Public Safety; Authorizes person to carry concealed weapon or firearm if he or she is licensed to do so or meets specified requirements; requires person who is carrying concealed weapon or firearm without license to carry identification & display upon demand by law enforcement; prohibits person who is carrying concealed weapon or firearm without license from carrying such weapon or firearm in specified locations; authorizes nonresident to carry concealed weapon or firearm in this state if he or she meets same requirements as resident; requires Office of Safe Schools to develop behavioral threat management operational process. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Pub. Effective Date: On the same date that HB 543 or similar legislation takes effect

Death Penalty; Requiring a determination of a specified number of jurors, rather than jury unanimity, for a sentencing recommendation of death to the court; requiring a determination of a specified number of jurors, rather than jury unanimity, for a sentencing recommendation of life imprisonment without the possibility of parole to the court; requiring the court to impose the recommended sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of parole to the court; requiring the court to include in the vertice of death; requiring the court to include in its written order the reasons for not accepting the jury's recommended sentence, if applicable, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Substance Abuse Services; Revising application requirements for licensure as a substance abuse service provider; requiring the Department of Children and Families to establish, by a specified date, a mechanism to impose and collect fines for certain violations of law; revising credentialing requirements for recovery residences; prohibiting service providers from referring patients to, or accepting referrals from, specified recovery residences, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

SB 1210 (SO) by Senator Burgess-

Public Records/Human Trafficking Victims; Expanding an existing public records exemption relating to human trafficking victims seeking expunction of certain records related to an offense listed in s. 775.084(1)(b)1., F.S.; providing for the reversion of specified provisions if the exemption is not saved from repeal; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 300 (SO) by Senator Grall and others-

Pregnancy and Parenting Support; Requiring the Department of Health to contract for the management and delivery of parenting support services, in addition to pregnancy support services; prohibiting physicians from knowingly performing or inducing a termination of pregnancy after the gestational age of the fetus is determined to be more than 6 weeks, rather than 15 weeks, with exceptions; providing an exception if the woman obtaining the abortion is doing so because she is a victim of rape or incest, subject to certain conditions; prohibiting any person other than a physician from inducing a termination of pregnancy: requiring that medications intended for use in a medical abortion be dispensed in person by a physician; prohibiting the dispensing of such medication through the United States Postal Service or any other courier or shipping service, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect 30 days after any of the following occurs, etc.

SM 848 (SO) by Senator Powell and others-

People of Iran; Urging Congress to stand in support of the fight for freedom of the people of Iran, etc.

CS/CS/SB 226 (SO) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Judiciary and Senator Berman—

Support for Dependent Adult Children; Requiring that certain rights of the parents of a dependent adult child be established in a guardianship proceeding; specifying that a court may modify a child support order for adult children in certain circumstances; providing factors a court must consider when determining the amount of child support for a dependent adult child; prohibiting the court from ordering support that will cause ineligibility for certain programs; authorizing a court to assign support to certain trusts established for a dependent adult child for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

CS/SB 254 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Yarborough and others—

Treatments for Sex Reassignment; Granting courts of this state jurisdiction to enter, modify, or stay a child custody determination relating to a child present in this state to the extent necessary to protect the child from being subjected to sex-reassignment prescriptions or procedures in another state; prohibiting certain public entities from expending state funds for the provision of sexreassignment prescriptions or procedures; requiring certain licensed facilities, by a specified date and as a condition of licensure thereafter, to provide a signed attestation of specified information to the Agency for Health Care Administration; prohibiting sex-reassignment prescriptions and procedures for patients younger than 18 years of age, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 382 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Bradley—

Compensation for Wrongfully Incarcerated Persons; Revising requirements for when a petition seeking compensation must be filed; providing that a deceased person's heirs, successors, or assigns do not have standing to file such a petition; revising compensation eligibility requirements; revising requirements for awarding compensation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Trees and Vegetation Within the Rights-of-way of Certain Roads and Rail Corridors; Providing that the prohibition against the removal, cutting, marring, defacing, or destruction of trees or other vegetation in certain rights-of-way does not apply if the Department of Transportation suspends such prohibition pursuant to a declared state of emergency; requiring the department to publish informational guidelines regarding the removal of debris from certain emergencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably CS/CS/SB 154 (2R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Regulated Industries, Senator Bradley and others—

Condominium and Cooperative Associations; Revising the circumstances under which community association managers or management firms must comply with a specified provision; revising the definition of the terms "milestone inspection" and "substantial structural deterioration"; authorizing local enforcement agencies to make certain determinations relating to milestone inspections after a building reaches a specified age; authorizing municipal governing bodies to adopt certain ordinances relating to association repairs; revising requirements relating to the purchase of flood insurance as a condition for maintaining certain policies issued by the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 232 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Garcia—

Exploitation of Vulnerable Persons; Specifying conditions under which a person commits exploitation of a person 65 years of age or older; providing criminal penalties for violations of the act; specifying that not knowing the age of a victim is not a defense to such crime; authorizing persons who are in imminent danger of exploitation to petition for an injunction for protection; providing time limitations for commencing prosecution for violations of the act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 248 (2R) by Senator Martin-

Public Records/Personal Identifying Information of Certain Victims; Defining the term "victim"; exempting from public records requirements the personal identifying information of certain victims held by the Division of Emergency Management for a specified timeframe; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 250 (2R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Community Affairs and Senator Martin—

Natural Emergencies; Prohibiting counties and municipalities, respectively, from prohibiting temporary shelters on residential property for a specified timeframe under certain circumstances; authorizing independent special fire control districts to file a specified report on an alternative schedule under certain circumstances; providing for retroactive application; requiring the Division of Emergency Management to post a model contract for debris removal on its website by a specified date; requiring the division to administer a revolving loan fund for certain local government projects; increasing the timeframe to exercise rights under a permit or other authorization, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 258 (2R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Burgess—

Prohibited Applications on Government-issued Devices; Requiring public employers to take certain actions relating to prohibited applications; prohibiting employees and officers of public employers from downloading or accessing prohibited applications on government-issued devices; providing exceptions; providing a deadline by which specified employees must remove, delete, or uninstall a prohibited application; requiring the Department of Management Services to compile a specified list and establish procedures for a specified waiver, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 264 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Senator Collins and others—

Interests of Foreign Countries; Prohibiting governmental entities from knowingly entering into certain contracts; authorizing the Attorney General to bring a civil action; providing penalties; requiring government entities to require an affidavit from applicants before providing any economic incentive; prohibiting foreign principals from purchasing agricultural land, or interest in such land, and certain real property in the state, respectively; authorizing foreign principals to continue to own or hold such land or property under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 404 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Perry-

Public Records/Recordings Which Depict or Record the Killing of a Minor/Autopsy Reports of Minors; Expanding an existing exemption from public records requirements for certain photographs or video or audio recordings held by an agency to include photographs and video and audio recordings held by an agency which depict or record the killing of a minor, with exceptions; providing criminal penalties; providing for retroactive application; creating the "Rex and Brody Act"; creating an exemption from public records requirements for autopsy reports of minors whose deaths were related to acts of domestic violence; providing statements of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SM 1036 (2R) by Senator Wright-

Florida National Guard; Urging Congress to impel the United States National Guard Bureau to examine the resource allocations of the Florida National Guard and allow an increase in its force structure, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Student Use of Social Media Platforms; Requiring members of the instructional staff of public schools to provide instruction on the social, emotional, and physical effects of social media to students in specified grades; requiring that district school board codes of student conduct include a prohibition against students using wireless communications devices during instructional time and authorization for teachers to withhold a student's device, with an exception for use at the direction of the teacher; requiring each school district to prohibit and prevent students from accessing social media platforms through the use of Internet access provided by the school district, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

State Park Campsite Reservations; Requiring the Division of Recreation and Parks of the Department of Environmental Protection to allow residents and nonresidents to make state park cabin and campsite reservations within specified timeframes; requiring Florida residents to provide information from their Florida driver license or identification card for certain reservations made in advance, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 244 (2R1) by Senator Calatayud and others-

K-12 Teachers; Authorizing the Office of Inspector General within the Department of Education to investigate allegations and reports of suspected violations of certain persons' rights; establishing the Dual Enrollment Educator Scholarship Program; establishing the Teacher Apprenticeship Program; providing an additional means of demonstrating mastery of subject area knowledge, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 284 (2R1) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Brodeur—

Energy; Revising the selection criteria for purchasing or leasing vehicles for state agencies, state universities, community colleges, and local governments under a state purchasing plan; specifying that, if available, a state agency must use certain fuels in vehicles with internal combustion engines; requiring the Department of Management Services, before a specified date, to make recommendations to state agencies, state universities, community colleges, and local governments relating to the procurement and integration of electric and natural gas fuel vehicles and other vehicles powered by renewable energy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 306 (2R1) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Boyd and others—

Catalytic Converters; Designating the "Catalytic Converter Antitheft Act"; prohibiting a person from knowingly purchasing a detached catalytic converter unless he or she is a registered secondary metals recycler; prohibiting a person from knowingly importing, manufacturing, purchasing for a certain purpose, selling, offering for sale, or installing or reinstalling a counterfeit, fake, or nonfunctional catalytic converter; prohibiting a secondary metals recycler from processing or removing a detached catalytic converter from the recycler's place of business for a specified number of days, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 478 (2R1) by the Appropriations Committee on Education and Senator Perry—

Early Childhood Music Education Incentive Program; Renaming the Early Childhood Music Education Incentive Pilot Program as the Early Childhood Music Education Incentive Program; revising criteria for a school district's eligibility to participate in the program; deleting an obsolete provision requiring the University of Florida's College of Education to conduct a specified evaluation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Education; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 508 (2R1) by Senator Rouson-

Problem-solving Courts; Revising the responsibilities of coordinators of treatment-based drug court programs; requiring such programs to collect specified data and information for certain purposes; requiring such programs to annually report certain information and data to the Office of the State Courts Administrator; authorizing courts to determine how long a person may be admitted into certain programs; revising admission requirements for certain programs; revising eligibility requirements for voluntary admission into certain substance abuse programs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023
