Vessel Registrations; Revising a reduction of vessel registration fees for recreational vessels equipped with certain position indicating and locating beacons, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

HB 741 (3R) by Representative Trumbull—

Department of Business and Professional Regulation Fees; Revises delinquency fee that professional board or DBPR imposes on delinquent status licensee; revises surcharge that DBPR assesses on building permits. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Substituted for SB 514(SUB) (Stargel) and read the second time on April 19, 2017

CS/SB 1634 (3R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Steube—

Residential Elevators; Requiring that an elevator controller be capable of monitoring the closed and locked contacts of the hoistway door locking device; requiring that the elevator controller be capable of interrupting the power for the motor and brake for a hoistway door locking device under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Read the second time on April 19, 2017

CS/SB 1694 (3R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Torres—

Support for Parental Victims of Child Domestic Violence; Requiring the Department of Juvenile Justice, in collaboration with specified organizations, to develop and maintain updated information and materials regarding specified services and resources; requiring the department to make the information and materials available through specified means; requiring domestic violence training for law enforcement officers to include training concerning child-to-parent cases, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

CS/CS/SB 64 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Bean and others—

State Park Fees; Providing certain discounts on state park fees to specified foster and adoptive families; requiring the Division of Recreation and Parks within the Department of Environmental Protection to establish certain documentation standards and create a procedure for obtaining the discounts; requiring the division to continue a partnership with the Department of Children and Families to promote fostering and adoption of special needs children with certain events, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

CS/HB 849 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Combee and others—

Concealed Weapons and Firearms on Private School Property; Provides that persons licensed to carry concealed weapon & concealed firearm are not prohibited by specified laws from such carry on certain private school property. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1330(SUB) (Stargel), read the second time, and amended on April 19, 2017

CS/HJR 21, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Ways and Means Committee, Representative Burton and others—

Limitations on Property Tax Assessments; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to remove future repeal of constitutional provisions that limit amount of annual increases in assessments, except for school district levies, of specified nonhomestead real property.

HB 7067 (3R) by the Committee on Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee and Representative Rommel—

A Review Under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; Revises definition of term "proprietary business information" as used in exemption from public record requirements relating to information provided by title insurance agencies & insurers to OIR; removes scheduled repeal of exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

Substituted for CS/SB 7024(SUB) (Flores) and read the second time on April 19, 2017

HB 7045 (3R) by the Committee on Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee and Representative Raulerson—

OGSR/Reports of Unclaimed Property; Removes scheduled repeal of public records exemption for social security numbers & property identifiers contained in reports of unclaimed property. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

Substituted for SB 7026(SUB) (Flores) and read the second time on April 19, 2017

CS/CS/SB 716 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Regulated Industries and Senator Passidomo—

Real Estate Appraisers; Revising authorized methods of instruction and certain requirements for specified real estate practice courses; requiring the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to transmit a specified roster to a certain appraisal subcommittee; deleting an exception by which the board may grant a registration to a person otherwise deemed not qualified; adding certain grounds for discipline by the board against appraisal management companies, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

Similar to CS/CS/HB 927, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Regulated Industries; Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government; and Appropriations

CS/SB 392, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Education, Senator Hukill and others—

High School Graduation Requirements; Revising the requirements for the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards to include financial literacy; revising the required credits for a standard high school diploma to include one-half credit of instruction in personal financial literacy and money management and seven and one-half, rather than eight, credits in electives, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Cottage Food Operations; Increasing the annual gross sales limitation for exempting cottage food operations from certain food and building permitting requirements; authorizing cottage food products to be advertised, sold, and paid for over the Internet; requiring such products to be delivered in person directly to the consumer or to a specific event venue, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Similar to HB 1233(HC) in the Committees on Agriculture; Commerce and Tourism; and Rules

SB 1390 (SO) by Senator Latvala and others—

Transportation Facility Designations; Providing an honorary designation of a certain transportation facility in a specified county, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 7002 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs (Lee)—

OGSR/Donor Information/Publicly Owned Performing Arts Center; Amending provisions which provide an exemption from public records requirements for information that identifies a donor or prospective donor of a donation made for the benefit of a publicly owned performing arts center if the donor desires to remain anonymous; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Identical to HB 7113(HC) in the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules

CS/SB 90 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Brandes and others—

Renewable Energy Source Devices; Revising the definition of the term “renewable energy source device”; prohibiting the consideration of just value of property attributable to a renewable energy source device in determining the assessed value of any real property; exempting a renewable energy source device from the tangible personal property tax, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2018

Reported favorably by the Committee on Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 38 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Benacquisto—

Relief of L.T. by the State of Florida; Providing for the relief of L.T.; providing an appropriation to compensate L.T. for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of employees of the Department of Children and Families, formerly known as the Department of Children and Family Services, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 102 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Steube and others—

Payment of Health Care Claims; Prohibiting a health insurer or a health maintenance organization from retroactively denying a claim under specified circumstances; exempting certain Medicaid managed care plans, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 368 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Montford—

Transportation Facility Designations; Providing honorary designations of various transportation facilities in specified counties; directing the department to erect signage in specified counties to commemorate certain conflicts involving the United States Armed Forces, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1338 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Book—

Vessels; Authorizing certain grandfathered private residential multifamily docks to exceed the number of moored boats for the number of residential units; authorizing owners of certain private submerged land to request that the commission establish boating-restricted areas to protect certain seagrass; authorizing a local government to enact and enforce certain regulations that prohibit or restrict mooring or anchoring of certain vessels, that require sewage disposal by certain vessels and floating structures, and that authorize the removal of certain vessels, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; Appropriations Subcommittee on the Environment and Natural Resources recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 370 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Senator Stargel and others—

Florida Wing of the Civil Air Patrol; Requiring certain employers to provide Civil Air Patrol leave; prohibiting specified public and private employers from discharging, reprimanding, or penalizing a Civil Air Patrol member because of his or her absence by reason of taking Civil Air Patrol leave, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 800 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Broxson and others—

Medication Synchronization; Requiring health insurers and health maintenance organizations, respectively, which issue or deliver certain policies or contracts to offer medication synchronization to allow insureds and subscribers to align refill dates for certain drugs at least once in a plan year; requiring such insurers and health maintenance organizations to implement a process for aligning such dates, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2018

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Health Policy reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 890 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Bean and others—

Florida Endowment for Vocational Rehabilitation; Requiring the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to maintain separate accounts for certain funds received from state sources and public or private sources; requiring that funds allocated for research, advertising, or consulting be subject to a competitive solicitation process; extending the date for future review and repeal of provisions governing the Florida Endowment for Vocational Rehabilitation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 896 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Simmons—

Florida Prepaid College Board; Revising the financial disclosures required to be filed by certain Florida Prepaid College Board members; extending the repeal date of the direct-support organization for the Florida Prepaid College Board, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 430 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Bean and others—

Discount Plan Organizations; Specifying periodic charge reimbursement and other requirements for discount plan organizations following membership cancellation requests; requiring discount plan organizations and marketers to provide specified disclosures to prospective members before enrollment; authorizing a discount plan organization to delegate functions to its marketers, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/HB 577, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Banking and Insurance; Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and Appropriations

SB 438 (SO) by Senator Baxley—

Out-of-school Suspension; Authorizing a parent to give public testimony regarding a district school board's out-of-school suspension policy at a specified meeting; requiring a district school board to review its rules authorizing out-of-school suspension during a specified timeframe at a district school board meeting; requiring the board to take public testimony at the meeting; providing that the rules expire under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1224 (SO) by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Senator Passidomo and others—

Public Records and Public Meetings/Campus Emergency Response for Public Postsecondary Institutions; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for a public postsecondary educational institution's campus emergency response plan when held by specified custodial agencies; providing an exemption from public meetings requirements for any portion of a public meeting at which certain components of a campus emergency response plan are discussed; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; the Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/HB 1079(HC) in the Committees on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; Education; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/CS/SB 1272 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Regulated Industries, Senator Brandes and others—

Professional Regulation; Citing this act as the "Occupational Opportunity Act"; revising the length of time that an active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States may remain in good standing with an administrative board or program under certain circumstances; requiring, rather than authorizing, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to issue a professional license, rather than a temporary license, to specified applicants, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/CS/HB 615, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Regulated Industries; Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and Appropriations

SB 114 (SO) by Senator Brandes—

Cosmetic Product Registration; Deleting the requirement that a person who manufactures, packages, repackages, labels, or relabels a cosmetic in this state register such cosmetic biennially with the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 182 (SO) by the Committees on Health Policy, Banking and Insurance, Senator Mayfield and others—

Consumer Protection from Nonmedical Changes to Prescription Drug Formularies; Limiting, under specified circumstances, changes to a health insurance policy prescription drug formulary during a policy year; requiring small employer carriers to limit changes to prescription drug formularies under certain circumstances; limiting, under specified circumstances, changes to a health maintenance contract prescription drug formulary during a contract year, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2018

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 256 (SO) by Senator Steube and others—

Florida Center for the Partnerships for Arts Integrated Teaching; Abrogating the scheduled expiration of the center, etc. Effective Date: 06/30/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Higher Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 414 (SO) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Policy and Senator Grimsley—

Hospice Services; Exempting certain hospice services in a not-for-profit retirement community from specified review and application requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/HB 863, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 674 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Health Policy and Senator Bean—

Public Records/Nonviable Birth Records; Providing that a certificate of nonviable birth must contain information as required by the Department of Health; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 672 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/HB 103(HC) in the Committees on Health Policy; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Appropriations

SB 672 (SO) by Senator Bean—

Certificates of Nonviable Birth; Creating the “Grieving Families Act”; requiring certain health care practitioners and health care facilities to electronically file a registration of nonviable birth within a specified timeframe; requiring the Department of Health to issue a certificate of nonviable birth within a specified timeframe upon the request of a parent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/CS/HB 101(HC) in the Committees on Health Policy; Judiciary; and Appropriations

SB 1094 (SO) by Senator Gainer—

Forensic Hospital Diversion Pilot Program; Authorizing the Department of Children and Families to implement a Forensic Hospital Diversion Pilot Program in Okaloosa County in conjunction with the First Judicial Circuit in Okaloosa County, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1726 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Agriculture, Senator Montford and others—

Industrial Hemp Pilot Projects; Authorizing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to oversee the development of industrial hemp pilot projects for the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences at the University of Florida and the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University; authorizing the universities to develop the pilot projects in partnership with public, nonprofit, and private entities, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 1620 (SO) by Senator Powell—
