Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Veterinary Workforce Innovation Act."

Section 2. Section 474.2126, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

474.2126 Veterinary professional associate.-

- (1) The Legislature finds that the practice in this state of veterinary professional associates, with their education, training, and experience in the field of veterinary medicine, will provide increased efficiency of and access to high-quality veterinary medical services at a reasonable cost to consumers.
 - (2) As used in this section, the term:
 - (a) "Approved program" means a master's program in

veterinary clinical care, or the equivalent, in the United

States or in its territories or possessions from an accredited school of veterinary medicine.

- (b) "Supervision" means responsible supervision and control, and, except in cases of emergency, requires the easy availability or physical presence of a licensed veterinarian for consultation and direction of the actions of a veterinary professional associate. For the purposes of this paragraph, the term "easy availability" includes the ability to communicate by way of telecommunication.
- (c) "Veterinary professional associate" means a person who has earned a master's degree from an approved program or who meets standards approved by the board and is authorized to perform veterinary medical services delegated by a supervising veterinarian.
- (3) The title "veterinary professional associate" may be used only by an individual who has successfully completed an approved program.
- (4) Unless otherwise prohibited by federal or state law, a veterinary professional associate may perform duties or actions, including those identified in s. 474.202(9) and (13), in which he or she is competent and has the necessary training, current knowledge, and experience to perform, as assigned by a veterinarian licensed in this state while working under the supervision of that veterinarian. A veterinary professional associate may not do either of the following:
- (a) Prescribe medicinal drugs or drugs as defined in s. 465.003(15) or a controlled substance listed in s. 893.03.
 - (b) Except for veterinary sterilizations or veterinary
