Identification Card and Driver License Fees for Veterans; Deleting fees for adding the word “Veteran” to an identification card or a driver license; revising acceptable forms of identification required to add the word “Veteran” to an identification card or a driver license; prohibiting tax collectors from charging certain driver license service fees to veterans who present specified forms of identification, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

Sale of Firearms; Requiring Department of Law Enforcement procedures to allow the payment or transmittal of processing fees for criminal history checks of potential firearms buyers by electronic means; providing that criminal history check requests by licensed importers, manufacturers, and dealers to the department may be made by electronic means, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2018

Joint Committee on the Library of Congress/Statue Replacement Approval; Requesting the Joint Committee on the Library of Congress to approve the replacement of the statue of Confederate General Edmund Kirby Smith in the National Statuary Hall Collection with a statue of Mary McLeod Bethune, etc.

CS/SB 204 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Bradley and others—

Land Acquisition Trust Fund; Revising the specified appropriation for spring restoration, protection, and management projects; requiring a specified appropriation for certain projects related to the St. Johns River and its tributaries or the Keystone Heights Lake Region, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

SB 220 (2R) by Senator Passidomo—

Bankruptcy Matters in Foreclosure Proceedings; Authorizing lienholders to use certain documents as an admission in an action to foreclose a mortgage; providing that submission of certain documents in a foreclosure action creates a rebuttable presumption that the defendant has waived any defenses to the foreclosure; requiring a court to take judicial notice of orders entered in bankruptcy cases under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2018

SB 232 (2R) by Senator Book and others—

Coral Reefs; Establishing the Southeast Florida Coral Reef Ecosystem Conservation Area, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on the Environment and Natural Resources; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

Pregnancy Support Services; Requiring the Department of Health to contract with a not-for-profit statewide alliance of organizations to provide pregnancy support and wellness services through subcontractors; requiring the contractor to spend a specified percentage of funds on direct client services; specifying the entities eligible for a subcontract, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

SB 494 (2R) by Senator Lee—

Linear Facilities; Revising the definition of the term “development” to exclude work by certain utility providers on utility infrastructure on certain rights-of-way or corridors; requiring the consideration of a certain variance standard when including conditions for the certification of an electrical power plant; clarifying that the Public Service Commission has exclusive jurisdiction to require underground transmission lines, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/SB 510 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Health Policy, Senator Young and others—

Reporting of Adverse Incidents in Planned out-of-hospital Births; Defining the term “adverse incident”; requiring licensed physicians, certified nurse midwives, and licensed midwives to report an adverse incident and a medical summary of events to the Department of Health within a specified timeframe; requiring the department to review adverse incident reports and determine if conduct occurred that is subject to disciplinary action, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Business Filings; Authorizing certain persons to correct filed records that contain certain information; requiring the Department of State to send a notice of the filing of a record through e-mail or send a copy of the document to the mailing address of the entity or its representative; authorizing a domestic or foreign corporation to correct certain documents if they contain false, misleading, or fraudulent information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

SB 7002 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Bracy)—

OGSR/Active Criminal Intelligence or Criminal Investigative Information; Amending provisions which provides an exemption from public meetings requirements for portions of a meeting of a duly constituted criminal justice commission at which active criminal intelligence information or active criminal investigative information being considered by, or which may foreseeably come before, the commission is discussed; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2018
