SB 1438, 1st Eng. (3R) by Senator Yarborough and others—

Protection of Children; Prohibiting a governmental entity from issuing a permit or otherwise authorizing a person to conduct a performance in violation of specified provisions; providing criminal penalties; authorizing the Division of Hotels and Restaurants of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to fine, suspend, or revoke the license of any public lodging establishment or public food service establishment if the establishment admits a child to an adult live performance; specifying that the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation is given full power and authority to revoke or suspend the license of any person issued under the Beverage Law when it is determined or found by the division upon sufficient cause appearing that he or she is maintaining a licensed premises that admits a child to an adult live performance; prohibiting a person from knowingly admitting a child to an adult live performance, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Collegiate Purple Star Campuses; Defining the term "military student"; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt rules and the Board of Governors to adopt regulations to establish the Collegiate Purple Star Campuses program; specifying program criteria for participating Florida College System institutions, state universities, and career centers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 764 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Simon—

Interference with Sporting or Entertainment Events; Prohibiting certain actions during covered sporting and entertainment events; providing criminal penalties; prohibiting profiting from violations; providing for seizure and forfeiture of specified assets, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1098 (SO) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Judiciary and Senator Burton—

Withholding or Withdrawal of Life-prolonging Procedures;

Authorizing a court to delegate the right to consent to the withholding or withdrawal of life-prolonging procedures of incapacitated persons in certain circumstances; requiring that initial and annual guardianship plans, respectively, state whether any power under the ward's preexisting order not to resuscitate or advance directive is revoked, modified, suspended, or transferred to the guardian; authorizing a guardian to petition a court for approval to consent to withhold or withdraw life-prolonging procedures under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1210 (SO) by Senator Burgess-

Public Records/Human Trafficking Victims; Expanding an existing public records exemption relating to human trafficking victims seeking expunction of certain records related to an offense listed in s. 775.084(1)(b)1., F.S.; providing for the reversion of specified provisions if the exemption is not saved from repeal; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SM 1382 (SO) by Senator Collins and others-

United States Department of Defense; Urging Congress to restore the United States Department of Defense's superior warfighting principles of recruiting, assigning, training, promoting, and retaining personnel solely based on merit and ensuring such personnel maintain and display a warrior ethos, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 7014 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Criminal Justice (Martin)—

Juvenile Justice; Requiring that the secretary of the Department of Juvenile Justice oversee the establishment of the Florida Scholars Academy; requiring the academy to provide students with greater access to secondary and postsecondary educational opportunities; specifying that the academy is a component of the delivery of public education within Florida's Early Learning-20 education system; requiring the department to provide early notice to school districts regarding the siting of new juvenile justice detention facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 774 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Ethics and Elections and Senator Brodeur—

Ethics Requirements for Public Officials; Requiring candidates for specified elective offices to file a full and public disclosure at the time of qualifying; requiring commissioners of community redevelopment agencies to complete annual ethics training; requiring specified local officers to file full and public disclosures; deleting a prohibition on including a federal income tax return or copy thereof in a financial disclosure; increasing the maximum civil penalty allowed for certain violations related to statements of financial disclosure, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 678 (SO) by Senator Powell-

Disposal of Property; Providing that the use of property as affordable housing qualifies as use for a public purpose in the context of the authorization of the Department of Transportation to convey property without consideration to a governmental entity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 154 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Regulated Industries, Senator Bradley and others—

Condominium and Cooperative Associations; Revising the circumstances under which community association managers or management firms must comply with a specified provision; revising the definition of the terms "milestone inspection" and "substantial structural deterioration"; authorizing local enforcement agencies to make certain determinations relating to milestone inspections after a building reaches a specified age; authorizing municipal governing bodies to adopt certain ordinances relating to association repairs; revising requirements relating to the purchase of flood insurance as a condition for maintaining certain policies issued by the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

CS/SB 232 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Garcia—

Exploitation of Vulnerable Persons; Specifying conditions under which a person commits exploitation of a person 65 years of age or older; providing criminal penalties for violations of the act; specifying that not knowing the age of a victim is not a defense to such crime; authorizing persons who are in imminent danger of exploitation to petition for an injunction for protection; providing time limitations for commencing prosecution for violations of the act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 258 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Burgess—

Energy; Revising the selection criteria for purchasing or leasing vehicles for state agencies, state universities, community colleges, and local governments under a state purchasing plan; specifying that, if available, a state agency must use certain fuels in vehicles with internal combustion engines; requiring the Department of Management Services, before a specified date, to make recommendations to state agencies, state universities, community colleges, and local governments relating to the procurement and integration of electric and natural gas fuel vehicles and other vehicles powered by renewable energy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Trees and Vegetation Within the Rights-of-way of Certain Roads and Rail Corridors; Providing that the prohibition against the removal, cutting, marring, defacing, or destruction of trees or other vegetation in certain rights-of-way does not apply if the Department of Transportation suspends such prohibition pursuant to a declared state of emergency; requiring the department to publish informational guidelines regarding the removal of debris from certain emergencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

CS/SB 50 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Wright—

Public Records/Judicial Assistants; Adding current judicial assistants and their spouses and children to the list of specified agency personnel and family members to whom an exemption from public records requirements for identification and location information applies; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 192 (SO) by the Committees on Environment and Natural Resources, Community Affairs, Senator Avila and others—

Everglades Protection Area; Requiring that comprehensive plans and plan amendments that apply to certain lands within or near the Everglades Protection Area follow the state coordinated review process; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection, in consultation with specified entities, to make certain determinations for such plans and amendments, to provide written determinations to the local government and specified entities within a specified timeframe, and to coordinate with the local government and specified entities on certain planning strategies and mitigation measures; authorizing sitespecific text changes for small-scale future land use map amendments; requiring local governments whose boundaries include any portion of the Everglades Protection Area to transmit copies of adopted smallscale development amendments to the state land planning agency within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Public Records/Recordings Which Depict or Record the Killing of a Minor/Autopsy Reports of Minors; Expanding an existing exemption from public records requirements for certain photographs or video or audio recordings held by an agency to include photographs and video and audio recordings held by an agency which depict or record the killing of a minor, with exceptions; providing criminal penalties; providing for retroactive application; creating the "Rex and Brody Act"; creating an exemption from public records requirements for autopsy reports of minors whose deaths were related to acts of domestic violence; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing statements of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Violent Offenses Committed Against Criminal Defense Attorneys; Providing for the reclassification of specified offenses committed against criminal defense attorneys, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1396 (SO) by Senator Garcia-

Department of Elderly Affairs; Revising the list of individuals who may not be appointed as ombudsmen under the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program; deleting an exemption from level 2 background screening requirements for certain individuals; requiring the office to notify complainants within a specified timeframe after determining that a complaint against a professional guardian is not legally sufficient; requiring the office to provide a certain written statement to the complainant and the professional guardian within a specified timeframe after completing an investigation; requiring clerks of the court to report to the office within a specified timeframe after the court imposes any sanctions on a professional guardian, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023
