SB 7006 (2R) by the Committee on Health Policy (Young)—

Direct-support Organization of the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program; Abrogating the repeal of provisions authorizing the Department of Health to establish a direct-support organization for the prescription drug monitoring program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations
