SB 152 (2R) by Senator Collins-

Public Records/Safe-school Officer at a Private School; Providing a public records exemption for information pertaining to a safe-school officer at a private school; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 150 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law
