Everglades Improvement and Management; Revises legislative findings for achieving water quality goals; revises definition of term "Long-Term Plan"; revises provisions for use of certain ad valorem tax proceeds; directs SFWMD to complete specified analysis; revises provisions for collection of agricultural privilege tax; provides for use of such tax proceeds; provides that payment of such tax & certain costs fulfills certain constitutional obligations; provides appropriations. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/SB 1664, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Legg—

Education; Revising the requirements of State Board of Education rule for uniform core curricula for state-approved teacher preparation programs; authorizing a qualified private provider to seek approval to offer a competency-based certification program; requiring the board to adopt rules that allow an individual who meets specified criteria to be eligible for a temporary certificate in education leadership; renaming the Florida Teachers Lead Program as the Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

CS/CS/HB 617 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Pilon and others—

Juvenile Justice Circuit Advisory Boards and Juvenile Justice County Councils; Redesignates juvenile justice circuit boards as juvenile justice circuit advisory boards; requires each board to have county organization representing each county in the circuit; provides exception for single-county circuits; deletes provisions providing for juvenile justice county councils; revises provisions relating to duties & responsibilities of boards; requires submission of circuit plans by specified dates; revises membership of boards; provides for appointment of members; provides for terms of embers; provides for quorums & for passage of measures or positions; revises provisions relating to bylaws; conforms provisions. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

CS/CS/HB 57 (3R) by the Committees on Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee, Business and Professional Regulation Subcommittee and Representative Porter—

Department of Business and Professional Regulation; Clarifies funding requirements for Florida Homeowners' Construction Recovery Fund; authorizes DBPR to transfer certain funds from Florida Building Code Administrators & Inspectors Board to Florida Homeowners' Construction Recovery Fund. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

CS/CS/SB 770, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Community Affairs and Senator Ring—

Neighborhood Improvement Districts; Providing that an ordinance that creates a neighborhood improvement district may authorize the district to exercise certain powers, in addition to those already granted to such districts; specifying such powers; conditioning the exercise of those powers on resolution and referendum, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2013

CS/CS/HB 635, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee and Representative Edwards—

Insurance; Revises date of future repeal of exemption of medical malpractice insurance premiums from emergency assessments imposed to fund certain obligations, costs, & expenses of Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund & Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund Finance Corporation; authorizes uniform motor vehicle proof-of-insurance card to be in electronic format; provides construction with respect to parameters of person's consent to access information on electronic device presented to provide proof of insurance; provides immunity from liability to law enforcement officer for damage to electronic device presented to provide proof of insurance; authorizes DHSMV to adopt rules; authorizes insurers to furnish uniform proof-of-purchase cards in electronic format for use by insureds to prove purchase of required insurance coverage when registering motor vehicle; defines "authorized inspection agency"; requires chief inspector of state boiler inspection program to issue certificate of competency as special inspector to certain individuals; specifies how long certificate remains in effect; prohibits an insurance agency from conducting insurance business at location without designated agent in charge; revises date by which title insurance agencies & certain insurers must annually submit specified information to OIR. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/HB 7083, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Gaetz and others—

Death Penalty; Revises provisions authorizing CCRC to represent persons convicted & sentenced to death in clemency proceedings; prohibits CCRC & replacement regional counsel from accepting an appointment or taking & action that creates actual conflict of interest; limits ability of certain attorneys found to have provided constitutionally deficient representation from providing such representation for specified period; establishes procedures for public records production in postconviction capital cases; provides criteria for private registry attorneys appointed to represent persons in postconviction capital proceedings; requires persons convicted & sentenced to death to pursue all possible collateral remedies in state court in accordance with FRCP rather than in accordance with statute; specifies that sentence shall not be executed until Governor or Secretary of Corrections issues warrant; provides for issuance of warrants by secretary; requires capital postconviction motions to be filed in accordance with FRCP; requires Florida Supreme Court to annually report certain information regarding capital postconviction cases to Legislature; requires courts to report specified findings of ineffective assistance of counsel to Florida Bar. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

CS/SB 1108, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Education, Senators Gardiner, Thrasher and others—

Exceptional Student Education; Prohibiting certain actions with respect to parent meetings with school district personnel; requiring a school district to provide exceptional student education-related services to certain home education program students; requiring the use of parental consent forms for specified actions in a student's individual education plan; providing that a student with a disability be granted an extraordinary exemption from the administration of certain assessments under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Economic Development; Providing that tourist development tax revenues may also be used to pay the debt service on bonds that finance the renovation of a professional sports facility that is publicly owned, or that is on publicly owned land, and that is publicly operated or operated by the owner of a professional sports franchise or other lessee; requiring a majority plus one vote of the membership of the board of county commissioners to levy a tax for renovation of a sports franchise facility after approval by a majority of the electors voting in a referendum to approve the proposed use of the tax revenues; providing that the Department of Economic Opportunity shall screen applicants for state funding for sports development, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

Retirement; Providing that a member initially enrolled in the Florida Retirement System after a certain date is vested in the pension plan after 10 years of creditable service; prohibiting members of the Elected Officers' Class from joining the Senior Management Service Class after a specified date; requiring certain employees initially enrolled in the Florida Retirement System on or after a specified date to be compulsory members of the investment plan; authorizing certain employees to elect to participate in the pension plan, rather than the default investment plan, within a specified time, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Education; Allowing individuals or organizations that provide online courses, including massive open online courses, which are measured by statewide assessments to apply for approval as state-level providers; creating the Florida Accredited Courses and Tests Initiative (FACTs); providing for application of certain courses and assessments toward promotion, graduation, and degree attainment; authorizing a school district, a Florida College System institution, and a state university to contract with qualified contractors to administer and proctor statewide standardized assessments or assessments associated with Florida-accredited courses, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Requiring public hearings relating to the development of land management plans to be held in any one, rather than each, county affected by such plans; providing for Lee County to retain ownership and assume responsibility for management of a specified portion of the Babcock Crescent B Ranch Florida Forever acquisition; creating chapter 595, F.S., to establish the Florida School Food and Nutrition Act, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

CS/SB 378 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Bean and others—

Manufactured and Mobile Homes; Requiring the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation to provide coverage for mobile homes and related structures; specifying the procedure for requesting and obtaining funds from the Florida Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund to pay for the operational costs of the Florida Mobile Home Relocation Corporation and the relocation costs of mobile home owners, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Regulated Industries reports the committee substitute favorably; the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Nursing Home Litigation; Providing that a claim for punitive damages may not be brought unless there is a showing of admissible evidence proffered by the parties which provides a reasonable basis for recovery of punitive damages when certain criteria are applied; requiring the trier of fact to find by clear and convincing evidence that a specific person or corporate defendant actively and knowingly participated in intentional misconduct or engaged in conduct that constituted gross negligence and contributed to the loss, damages, or injury suffered by the claimant before punitive damages may be awarded, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

Public Records/Natural Gas Storage Facility Permit; Creating an exemption from public records requirements for certain information provided in an application for a natural gas storage facility permit to inject and recover gas into and from a natural gas storage reservoir; providing exceptions to the exemption; providing for future review and repeal of the public records exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2013, if SB 958 or similar legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.

CS/SB 1868 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Bean—

Public Records/Payment Instrument Transaction/Office of Financial Regulation; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for payment instrument transaction information held by the Office of Financial Regulation; authorizing the office to enter into information-sharing agreements and provide access to information contained in the database to certain governmental agencies; requiring a department or agency that receives confidential information to maintain the confidentiality of the information, except as otherwise required by court order, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 410 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.

CS/CS/SB 582 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Commerce and Tourism and Senator Galvano—

Manufacturing Development; Establishing the Manufacturing Competitiveness Act; authorizing local governments to establish a local manufacturing development program that provides for master development approval for certain sites; requiring the Department of Economic Opportunity to develop a model ordinance containing specified information and provisions; requiring the department, in cooperation with participating agencies, to establish a manufacturing development coordinated approval process for certain manufacturers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 500 (SO) by the Committees on Health Policy, Community Affairs, Regulated Industries, Senator Clemens and others—

Massage Practice; Requiring an application to be denied upon specified findings; prohibiting the operation of a massage establishment during specified times; prohibiting the use of a massage establishment as a principal domicile unless the establishment is zoned for residential use under a local ordinance; authorizing a county or municipality to waive the restriction on operating hours of a massage establishment in certain instances; declaring that a massage establishment operating in violation of specified statutes is a nuisance that may be abated or enjoined, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1000 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Gibson and others—

Purchase of Firearms by Mentally Ill Persons; Providing conditions under which a person who has been voluntarily admitted to a mental institution for treatment and has undergone an involuntary examination under the Baker Act may be prohibited from purchasing a firearm; providing requirements for the examining physician; providing requirements with respect to the filing of specified records with the court and presentation of such records to a judge or magistrate; providing lawful authority of a judge or magistrate to review specified records and order such records be submitted to the Department of Law Enforcement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 924 (SO) by Senator Latvala—

Dentists; Prohibiting a contract between a health insurer and a dentist from requiring the dentist to provide services at a fee set by the insurer under certain circumstances; prohibiting a contract between a prepaid limited health service organization and a dentist from requiring the dentist to provide services at a fee set by the organization under certain circumstances; prohibiting a contract between a health maintenance organization and a dentist from requiring the dentist to provide services at a fee set by the organization under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2013, and applies to contracts entered into or renewed on or after that date.
