27	<u>1.</u> Each side of the placard must <u>display</u> have the
28	international symbol of accessibility in a contrasting color in

31	a. The applicant's driver license number or state
32	identification card number along with a warning that the
33	applicant must have such identification at all times while using

35	b. For a parking permit issued on or after July 1, 2018, a
36	copy of the applicant's photograph that appears on his or her
37	driver license or identification card. The photograph must be
38	concealed by a movable flap or cover in order to protect the
39	identity of the applicant while the placard is displayed in the
40	vehicle.
41	3. In those cases where the severity of the disability
42	prevents a disabled person from physically visiting or being
43	transported to a driver license or tax collector office to
44	obtain a driver license or identification card, a certifying
45	physician may sign the exemption section of the department's
46	parking permit application to exempt the disabled person from
47	being issued a driver license or identification card for the
48	number <u>and photograph</u> to be displayed on the parking permit.
49	4. A validation sticker must also be issued with each
