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community that uses this option must demonstrate through staffing records that minimum staffing requirements for the facility were met. Licensed nurses and direct care staff certified nursing assistants who work in the facility may be used to provide services elsewhere on campus if the facility exceeds the minimum number of direct care hours required per resident per day and the total number of residents receiving direct care services from a licensed nurse or direct care staff a certified nursing assistant does not cause the facility to violate the staffing ratios required under s. 400.23(3)(a). Compliance with the minimum staffing ratios must be based on the total number of residents receiving direct care services, regardless of where they reside on campus. If the facility receives a conditional license, it may not share staff until the conditional license status ends. This paragraph does not restrict the agency's authority under federal or state law to require additional staff if a facility is cited for deficiencies in care which are caused by an insufficient number of direct care staff certified nursing assistants or licensed nurses. The agency may adopt rules for the documentation necessary to determine compliance with this provision.

(r) Maintain in the medical record for each resident a
daily chart of <u>direct care staff</u> certified nursing assistant
services provided to the resident. The <u>direct care staff person</u>
certified nursing assistant who is caring for the resident must

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51 complete this record by the end of his or her shift. This record 52 must indicate assistance with activities of daily living, 53 assistance with eating, and assistance with drinking, and must 54 record each offering of nutrition and hydration for those 55 residents whose plan of care or assessment indicates a risk for 56 malnutrition or dehydration.

57 (2) Facilities that have been awarded a Gold Seal under 58 the program established in s. 400.235 may develop a plan to 59 provide <u>direct care staff</u> certified nursing assistant training 60 as prescribed by federal regulations and state rules and may 61 apply to the agency for approval of their program.

66 (3)(a)1. The agency shall adopt rules providing minimum
67 staffing requirements for nursing home facilities. These
68 requirements must include, for each facility:

a. A minimum weekly average of certified nursing assistant
and licensed nursing staffing combined of <u>9</u> 3.6 hours of direct
care staff per resident per day as determined by the facility
assessment of staffing needs in accordance with the federal
requirements of participation for nursing home facilities. As
used in this sub-subparagraph, a week is defined as Sunday
through Saturday. For purposes of this paragraph, the term

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76	"direct care staff" includes individuals who, through
77	interpersonal contact with residents or resident care
78	management, provide care and services to allow residents to
79	attain or maintain the highest practicable physical, mental, and
80	psychosocial well-being. Direct care staff does not include
81	individuals whose primary duty is maintaining the physical
82	environment of the nursing home facility, and excludes any staff
83	time spent performing nursing administration, staff development,
84	staff coordination, and the administrative portion of the

98	2.3. Each nursing home facility must document compliance
99	with staffing standards as required under this paragraph and
100	post daily the names of staff on duty for the benefit of

The agency shall recognize the use of licensed nurses 103 for compliance with minimum staffing requirements for direct 104 care staff certified nursing assistants if the nursing home 105 facility otherwise meets the minimum staffing requirements for 106 licensed nurses and the licensed nurses are performing the 107 duties of direct care staff a certified nursing assistant. 108 Unless otherwise approved by the agency, licensed nurses counted 109 toward the minimum staffing requirements for direct care staff 110 certified nursing assistants must exclusively perform the duties 111 of direct care staff a certified nursing assistant for the 112 entire shift and not also be counted toward the minimum staffing 113 requirements for licensed nurses. If the agency approved a 114 facility's request to use a licensed nurse to perform both 115 licensed nursing and direct care staff certified nursing assistant duties, the facility must allocate the amount of staff 116 117 time specifically spent on direct care staff certified nursing 118 assistant duties for the purpose of documenting compliance with 119 minimum staffing requirements for direct care certified and licensed nursing staff. The hours of a licensed nurse with dual 120 121 job responsibilities may not be counted twice.

122 (b) Nonnursing staff providing cating assistance to 123 residents shall not count toward compliance with minimum 124 staffing standards.

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(b) (c) Licensed practical nurses licensed under chapter

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464 who are providing nursing services in nursing home facilities under this part may supervise the activities of other licensed practical nurses, <u>direct care staff</u> certified nursing assistants, and other unlicensed personnel providing services in such facilities in accordance with rules adopted by the Board of Nursing.
