcement officer
28 or agent of the department an electronic device displaying a
29 department-authorized electronic copy of the registration
30 certificate does not constitute consent for the officer or agent
31 to access any information on the device other than the displayed
32 registration certificate.

33 2. The person who presents the device to the officer or
34 agent assumes the liability for any resulting damage to the
35 device.

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38 320.0607 Replacement license plates, validation decal, or

40 (5) Upon the issuance of an original license plate, the
41 applicant shall pay a fee of \$28 to be deposited in the Highway
42 Safety Operating Trust Fund. Beginning October 1, 2019, this
43 subsection does not apply to a vehicle registered under the
44 International Registration Plan.

45 Section 19. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section
46 320.0657, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

47 320.0657 Permanent registration; fleet license plates.—
48 (2)

49 (b) The plates, which shall be of a distinctive color,
50 shall have the word "Fleet" appearing at the bottom and the word
51 "Florida" appearing at the top unless the license plate is a
52 specialty license plate as authorized in s. 320.08056. The
53 plates shall conform in all respects to the provisions of this
54 chapter, except as specified herein. For additional fees as set
55 forth in s. 320.08056, fleet companies may purchase specialty
56 license plates in lieu of the standard fleet license plates.
57 Fleet companies shall be responsible for all costs associated
58 with the specialty license plate, including all annual use fees,
59 processing fees, fees associated with switching license plate
60 types, and any other applicable fees.

61 Section 20. Subsection (12) of section 320.08, Florida
62 Statutes, is amended to read:

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63 320.08 License taxes.—Except as otherwise provided herein,
64 there are hereby levied and imposed annual license taxes for the
65 operation of motor vehicles, mopeds, motorized bicycles as
66 defined in s. 316.003(3), tri-vehicles as defined in s. 316.003,
67 and mobile homes as defined in s. 320.01, which shall be paid to
68 and collected by the department or its agent upon the
69 registration or renewal of registration of the following:

70 (12) DEALER AND MANUFACTURER LICENSE PLATES.—A franchised
71 motor vehicle dealer, independent motor vehicle dealer, marine
72 boat trailer dealer, or mobile home dealer and manufacturer
73 license plate: \$17 flat, of which \$4.50 shall be deposited into
74 the General Revenue Fund. For additional fees as set forth in s.
75 320.08056, dealers may purchase specialty license plates in lieu
76 of the standard graphic dealer license plates. Dealers shall be
77 responsible for all costs associated with the specialty license
78 plate, including all annual use fees, processing fees, fees
79 associated with switching license plate types, and any other
80 applicable fees.

81 Section 21. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is
82 amended to read:

83 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to
84 establish specialty license plates.—

85 (1) If a specialty license plate requested by an
86 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit
87 the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the

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88 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as
89 practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving
90 the specialty license plate becomes a law.

91 (2) (a) Within 120 days after ~~following~~ the specialty
92 license plate becomes ~~becoming~~ law, the department shall
93 establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to
94 allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The
95 processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge
96 and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use
97 fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the
98 voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time
99 of issuance of the license plates.

100 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license
101 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license
102 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of
103 3,000 ~~1,000~~ voucher sales, or in the case of an out-of-state
104 college or university license plate, 4,000 voucher sales, before

107 requirement has ~~requirements have~~ not been met, the specialty
108 plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue
109 development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale
110 vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser
111 of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee

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112 collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate
113 or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.

114 (3) (a) If the Legislature has approved 125 or more
115 specialty license plates, the department may not make any new
116 specialty license plates available for design, presale, or
117 issuance until a sufficient number of plates are discontinued
118 pursuant to s. 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being
119 issued is reduced to fewer than 125.

120 (b) New specialty license plates that have been approved
121 by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (a) shall be
122 issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08056(4) provided that
123 they have met the presale requirement. All other provisions of
124 this section must also be met before a plate is issued. If the
125 next awaiting specialty license plate has not met the presale
126 requirement, the department shall proceed in the order provided
127 in s. 320.08056(4) to identify the next qualified specialty
128 license plate that has met the presale requirement. The

146 to s. 320.0706, or a truck tractor, upon request and payment of
147 the appropriate license tax and fees.

148 (b) The department may authorize dealer and fleet
149 specialty license plates. With the permission of the sponsoring
150 specialty license plate organization, a dealer or fleet company
151 may purchase specialty license plates to be used on dealer and
152 fleet vehicles.

153 (c) Notwithstanding s. 320.08058, a dealer or fleet
154 specialty license plate must include the letters "DLR" or "FLT"
155 on the right side of the license plate. Dealer and fleet

- 183 exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate fee

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186 (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty
187 license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the
188 department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date
189 the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the
190 department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the
191 applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs
192 associated with discontinuance of the plate. The remaining funds
193 shall be distributed to the appropriate organization or
194 organizations pursuant to s. 320.08058.

195 (e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of
196 the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the
197 department shall deposit any undisbursed funds into the Highway
198 Safety Operating Trust Fund.

199 (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each
200 year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license
201 plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation. A warning
202 letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organizations of the 10
203 percent of specialty license plates with the lowest number of
204 valid, active registrations as of December 1 of each year.

206 and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from
207 those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit

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211 earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state
212 unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United

215 (uuu) ~~(ll), (kkk), and (yyy)~~ and s. 320.0891 or out-of-state

219 plates, the interest earned from those fees, or any fees

223 employee of a governmental agency that is responsible for the
224 sale and distribution of specialty license plates, or an elected
225 member or employee of the Legislature.

237 specialty plate registrations falls below 3,000, or in the case
238 of an out-of-state college or university license plate, 4,000,

240 letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization following
241 the first month in which the total number of valid specialty
242 plate registrations is below 3,000, or in the case of an out-of-
243 state college or university license plate, 4,000 ~~1,000 plates~~.
244 This paragraph does not apply to in-state collegiate license
245 plates established under s. 320.08058(3), license plates of

266 authorized by an act of the Legislature. Collegiate license
267 plates must bear the colors and design approved by the

282 (b) The proceeds of the Invest in Children license plate
283 annual use fee must be deposited into the Juvenile Crime
284 Prevention and Early Intervention Trust Fund within the

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285 Department of Juvenile Justice. Based on the recommendations of
286 the juvenile justice councils, the Department of Juvenile
287 Justice shall use the proceeds of the fee to fund programs and
288 services that are designed to prevent juvenile delinquency. ~~The~~

317 words "Live the Dream" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

318 (b) The proceeds of the annual use fee shall be
319 distributed to the Dream Foundation, Inc., ~~to The Dream~~
320 ~~Foundation, Inc., shall retain the first \$60,000 in proceeds~~
321 ~~from the annual use fees as reimbursement for administrative~~
322 ~~costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the approval~~

377 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the
378 Florida Lighthouse Association, Inc., which may use a maximum of

394 promotion, and marketing of the license plate directly

915 a time to an eligible fleet company if requested by such
916 company.

917 (d) A temporary tag issued pursuant to this subsection is
918 for exclusive use on a vehicle purchased for the company's fleet
919 and may not be used on any other vehicle.

920 (e) Each temporary tag may be used on only one vehicle,
921 and each vehicle may use only one temporary tag.

922 (f) Upon issuance of the vehicle's permanent license plate
923 and registration, the temporary tag becomes invalid and must be
924 removed from the vehicle and destroyed.

925 (g) Upon a finding by the department that a temporary tag
926 has been misused by a fleet company under this program, the
927 department may terminate the memorandum of understanding with
928 the company, invalidate all temporary tags issued to the company

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929 under the program, and require such company to return any unused
930 temporary tags.

931 (h) The issuance of a tag using this method must be
932 reported to the department within 2 business days, not including
933 weekends or state holidays, after the issuance of the tag. The
934 county tax collector shall keep a record of each temporary tag
935 issued. The record must include the date of issuance, tag number
936 issued, vehicle identification number, and vehicle description.

947 in lieu of a paper registration certificate. Such presentation
948 does not constitute consent for inspection of any information on
949 the device other than the displayed certificate of registration.
950 The person who presents the device for inspection assumes the
951 liability for any resulting damage to the device.

952 Section 32. By November 1, 2018, the annual use fees
953 withheld by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles

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954 from the sale of the Live the Dream specialty license plate
 955 shall be used first to satisfy all outstanding royalty payments
 956 due to The Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social
 957 Change, Inc., for the use of the image of Dr. Martin Luther
 958 King, Jr. All remaining funds shall be distributed to the
 959 subrecipients on a pro rata basis according to the percentages
 960 specified in s. 320.08058(47), Florida Statutes.
