- (b) Have a total annual household income equal to or less than \$125,000.
- (c) Be accepted by and enroll in a Florida College System institution.
 - (d) Enroll in at least 30 credit hours per academic year.
- (3) Upon completion of his or her program of study or upon disenrollment from the Florida College System institution, the student must reside and work within the state for the same period of time he or she received funds from the program. If the student does not reside and work within the state for the specified period, the student must repay the total amount awarded, plus an annual interest rate equal to the federal student loan interest rate in effect when the student entered the program. This subsection does not apply to a student who enlists in the United States Armed Forces.
- (4) To remain eligible for the program, a student must maintain the equivalent of a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale while enrolled at the Florida College System institution.
- (5) The Sunshine Scholarship Program applies only to tuition. Each student is responsible for additional student fees, textbooks, and other college-related expenses.
- (6) Funding for the program shall be as provided in the General Appropriations Act.
