A bill to be entitled

An act relating to human trafficking; amending s. 16.617, F.S.; requiring the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking to recommend specified identifiers or a screening tool by a specified date to assist emergency room health care personnel in recognizing victims of human trafficking; requiring the Department of Health to post the screening tool and certain information provided by the council on its website; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, many young children, teenagers, and adults who come in contact with Florida's health care system are not recognized as victims of human trafficking when, in fact, they are, and

WHEREAS, emergency room personnel are often the first health care professionals to interact with these victims, who are subjected to force, fraud, or coercion for purposes of sexual exploitation or forced labor, and

WHEREAS, few clinicians know how to identify victims of human trafficking amongst their patients; and

WHEREAS, potential indicators of human trafficking victimization may include visible bruises and scars, frequent injuries, or inconsistencies in a patient's description of how an injury occurred; and

WHEREAS, some hospitals developed their own human trafficking protocols and the variation in different protocols creates confusion; and

WHEREAS, access to standardized human trafficking protocols

would enable emergency room personnel to recognize victims of human trafficking and respond appropriately, and

WHEREAS, the National Human Trafficking Resource Center serves victims and survivors of human trafficking, is a leader in the global fight for human trafficking victims, and provides recommendations for human trafficking assessments in healthcare settings, NOW, THEREFORE,
