## BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

### SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, APRIL 12, 2017

#### **CS/SB 10 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Bradley and others—**

**Water Resources;** Authorizing the South Florida Water Management District and the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund to negotiate the amendment and termination of leases on lands within the Everglades Agricultural Area for exchange or use for the reservoir project; requiring certain lease agreements for agricultural work programs to be terminated in accordance with the lease terms; requiring the district to request that the United States Army Corps of Engineers jointly develop a post-authorization change report for the Central Everglades Planning Project; providing requirements for the C-51 reservoir project if state funds are appropriated for the project; prohibiting the use of inmates for correctional work programs in the agricultural industry in certain areas, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on the Environment and Natural Resources; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

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#### **SB 2500 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Latvala)—**

**Appropriations;** Providing moneys for the annual period beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018, and supplemental appropriations for the period ending June 30, 2017, to pay salaries and other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, and other improvements, and for other specified purposes of the various agencies of state government, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect July 1, 2017, or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later; however, if this act becomes law after July 1, 2017, then it shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2017

#### **SB 2502 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Latvala)—**
