- (b) A person who commits petit theft and who has previously been convicted of any theft commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- (c) A person who commits petit theft <u>in the first degree</u>, and who has previously been convicted two or more times <u>as an</u> adult of any theft, and if the third or subsequent petit theft

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offense occurred within 3 years of the expiration of his or her sentence for the most recent theft conviction, commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

- (7) The threshold amounts for offenses specified in this section shall be adjusted every 5 years in an amount equal to the total of the annual increases for that 5-year period in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, U.S. City Average, All Items.
