A bill to be entitled An act relating to high school graduation requirements; amending s. 1003.4282, F.S.; revising the required credits for certain students for a standard high school diploma to include one-half credit of instruction in civics and seven and onehalf, rather than eight, credits in electives; requiring certain students to correctly answer a minimum number of questions on a test identical to the civics portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraphs (d) and (g) of subsection (3) of section 1003.4282, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 1003.4282 Requirements for a standard high school diploma.-

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- (3) STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA; COURSE AND ASSESSMENT REOUIREMENTS .-
- 21 (d) Three and one-half credits in social studies.—A student 22 must earn one credit in United States History; one credit in 23 World History; one-half credit in economics, which must include 24 financial literacy; and one-half credit in United States 25 Government; and, beginning with students entering grade 9 in the 26 2019-2020 school year, one-half credit in civics. The United 27
- States History EOC assessment constitutes 30 percent of the 28
  - student's final course grade. Beginning with students entering
  - grade 9 in the 2019-2020 school year, in order to obtain a high

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school diploma or its equivalent, a student must also correctly answer at least 60 of the 100 questions listed on a test that is identical to the civics portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

(g) Eight Credits in electives.—School districts must develop and offer coordinated electives so that a student may develop knowledge and skills in his or her area of interest, such as electives with a STEM or liberal arts focus. Such electives must include opportunities for students to earn college credit, including industry—certified career education programs or series of career—themed courses that result in industry certification or articulate into the award of college credit, or career education courses for which there is a statewide or local articulation agreement and which lead to college credit. A student entering grade 9 before the 2019-2020 school year must earn eight credits in electives. A student entering grade 9 in the 2019-2020 school year or thereafter must earn seven and one-half credits in electives.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
