Everglades Improvement and Management; Revises legislative findings for achieving water quality goals; revises definition of term "Long-Term Plan"; revises provisions for use of certain ad valorem tax proceeds; directs SFWMD to complete specified analysis; revises provisions for collection of agricultural privilege tax; provides for use of such tax proceeds; provides that payment of such tax & certain costs fulfills certain constitutional obligations; provides appropriations. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/HB 617 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Pilon and others—

Juvenile Justice Circuit Advisory Boards and Juvenile Justice County Councils; Redesignates juvenile justice circuit boards as juvenile justice circuit advisory boards; requires each board to have county organization representing each county in the circuit; provides exception for single-county circuits; deletes provisions providing for juvenile justice county councils; revises provisions relating to duties & responsibilities of boards; requires submission of circuit plans by specified dates; revises membership of boards; provides for appointment of members; provides for terms of embers; provides for quorums & for passage of measures or positions; revises provisions relating to bylaws; conforms provisions. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

Department of Business and Professional Regulation; Clarifies funding requirements for Florida Homeowners' Construction Recovery Fund; authorizes DBPR to transfer certain funds from Florida Building Code Administrators & Inspectors Board to Florida Homeowners' Construction Recovery Fund. Effective Date: 10/01/2013

CS/CS/HB 635, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee and Representative Edwards—

Insurance; Revises date of future repeal of exemption of medical malpractice insurance premiums from emergency assessments imposed to fund certain obligations, costs, & expenses of Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund & Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund Finance Corporation; authorizes uniform motor vehicle proof-of-insurance card to be in electronic format; provides construction with respect to parameters of person's consent to access information on electronic device presented to provide proof of insurance; provides immunity from liability to law enforcement officer for damage to electronic device presented to provide proof of insurance; authorizes DHSMV to adopt rules; authorizes insurers to furnish uniform proof-of-purchase cards in electronic format for use by insureds to prove purchase of required insurance coverage when registering motor vehicle; defines "authorized inspection agency"; requires chief inspector of state boiler inspection program to issue certificate of competency as special inspector to certain individuals; specifies how long certificate remains in effect; prohibits an insurance agency from conducting insurance business at location without designated agent in charge; revises date by which title insurance agencies & certain insurers must annually submit specified information to OIR. CS/SB 1350, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Bradley—

Criminal Penalties; Providing criminal sentences applicable to a person who was under the age of 18 years at the time the offense was committed; requiring that a judge consider certain factors before determining if life imprisonment is an appropriate sentence; providing for review of certain sentences of offenders who were under the age of 18 at the time of the offense, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

CS/SB 808 (3R) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Margolis—

Needle and Syringe Exchange Pilot Program; Requiring the Department of Health to establish a needle and syringe exchange pilot program in Miami-Dade County; providing for administration of the pilot program by the department or a designee; providing that the distribution of needles and syringes under the pilot program is not a violation of the Florida Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act or any other law; providing conditions under which a pilot program staff member or participant may be prosecuted; providing for the pilot program to be funded through private grants and donations, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

HB 725 (3R) by Representative Harrell—

Public Records and Public Meetings Exemptions; Eliminates requirements that closed portion of meeting of State Child Abuse Death Review Committee or local committee at which specified identifying information is discussed be recorded, that no portion of such closed meeting be off record, & that recording be maintained by state committee or local committee. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

CS/CS/HB 7009, 2nd Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Education Committee, Appropriations Committee, Choice and Innovation Subcommittee, Representative Moraitis and others—

Charter Schools; Revises various provisions relating to charter schools, including charter contracts, disclosure requirements, submission of applications, charter renewals & termination, student enrollment, compliance with law, reimbursement of federal funds, & use of school district facilities; revises criteria for classification as high-performing charter school & charter school system & requires annual review thereof. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

CS/HB 461, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Choice and Innovation Subcommittee, Representative Rooney and others—

Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Students; Requires DOE to develop model communication plan to be used in development of IEP for deaf or hard-of-hearing students; requires DOE to disseminate model to each school district & provide technical assistance. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Department of Transportation; Removes provision for certain audits; revises provisions relating to the Transportation Commission, Statewide Passenger Rail Commission, personnel, commercial motor vehicles, Space Florida, aerospace facilities, airports, lease-purchase agreement, maintenance, construction contracts and bids, disposition of property, parking time limit devices, public-private facilities, tolls, bonds, M.P.O.'s, corporations, infrastructure bank, intercity bus service, intermodal development, Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority, & environmental impact; and provides for regional transportation finance authorities. Education; Allowing individuals or organizations that provide online courses, including massive open online courses, which are measured by statewide assessments to apply for approval as state-level providers; creating the Florida Accredited Courses and Tests Initiative (FACTs); providing for application of certain courses and assessments toward promotion, graduation, and degree attainment; authorizing a school district, a Florida College System institution, and a state university to contract with qualified contractors to administer and proctor statewide standardized assessments or assessments associated with Florida-accredited courses, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1628 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Agriculture and Senator Montford—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Requiring public hearings relating to the development of land management plans to be held in any one, rather than each, county affected by such plans; providing for Lee County to retain ownership and assume responsibility for management of a specified portion of the Babcock Crescent B Ranch Florida Forever acquisition; creating chapter 595, F.S., to establish the Florida School Food and Nutrition Act, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

CS/CS/SB 1458 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Brandes—

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Providing that certain positions in the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles are exempt from career service; requiring that an operator of a motor vehicle yield the furthestmost left-hand lane when being overtaken on a multilane highway; establishing a pilot rebuilt motor vehicle inspection program; amending provisions relating to review of a license suspension when the driver had blood or breath alcohol at a certain level or the driver refused a test of his or her blood or breath to determine the alcohol level, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

CS/CS/SB 1722 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Legg—

Early Learning; Creating the Office of Early Learning within the Department of Education's Office of Independent Education and Parental Choice; providing duties relating to the establishment and operation of the school readiness program and the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program; requiring the office to adopt performance standards for students in the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program and approve curricula; creating part VI of ch. 1002, F.S., relating to the school readiness program; providing early learning coalition powers and duties for the school readiness program; providing for Early Head Start collaboration grants, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Department of Economic Opportunity; Establishing the Economic Development Programs Evaluation; revising the distribution of funds in the Grants and Donations Trust Fund; requiring the Department of Economic Opportunity to analyze each economic development incentive application; providing for the state's guarantee of certain federal loans to local governments; creating the "Gulf Coast Economic Corridor Act"; creating Triumph Gulf Coast, Inc., as nonprofit corporation; requiring the corporation to create and administer the Recovery Fund for the benefit of disproportionately affected counties, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1686 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Regulated Industries and Senator Altman—

Pugilistic Exhibitions; Revising the duties and responsibilities of the executive director of the Florida State Boxing Commission; providing for immediate license suspension and other disciplinary action if a participant fails or refuses to provide a urine sample or tests positive for specified prohibited substances; requiring promoters to retain specified documents and records, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

*Identical to **CS/HB 1067(HC)** in the Committees on Regulated Industries; Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government; and Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 446 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Commerce and Tourism and Senator Hukill—

Economic Development Incentive Application Process; Requiring an applicant to provide a surety bond to the Department of Economic Opportunity before the applicant receives incentive awards through the Quick Action Closing Fund or the Innovation Incentive Program; requiring the contract or agreement to provide that the bond remain in effect until all conditions have been satisfied; providing that the department may require the bond to cover the entire contracted amount or allow for bonds to be renewed upon completion of certain performance measures; providing for a waiver of the surety bond or other security if certain information is provided and the department determines it to be in the best interest of the state, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism, with zero amendments; Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

HB 533, 1st Eng. (LB) by Representative Raulerson—

City of Tampa, Hillsborough County; Amends definition for General Employees' Pension Plan for City of Tampa; specifies conditions under which Employee's Pension Credit is nonforfeitable; provides for return to Employee of his or her contributions to Plan. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 1007 (LB) by the Committee on Economic Affairs Committee, Representative Rodrigues and others—

Lee County Tourist Development Council, Lee County; Revises council membership; provides exception to general law. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 1009 (LB) by the Committee on Local and Federal Affairs Committee and Representative Mayfield—

Fellsmere Water Control District, Indian River County; Codifies, amends, reenacts, & repeals certain chapters of LOF relating to Fellsmere Water Control District, Indian River County; renames district Fellsmere Improvement District; provides legislative intent; provides additional authority relating to provision of public infrastructure, services, assessment, levy, & collection of non-ad valorem assessments & fees, public finance, & district operations; provides district boundaries; provides for applicability of ch. 298, F.S., & other general laws; provides powers of district; provides for compliance with county & municipal plans & regulations; provides for levy of non-ad valorem assessments; provides for collection, enforcement, & penalties; provides for issuance of revenue bonds, assessment bonds, & bond anticipation notes; ratifies prior acts & circuit court decrees; provides for severability. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 1285 (LB) by Representative Williams, A.—

Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center Authority, Leon County; Abolishes Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center Authority; repeals provisions for authority's charter; designates Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center as "Donald L. Tucker Civic Center"; provides for erection of suitable markers; requires DBPR's Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco to issue beverage license to FSU or its designee; transfers all assets & liabilities of authority to FSU. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 1421 (LB) by the Committee on Regulatory Affairs Committee and Representative Beshears—

Madison County; Provides for special alcoholic beverage license to be issued to certain hotels & motels. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 1682 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Joyner—

Residential Services for Children; Revising the definition of the term “boarding school”; providing accreditation requirements for boarding schools; authorizing the Department of Children and Families to impose administrative sanctions or civil remedies when residential group care is being provided without a license; requiring background screening for certain boarding school personnel; requiring boarding schools to follow standard school schedules, holiday breaks, and summer recesses; providing that children other than foreign citizens may not be year-round residents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2013

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and withdrawn from the Committees on Judiciary; and Appropriations

*Similar to **CS/HB 7129(HC)** in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; Judiciary; and Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 1666 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance and Senator Latvala—

Mortgage Foreclosures; Limiting the eligibility of retired judges to receive compensation and reimbursement under certain circumstances; revising the limitations period for commencing an action to enforce a claim of a deficiency judgment after a foreclosure action; requiring a court to treat a collateral attack on a final judgment of foreclosure on a mortgage as a claim for monetary damages under certain circumstances; revising the class of persons authorized to move for expedited foreclosure to include lienholders, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations

SB 1322 (SO) by Senator Gibson and others—

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
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
