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A bill to be entitled

An act for the relief of Kareem Hawari by the Osceola County School Board; providing an appropriation to compensate him for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of employees of the Osceola County School Board; providing a limitation on the payment of attorney fees; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, on March 5, 2010, at approximately 6 p.m., then 13-year-old Kareem Hawari was participating in a wrestling match sponsored by Harmony Community School in the School District of Osceola County, and

WHEREAS, the wrestling match was supervised by coaches employed by the Osceola County School Board, which coaches had a duty to adequately supervise student athletes participating in school-sponsored athletic events by receiving proper training, by providing adequate instruction to student athletes, by reasonably selecting or matching student athletes to others in their same weight class for purposes of competition, and by monitoring athletic training and events, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari's coach did not receive any formal training and he failed to provide Kareem Hawari with adequate instruction before the match, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari was matched with a student athlete who was larger, stronger, and more experienced and who finished the 2010 and 2011 seasons as a county champion wrestler, and

WHEREAS, due to the negligent supervision of the coaches, Kareem Hawari hit his head on the ground during the match and suffered a brainstem hemorrhage, which resulted in a traumatic 17-00110B-19 201928

brain injury that affects his motor coordination and ability to speak, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari was hospitalized at Osceola Regional Medical Center on March 5, 2010, and was then transported by helicopter to Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children, where he was admitted from March 6, 2010, to May 4, 2010, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari underwent surgery on March 8, 2010, to relieve pressure on his brain, and had additional surgeries on March 8, 2010, and on March 24, 2010, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari was thereafter transferred to Brooks Rehabilitation, where he was a patient from May 4, 2010, to June 30, 2010, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari received physical therapy at Florida Hospital Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation on an outpatient basis from July 12, 2014, to October 1, 2014, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari seeks to recover damages for his injuries, which include a permanent injury to his body as a whole, past and future pain and suffering of both physical and mental natures, disability, physical impairment, disfigurement, mental anguish, inconvenience, loss of capacity for the enjoyment of life, expense of hospitalization, medical and nursing care and treatment, loss of ability to earn money, and loss of ability to lead and enjoy a normal life, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari incurred medical expenses in the amount of \$708,309.92 and is permanently and totally disabled and unable to engage in any employment, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari lived a full and vigorous life before his injury on March 5, 2010, had a zest for life, and was active in recreational, social, and sporting activities, and

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WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari requires continuous assistance with activities of daily living and ongoing treatment for his injuries, and

WHEREAS, Kareem Hawari filed a lawsuit against the Osceola County School Board and the Foundation for Osceola Education in the Osceola County Circuit Court, alleging that the coaches in their employ had negligently supervised the wrestling match, causing his injures, and

WHEREAS, after extensive discovery and pretrial preparation, the parties settled the case in the amount of \$3.6 million, of which \$100,000 has been paid in accordance with the statutory limits of liability in s. 768.28, Florida Statutes (2010), NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act are found and declared to be true.

Section 2. The Osceola County School Board is authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the school board not otherwise encumbered and to draw a warrant in the sum of \$3.5 million payable to Kareem Hawari as compensation for injuries and damages sustained.

Section 3. The amount paid by the Osceola County School
Board and the amount awarded under this act are intended to
provide the sole compensation for all present and future claims
arising out of the factual situation described in this act which
resulted in injuries and damages to Kareem Hawari. The total
amount paid for attorney fees relating to this claim may not
