75 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

77 Section 1. Effective July 1, 2021, paragraphs (b) and (c)
78 of subsection (1) of section 320.06, Florida Statutes, are
79 amended to read:

80 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and
81 validation stickers generally.—

82 (1)

83 (b)1. Registration license plates bearing a graphic symbol
84 and the alphanumeric system of identification shall be issued
85 for a 10-year period. At the end of the 10-year period, upon
86 renewal, the plate shall be replaced. The department shall
87 extend the scheduled license plate replacement date from a 6-
88 year period to a 10-year period. The fee for such replacement is
89 \$28, \$2.80 of which shall be paid each year before the plate is
90 replaced, to be credited toward the next \$28 replacement fee.
91 The fees shall be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating
92 Trust Fund. A credit or refund may not be given for any prior
93 years' payments of the prorated replacement fee if the plate is
94 replaced or surrendered before the end of the 10-year period,
95 except that a credit may be given if a registrant is required by
96 the department to replace a license plate under s.
97 320.08056(8)(a). With each license plate, a validation sticker
98 shall be issued showing the owner's birth month, license plate
99 number, and the year of expiration or the appropriate renewal
100 period if the owner is not a natural person. The validation

101 sticker shall be placed on the upper right corner of the license
102 plate. The license plate and validation sticker shall be issued
103 based on the applicant's appropriate renewal period. The
104 registration period is 12 months, the extended registration
105 period is 24 months, and all expirations occur based on the
106 applicant's appropriate registration period. Vehicles taxed
107 pursuant to s. 320.08(6) (a) may elect a permanent registration
108 period, provided payment of the appropriate license taxes and
109 fees occurs annually. A vehicle that has an apportioned
110 registration shall be issued an annual license plate and a cab
111 card that denote the declared gross vehicle weight for each
112 apportioned jurisdiction in which the vehicle is authorized to
113 operate.

114 2. In order to retain the efficient administration of the
115 taxes and fees imposed by this chapter, the 80-cent fee increase
116 in the replacement fee imposed by chapter 2009-71, Laws of
117 Florida, is negated as provided in s. 320.0804.

118 (c) Registration license plates equipped with validation
119 stickers subject to the registration period are valid for not
120 more than 12 months and expire at midnight on the last day of
121 the registration period. A registration license plate equipped
122 with a validation sticker subject to the extended registration
123 period is valid for not more than 24 months and expires at
124 midnight on the last day of the extended registration period. A
125 registration license plate equipped with a validation sticker

126 | subject to a permanent registration period is permanently valid
127 | but shall become void if appropriate license taxes and fees are
128 | not paid annually. For each registration period after the one in
129 | which the metal registration license plate is issued, and until
130 | the license plate is required to be replaced, a validation
131 | sticker showing the month and year of expiration shall be issued
132 | upon payment of the proper license tax amount and fees and is
133 | valid for not more than 12 months. For each extended
134 | registration period occurring after the one in which the metal
135 | registration license plate is issued and until the license plate
136 | is required to be replaced, a validation sticker showing the
137 | year of expiration shall be issued upon payment of the proper
138 | license tax amount and fees and is valid for not more than 24
139 | months. For each permanent registration period occurring after
140 | the one in which the metal registration license plate is issued
141 | and until the license plate is required to be replaced, a
142 | validation sticker showing a permanent registration period shall
143 | be issued upon payment of the proper license tax amount and fees
144 | and is permanently valid but shall become void if the proper
145 | license taxes and fees are not paid annually. When license
146 | plates equipped with validation stickers are issued in any month
147 | other than the owner's birth month or the designated
148 | registration period for any other motor vehicle, the effective
149 | date shall reflect the birth month or month and the year of
150 | renewal. However, when a license plate or validation sticker is

151 issued for a period of less than 12 months, the applicant shall
152 pay the appropriate amount of license tax and the applicable fee
153 under s. 320.14 in addition to all other fees. Validation
154 stickers issued for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(6)(a), for
155 any company that owns 250 vehicles or more, or for semitrailers
156 taxed under the provisions of s. 320.08(5)(a), for any company
157 that owns 50 vehicles or more, may be placed on any vehicle in
158 the fleet so long as the vehicle receiving the validation
159 sticker has the same owner's name and address as the vehicle to
160 which the validation sticker was originally assigned.

161 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) and subsection
162 (5) of section 320.06, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

163 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and
164 validation stickers generally.—

165 (3)(a) Registration license plates must be made of metal
166 specially treated with a retroreflection material, as specified
167 by the department. The registration license plate is designed to
168 increase nighttime visibility and legibility and must be at
169 least 6 inches wide and not less than 12 inches in length,
170 unless a plate with reduced dimensions is deemed necessary by
171 the department to accommodate motorcycles, mopeds, or similar
172 smaller vehicles. Validation stickers must also be treated with
173 a retroreflection material, must be of such size as specified by
174 the department, and must adhere to the license plate. The
175 registration license plate must be imprinted with a combination

176 of bold letters and numerals or numerals, not to exceed seven
177 digits, to identify the registration license plate number. The
178 license plate must be imprinted with the word "Florida" at the
179 top and the name of the county in which it is sold, the state
180 motto, or the words "Sunshine State" at the bottom. Apportioned
181 license plates must have the word "Apportioned" at the bottom
182 and license plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.
183 320.08(3)(d), (4)(m) or (n), (5)(b) or (c), or (14) must have
184 the word "Restricted" at the bottom. License plates issued for
185 vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with the
186 word "Florida" at the top and the word "Dealer" at the bottom
187 unless the license plate is a specialty license plate as
188 authorized in s. 320.08056. Manufacturer license plates issued
189 for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with
190 the word "Florida" at the top and the word "Manufacturer" at the
191 bottom. License plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.
192 320.08(5)(d) or (e) must be imprinted with the word "Wrecker" at
193 the bottom. Any county may, upon majority vote of the county
194 commission, elect to have the county name removed from the
195 license plates sold in that county. The state motto or the words
196 "Sunshine State" shall be printed in lieu thereof. A license
197 plate issued for a vehicle taxed under s. 320.08(6) may not be
198 assigned a registration license number, or be issued with any
199 other distinctive character or designation, that distinguishes
200 the motor vehicle as a for-hire motor vehicle.

201 (5) By July 1, 2021, the department ~~shall~~ ~~may~~ conduct a
202 pilot program to evaluate the designs, concepts, and
203 technologies for digital ~~alternative~~ license plates. ~~For~~
204 ~~purposes of the pilot program,~~ the department ~~shall investigate~~
205 ~~the feasibility and use of alternative license plate~~
206 ~~technologies and the long-term cost impact to the consumer.~~ The
207 pilot program shall be limited to installation and use of
208 digital license plates ~~that are used~~ on government-owned motor
209 vehicles as described in s. 320.0655. Such digital license
210 plates are exempt from the requirements in paragraph (3)(a).

211 Section 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section
212 320.0657, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

213 320.0657 Permanent registration; fleet license plates.—

214 (2)

215 (b) The plates, which shall be of a distinctive color,
216 shall have the word "Fleet" appearing at the bottom and the word
217 "Florida" appearing at the top unless the license plate is a
218 specialty license plate as authorized in s. 320.08056. The
219 plates shall conform in all respects to the provisions of this
220 chapter, except as specified herein. For additional fees as set
221 forth in s. 320.08056, fleet companies may purchase specialty
222 license plates in lieu of the standard fleet license plates.
223 Fleet companies shall be responsible for all costs associated
224 with the specialty license plate, including all annual use fees,
225 processing fees, fees associated with switching license plate

226 types, and any other applicable fees.

227 Section 4. Subsection (12) of section 320.08, Florida
228 Statutes, is amended to read:

229 320.08 License taxes.—Except as otherwise provided herein,
230 there are hereby levied and imposed annual license taxes for the
231 operation of motor vehicles, mopeds, motorized bicycles as
232 defined in s. 316.003(4), tri-vehicles as defined in s. 316.003,
233 and mobile homes as defined in s. 320.01, which shall be paid to
234 and collected by the department or its agent upon the
235 registration or renewal of registration of the following:

236 (12) DEALER AND MANUFACTURER LICENSE PLATES.—A franchised
237 motor vehicle dealer, independent motor vehicle dealer, marine
238 boat trailer dealer, or mobile home dealer and manufacturer
239 license plate: \$17 flat. For additional fees as set forth in s.
240 320.08056, dealers may purchase specialty license plates in lieu
241 of the standard dealer license plates. Dealers shall be
242 responsible for all costs associated with the specialty license
243 plate, including all annual use fees, processing fees, fees
244 associated with switching license plate types, and any other
245 applicable fees.

246 Section 5. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended
247 to read:

248 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to
249 ~~establish~~ specialty license plates.—

250 (1) If a specialty license plate requested by an

251 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit
 252 the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the
 253 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as
 254 practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving
 255 the specialty license plate becomes a law.

256 (2) (a) Within 120 days after ~~following~~ the specialty
 257 license plate becomes ~~becoming~~ law, the department shall
 258 establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to
 259 allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The
 260 processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge
 261 and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use
 262 fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the
 263 voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time
 264 of issuance of the license plates.

265 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license
 266 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license
 267 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of
 268 3,000 ~~1,000~~ voucher sales, or in the case of an out-of-state
 269 college or university license plate, 4,000 voucher sales, before
 270 manufacture of the license plate may commence. If, at the
 271 conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the minimum sales
 272 requirement has ~~requirements have~~ not been met, the specialty
 273 plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue
 274 development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale
 275 vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser

276 of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee
 277 collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate
 278 or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.

279 (3) (a) New specialty license plates that have been
 280 approved by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (b)
 281 shall be issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08058
 282 provided that they have met the presale requirement. All other
 283 provisions of this section must also be met before a specialty
 284 license plate may be issued. If the next awaiting specialty
 285 license plate has not met the presale requirement, the
 286 department shall proceed in the order provided in s. 320.08058
 287 to identify the next qualified specialty license plate that has
 288 met the presale requirement. The department shall cycle through
 289 the list in statutory order.

290 (b) If the Legislature has approved 150 or more specialty
 291 license plates, the department may not make any new specialty
 292 license plates available for design or issuance until a
 293 sufficient number of plates are discontinued pursuant to s.
 294 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being issued does
 295 not exceed 150. Notwithstanding s. 320.08056(8) (a), the 150-
 296 license-plate limit includes license plates above the minimum
 297 sales threshold and those exempt from that threshold.

298 Section 6. Subsection (12) of section 320.08056, Florida
 299 Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (15), subsections (2) and
 300 (4), paragraph (a) of subsection (10), and subsection (11) are

301 amended, paragraphs (c) through (f) are added to subsection (8),
 302 and new subsections (12), (13), and (14) are added to that
 303 section, to read:

304 320.08056 Specialty license plates.—

305 (2) (a) The department shall issue a specialty license
 306 plate to the owner or lessee of any motor vehicle, except a
 307 vehicle registered under the International Registration Plan, a
 308 commercial truck required to display two license plates pursuant
 309 to s. 320.0706, or a truck tractor, upon request and payment of
 310 the appropriate license tax and fees.

311 (b) The department may authorize dealer and fleet
 312 specialty license plates. With the permission of the sponsoring
 313 specialty license plate organization, a dealer or fleet company
 314 may purchase specialty license plates to be used on dealer and
 315 fleet vehicles.

316 (c) Notwithstanding s. 320.08058, a dealer or fleet
 317 specialty license plate must include the letters "DLR" or "FLT"
 318 on the right side of the license plate. Dealer and fleet
 319 specialty license plates must be ordered directly from the
 320 department.

417 (c) A vehicle owner or lessee issued a specialty license
 418 plate that has been discontinued by the department may keep the
 419 discontinued specialty license plate for the remainder of the
 420 10-year license plate replacement period and must pay all other
 421 applicable registration fees. However, such owner or lessee is
 422 exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate annual
 423 use fee under paragraph (3) (d) or subsection (4) for the
 424 remainder of the 10-year license plate replacement period.

425 (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty

426 license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the
427 department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date
428 the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the
429 department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the
430 applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs
431 associated with discontinuance of the plate. All remaining
432 proceeds shall be distributed to the appropriate organization or
433 organizations pursuant to s. 320.08058.

434 (e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of
435 the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the
436 department shall deposit any undisbursed proceeds into the
437 Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.

438 (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each
439 year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license
440 plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation, including
441 license plates exempt from a statutory sales requirement. The
442 department shall mail a warning letter to the sponsoring
443 organizations of the 10 percent of specialty license plates with
444 the lowest number of valid, active registrations as of December
445 1 of each year.

446 (10) (a) A specialty license plate annual use fee collected
447 and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from
448 those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit
449 activities nor for general or administrative expenses, except as
450 authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the audit or

451 report required by s. 320.08062(1). The fees and any interest
452 earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state
453 unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United
454 States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty license

885 bottom of the plate.

886 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
887 be distributed as follows:

888 1. Seventy-five percent of the proceeds shall be
889 distributed to Beat Nb, Inc., which may use up to 10 percent of
890 its proceeds for administrative costs directly associated with
891 the operation of the corporation and for marketing and promoting
892 the plate. All remaining proceeds shall be used by the
893 corporation to fund pediatric cancer treatment and research.

894 2. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds shall be
895 distributed to the Ryan Callahan Foundation, Inc., a nonprofit
896 corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Its
897 proceeds shall be used by the corporation to fund pediatric
898 cancer treatment and research.

899 (83) WALT DISNEY WORLD LICENSE PLATES.—

900 (a) The department shall develop a Walt Disney World

901 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
902 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
903 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
904 plate, and the words "Walt Disney World" must appear at the
905 bottom of the plate.

906 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
907 be distributed to the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Central and
908 Northern Florida, Inc., a nonprofit organization under s.
909 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Up to 10 percent of the
910 proceeds from the sale of such plates may be used for
911 administrative and marketing costs. All remaining proceeds from
912 the annual use fees shall be used by the Make-a-Wish Foundation
913 of Central and Northern Florida, Inc., for activities and
914 programs for families with critically ill children.

915 (84) FLORIDA 4-H LICENSE PLATES.—

916 (a) The department shall develop a Florida 4-H license
917 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
918 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
919 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the term
920 "4-H" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

921 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
922 be distributed to Florida 4-H and used for the following
923 purposes:

924 1. Up to 10 percent of the fees may be used for
925 administrative and marketing costs of the plate.

926 2. Twenty percent must be used to support leadership
 927 development in this state, including leadership development
 928 programs operated by 4-H University, state agencies, and the
 929 Legislature.

930 3. Twenty percent must be used to support competitive
 931 teams in this state.

932 4. The remainder must be used to support Florida 4-H camps
 933 under the Florida 4-H program as designated by the University of
 934 Florida.

935 (85) DONATE LIFE FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.—

936 (a) The department shall develop a Donate Life Florida
 937 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
 938 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
 939 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
 940 plate, and the words "Donors Save Lives" must appear at the
 941 bottom of the plate.

942 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
 943 be distributed to Donate Life Florida, which may use up to 10
 944 percent of the proceeds for marketing and administrative costs.
 945 All remaining proceeds from the annual use fees shall be used by
 946 Donate Life Florida to educate Florida residents on the
 947 importance of organ, tissue, and eye donation and for the
 948 continued maintenance of the Joshua Abbott Organ and Tissue
 949 Donor Registry.

950 (86) FLORIDA STATE BEEKEEPERS ASSOCIATION LICENSE PLATES.—

951 (a) The department shall develop a Florida State
 952 Beekeepers Association license plate as provided in this section
 953 and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design
 954 approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at
 955 the top of the plate, and the words "Save the Bees" must appear
 956 at the bottom of the plate.

957 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the
 958 Florida State Beekeepers Association, a Florida nonprofit
 959 corporation. The Florida State Beekeepers Association may use up
 960 to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative, promotional,
 961 and marketing costs of the license plate.

962 (c) All remaining proceeds shall be distributed to the
 963 Florida State Beekeepers Association and shall be used to raise
 964 awareness of the importance of beekeeping to Florida agriculture
 965 by funding honeybee research, education, outreach, and
 966 husbandry. The Florida State Beekeepers Association board of
 967 managers must approve and is accountable for all such
 968 expenditures.

969 (87) ROTARY LICENSE PLATES.—

970 (a) The department shall develop a Rotary license plate as
 971 provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear
 972 the colors and design approved by the department. The word
 973 "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word
 974 "Rotary" must appear on the bottom of the plate. The license
 975 plate must bear the Rotary International wheel emblem.

976 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the
977 Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, Inc., to be used as follows:

978 1. Up to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for
979 administrative costs and for marketing of the plate.

980 2. Ten percent of the proceeds shall be distributed to
981 Rotary's Camp Florida for direct support to all programs and
982 services provided to children with special needs who attend the
983 camp.

984 3. All remaining proceeds shall be distributed,
985 proportionally based on sales, to each Rotary district in the
986 state in support of Rotary youth programs in Florida.

987 (88) HIGHWAYMEN LICENSE PLATES.—

988 (a) The department shall develop a Highwaymen license
989 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
990 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
991 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word
992 "Highwaymen" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

993 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the City
994 of Fort Pierce, subject to a city resolution designating the
995 city as the fiscal agent of the license plate. The city may use
996 up to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative costs and
997 marketing of the plate and shall use the remainder of the
998 proceeds as follows:

999 1. Before completion of construction of the Highwaymen
1000 Museum and African-American Cultural Center, the city shall

1001 distribute at least 15 percent of the proceeds to the St. Lucie
1002 Education Foundation, Inc., to fund art education and art
1003 projects in public schools within St. Lucie County. All
1004 remaining proceeds shall be used by the city to fund the
1005 construction of the Highwaymen Museum and African-American
1006 Cultural Center.

1007 2. Upon completion of construction of the Highwaymen
1008 Museum and African-American Cultural Center, the city shall
1009 distribute at least 10 percent of the proceeds to the St. Lucie
1010 Education Foundation, Inc., to fund art education and art
1011 projects in public schools within St. Lucie County. All
1012 remaining proceeds shall be used by the city to fund the day-to-
1013 day operations of the Highwaymen Museum and African-American
1014 Cultural Center.

1015 (89) DAN MARINO CAMPUS LICENSE PLATES.—

1016 (a) The department shall develop a Dan Marino Campus
1017 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
1018 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
1019 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
1020 plate, and the words "Marino Campus" must appear at the bottom
1021 of the plate.

1022 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1023 be distributed to the Dan Marino Foundation, a Florida nonprofit
1024 corporation, which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for
1025 administrative costs and marketing of the plate. All remaining

1026 proceeds shall be used by the Dan Marino Foundation to assist
1027 Floridians with developmental disabilities in becoming employed,
1028 independent, and productive and to promote and fund education
1029 scholarships and awareness of these services.

1030 (90) ORLANDO CITY SOCCER CLUB LICENSE PLATES.—

1031 (a) The department shall develop an Orlando City Soccer
1032 Club license plate as provided in paragraph (9) (a).

1033 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1034 be distributed and used as provided in paragraph (9) (b).

1035 (91) DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION LICENSE PLATES.—

1036 (a) The department shall develop a Daughters of the
1037 American Revolution license plate as provided in this section
1038 and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design
1039 approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at
1040 the top of the plate, and the words "Daughters of the American
1041 Revolution" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

1042 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1043 be distributed to the Daughters of the American Revolution, a
1044 nonprofit organization under s. 501(c) (3) of the Internal
1045 Revenue Code. Up to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for
1046 the promotion and marketing of the plate. The remainder of the
1047 proceeds shall be used within this state by the Daughters of the
1048 American Revolution, a nonpolitical volunteer women's service
1049 organization, to promote patriotism, preserve American history,
1050 and secure America's future through educational programs for

1051 local public and private K-12 students and scholarships and
 1052 other educational funding for underprivileged children.

1053 (92) GADSDEN FLAG LICENSE PLATES.—

1054 (a) The department shall develop a Gadsden Flag license
 1055 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The design
 1056 of the license plate must replicate the color, layout, and
 1057 design of the Gadsden Flag. The word "Florida" must appear at
 1058 the top of the plate, and the words "Don't Tread on Me" must
 1059 appear at the bottom of the plate.

1060 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the
 1061 Florida Veterans Foundation, a direct-support organization of
 1062 the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and must be used to benefit
 1063 veterans. Up to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for
 1064 continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.

1065 (93) AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL LICENSE PLATES.—

1066 (a) The department shall develop an America the Beautiful
 1067 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
 1068 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
 1069 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
 1070 plate, and the words "America the Beautiful" must appear at the
 1071 bottom of the plate.

1072 (b) The annual use fees from the plate must be distributed
 1073 to the America the Beautiful Fund as follows: 10 percent to
 1074 offset administrative costs, marketing, and promotion of the
 1075 plate and 90 percent for projects and programs teaching

1076 character, leadership, and service to Florida youth; the
 1077 provision of supportive services and assistance to members of
 1078 the military community; outdoor education advancing the ideal of
 1079 self-sufficiency; wildlife conservation, including imperiled and
 1080 managed species; the maintenance of historic or culturally
 1081 important sites, buildings, structures, or objects; and the
 1082 development and modification of playgrounds, recreational areas,
 1083 or other outdoor amenities, including disability access.

1084 (94) EXPLORE OFF ROAD FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.—

1085 (a) The department shall develop an Explore Off Road
 1086 Florida license plate as provided in this section and s.
 1087 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by
 1088 the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
 1089 plate, and the words "Explore Off Road" must appear at the
 1090 bottom of the plate.

1091 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
 1092 be distributed to the Florida Off Road Foundation, Inc., a
 1093 nonprofit corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
 1094 Code. Up to 10 percent of the funds may be used for marketing of
 1095 the plate, costs directly associated with creation of the plate,
 1096 and administrative costs related to distribution of proceeds,
 1097 including annual audit services and compliance affidavit costs.
 1098 The remainder of the funds shall be used by the Florida Off Road
 1099 Foundation, Inc., to fund qualified nonprofit organizations that
 1100 protect and preserve Florida's natural off-road habitat; educate

1101 Floridians about responsible use of the off-road environment;
1102 support civilian volunteer programs to promote the use of off-
1103 road vehicles to assist law enforcement in situations such as
1104 search and rescue; support organized cleanups, trail
1105 maintenance, and restoration; or preserve Florida's off-road
1106 culture.

1107 (95) AMERICAN EAGLE LICENSE PLATES.—

1108 (a) The department shall develop an American Eagle license
1109 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
1110 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
1111 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
1112 words "In God We Trust" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

1113 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1114 be distributed to the American Eagle Foundation for deposit in
1115 the foundation's national endowment fund. Up to 10 percent of
1116 the funds received may be used for administrative costs and
1117 marketing of the plate. The American Eagle Foundation shall use
1118 the remainder of the proceeds to fund public education programs,
1119 rescue and care programs, and other conservation efforts in
1120 Florida that benefit bald eagles.

1121 (96) GUARDIAN AD LITEM LICENSE PLATES.—

1122 (a) The department shall develop a Guardian Ad Litem
1123 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
1124 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
1125 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the

1126 plate, and the words "Heartfelt Child Advocacy" must appear at
1127 the bottom of the plate.

1128 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1129 be distributed to the Florida Guardian Ad Litem Foundation,
1130 Inc., a direct-support organization and a nonprofit corporation
1131 under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Up to 10
1132 percent of the proceeds may be used for administrative costs and
1133 the marketing of the plate. The remainder of the proceeds must
1134 be used in this state to support the mission and efforts of the
1135 statewide Guardian Ad Litem Program to represent abused,
1136 abandoned, and neglected children and advocate for their best
1137 interests; recruit and retain volunteer child advocates; and
1138 meet the unique needs of the dependent children the program
1139 serves.

1140 (97) JUMBO SHRIMP LICENSE PLATES.—

1141 (a) The department shall develop a Jumbo Shrimp license
1142 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
1143 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
1144 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
1145 words "Jumbo Shrimp" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

1146 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1147 be distributed to St. Johns Riverkeeper, Inc., a nonprofit
1148 organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Up
1149 to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for the promotion and
1150 marketing of the plate. The remainder of the proceeds shall be

1151 used by St. Johns Riverkeeper, Inc., for programs and activities
1152 related to fulfilling its mission to protect and restore the
1153 health of the St. Johns River.

1154 (98) THANK A LINEMAN LICENSE PLATES.—

1155 (a) The department shall develop a Thank a Lineman license
1156 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
1157 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
1158 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
1159 words "Thank a Lineman" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

1160 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1161 be distributed to the Lake-Sumter State College Foundation,
1162 Inc., a nonprofit Florida corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the
1163 Internal Revenue Code, to fund scholarships for students
1164 enrolled in the Electrical Distribution Technology Program at
1165 Lake-Sumter State College. Up to 10 percent of the funds
1166 received by the Lake-Sumter State College Foundation, Inc., may
1167 be used for marketing of the plate and costs directly associated
1168 with the administration of the foundation.

1169 (99) BEST BUDDIES LICENSE PLATES.—

1170 (a) The department shall develop a Best Buddies license
1171 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
1172 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
1173 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the term
1174 "BestBuddies.org" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

1175 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall

1176 be distributed to Best Buddies International, Inc., a nonprofit
1177 corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code,
1178 which may use up to 10 percent of the fees for administrative
1179 costs and marketing of the plate. The balance of the fees shall
1180 be used by Best Buddies International, Inc., to create
1181 opportunities for one-to-one friendships, integrated employment,
1182 leadership development, and inclusive living for individuals
1183 with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

1184 (100) UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA LICENSE PLATES.—

1185 (a) The department shall develop a University of Georgia
1186 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
1187 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
1188 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
1189 plate, and the words "The University of Georgia" must appear at
1190 the bottom of the plate.

1191 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1192 be distributed to the Georgia Bulldog Club of Jacksonville,
1193 which must use the proceeds for the purpose of awarding
1194 scholarships to Florida residents attending the University of
1195 Georgia. Students receiving these scholarships must be eligible
1196 for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program pursuant to
1197 s. 1009.531 and shall use the scholarship funds for tuition and
1198 other expenses related to attending the University of Georgia.

1199 (101) ETHICAL ECOTOURISM LICENSE PLATES.—

1200 (a) The department shall develop an Ethical Ecotourism

1201 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
 1202 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and words
 1203 that are approved by the department must appear at the bottom of
 1204 the plate.

1205 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate must be
 1206 distributed equally between the Florida Society for Ethical
 1207 Ecotourism and Paddle Florida, Inc., each of which may use up to
 1208 10 percent of such proceeds for administrative costs and the
 1209 marketing of the plate. The remaining proceeds must be used by
 1210 the Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism to provide
 1211 environmental education and awareness that encourage behaviors
 1212 that contribute to the sustainability of Florida's natural
 1213 ecosystems and resources, and by Paddle Florida, Inc., to raise
 1214 awareness about water conservation, wildlife preservation,
 1215 restoration of springs, and protection of waterways in this
 1216 state.

1217 (102) FLORIDA BAY FOREVER LICENSE PLATES.—

 1221 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
 1222 plate, and the words "Florida Bay Forever" must appear at the
 1223 bottom of the plate.

1224 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
 1225 be distributed to the Florida National Park Association, Inc.,

1226 which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for
1227 administrative costs and marketing of the plate. All remaining
1228 proceeds shall be used to supplement the Everglades National
1229 Park's budgets and to support educational, interpretive,
1230 historical, and scientific research relating to the Everglades
1231 National Park.

1232 (103) BONEFISH AND TARPON TRUST LICENSE PLATES.—

1233 (a) The department shall develop a Bonefish and Tarpon
1234 Trust license plate as provided in this section and s.
1235 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by
1236 the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
1237 plate, and the words "Bonefish and Tarpon Trust" must appear at
1238 the bottom of the plate.

1239 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1240 be distributed to the Bonefish and Tarpon Trust, which may use
1241 up to 10 percent of the proceeds to promote and market the
1242 license plate. All remaining proceeds shall be used to conserve
1243 and enhance Florida bonefish and tarpon fisheries and their
1244 respective environments through stewardship, research,
1245 education, and advocacy.

1246 (104) COASTAL CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION LICENSE PLATES.—

1247 (a) The department shall develop a Coastal Conservation
1248 Association license plate as provided in this section and s.
1249 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by
1250 the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the

1251 plate, and the words "Conserve Florida's Fisheries" must appear
1252 at the bottom of the plate.

1253 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1254 be distributed to Coastal Conservation Association Florida, a
1255 nonprofit corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
1256 Code, to be used as follows:

1257 1. Up to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for
1258 administrative costs and to promote and market the plate.

1259 2. The remainder of the proceeds shall be used to support
1260 the mission and efforts of Coastal Conservation Association
1261 Florida for habitat enhancement and restoration, saltwater
1262 fisheries conservation, and education; to advise the public on
1263 the conservation of marine resources; and to promote and enhance
1264 the present and future availability of those coastal resources
1265 for the benefit and enjoyment of the general public.

1266 (105) JOHNSON AND WALES UNIVERSITY LICENSE PLATES.—

1267 (a) The department shall develop a Johnson and Wales
1268 University license plate as provided in this section and s.
1269 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by
1270 the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
1271 plate, the words "Johnson and Wales University" must appear at
1272 the bottom of the plate, and the official Johnson and Wales
1273 University logo must appear on the left side of plate.

1274 (b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed
1275 to Johnson and Wales University-North Miami, which may use up to

1276 10 percent of the proceeds to promote and market the plate. The
1277 remainder of the proceeds shall be used by Johnson and Wales
1278 University-North Miami, a Johnson and Wales University
1279 organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to
1280 fund its charitable activities, including, but not limited to,
1281 student need-based scholarships.

1282 (106) FLORIDA STANDS WITH ISRAEL LICENSE PLATES.—

1283 (a) The department shall develop a Florida Stands with
1284 Israel license plate as provided in this section and s.
1285 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by
1286 the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
1287 plate, and the words "Florida Stands with Israel" must appear at
1288 the bottom of the plate.

1289 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate must be
1290 distributed to the Hatzalah of Miami-Dade, Inc., to be used as
1291 follows:

1292 1. Ten percent must be used solely for the promotion and
1293 marketing of the plate.

1294 2. Ninety percent must be used by Hatzalah of Miami-Dade,
1295 Inc., to assist in training and deploying first responders to
1296 expedite emergency response.

1297 (107) GIVE KIDS THE WORLD LICENSE PLATES.—

1298 (a) The department shall develop a Give Kids The World
1299 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
1300 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the

1301 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
1302 plate, and the words "Give Kids The World" must appear at the
1303 bottom of the plate.

1304 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1305 be distributed to Give Kids The World, Inc., a nonprofit
1306 organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Up
1307 to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for the promotion and
1308 marketing of the plate. The remainder of the proceeds shall be
1309 used by Give Kids The World, Inc., to support their mission of
1310 providing week-long, cost-free vacations to children with
1311 critical illnesses and their families.

1312 (108) MARINE CORPS LEAGUE LICENSE PLATES.—

1313 (a) The department shall develop a Marine Corps League
1314 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
1315 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
1316 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top center of
1317 the plate, and the words "Marine Corps League" must appear at
1318 the bottom of the plate.

1319 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
1320 be distributed to the Marine Corps League, Inc., Department of
1321 Florida as follows:

1322 1. Up to 10 percent of the proceeds may be used for
1323 administrative costs and to promote and market the plate.

1324 2. At least 15 percent shall be distributed to the
1325 Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund within the Department of

1326 Veterans' Affairs to be used to support program operations that
 1327 benefit veterans or the operation, maintenance, or construction
 1328 of domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans, subject to the
 1329 requirements of chapter 216.

1330 3. At least 40 percent shall be distributed to the Marine
 1331 Corps League John Piazza Memorial Scholarship Fund to fund
 1332 scholarships and assist Marine Corps Junior ROTC and Young
 1333 Marine programs in this state.

1334 4. At least 20 percent shall support the Marine Corps
 1335 League efforts in disaster relief, aiding and rendering
 1336 assistance to all Marines and former Marines and to their widows
 1337 and orphans in this state.

1338 5. At least 15 percent shall be distributed to the Injured
 1339 Warriors Fund of Florida to assist those warriors injured in
 1340 combat residing in this state.

1341 (109) K9S UNITED LICENSE PLATES.—

1342 (a) The department shall develop a K9s United license
 1343 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
