- 2. Is acting or has acted as the respondent's legal quardian.
- (b) "Petitioner" means a law enforcement officer or a law enforcement agency that petitions a court for a risk protection order under this section.

- (d) "Risk protection order" means a temporary ex parte order or a final order granted under this section.
- (2) PETITION FOR A RISK PROTECTION ORDER.—There is created an action known as a petition for a risk protection order.
- (a) A petition for a risk protection order may be filed by a law enforcement officer or law enforcement agency or a family or household member.
- (b) An action under this section must be filed in the county where the petitioner's law enforcement office is located, the county where the respondent resides, or the county where the family or household member resides.
- (c) Such petition for a risk protection order does not require either party to be represented by an attorney.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other law, attorney fees may not be awarded in any proceeding under this section.
 - (e) A petition must:
- 1. Allege that the respondent poses a significant danger of causing personal injury to himself or herself or others by having a firearm or any ammunition in his or her custody or control or by purchasing, possessing, or receiving a firearm or any ammunition, and must be accompanied by an affidavit made under oath stating the specific statements, actions, or facts
