## BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

### SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR THURSDAY, APRIL 27, 2023

#### **CS/CS/SB 272 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Garcia and others—**

**Children and Young Adults in Out-of-home Care;** Citing this act as the "Nancy C. Detert Champion for Children Act"; requiring a case manager or other staff to provide a child with verbal and written information about certain topics; deleting limitations on the type of questions a child may ask; establishing the Office of the Children's Ombudsman within the Department of Children and Families; requiring the department to consult with specified children and young adults when creating or revising certain print or digital written information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

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#### **CS/SB 612 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Yarborough and others—**

**Blood Clot and Pulmonary Embolism Policy Workgroup;** Citing this act as the "Emily Adkins Prevention Act"; requiring the Secretary of Health Care Administration, in conjunction with the State Surgeon General, to establish a blood clot and pulmonary embolism policy workgroup; requiring the secretary to submit a final report to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

#### **SB 542 (SO) by Senator Boyd and others—**

**Emergency Opioid Antagonists;** Requiring each Florida College System institution and state university to have a supply of emergency opioid antagonists in certain residence halls or dormitory residences for use by campus law enforcement; providing requirements for the placement and accessibility of emergency opioid antagonists; providing specified campus law enforcement and Florida College System institutions and state universities immunity from liability for the administration or attempted administration of emergency opioid antagonists under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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#### **CS/CS/SB 364 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Avila—**

**Bereavement Benefits for State Employees;** Citing this act as the "Respecting Their Sacrifice Act"; authorizing the head of a law enforcement agency to grant specified employees a certain number of hours of administrative leave for a specified purpose; authorizing the head of a law enforcement agency to deny such administrative leave under certain circumstances; authorizing travel expenses for certain members of a law enforcement agency for a specified purpose; increasing the amount to be paid toward the funeral and burial expenses of certain officers killed in the line of duty, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 535(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/SB 356 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Boyd—**

**Practice of Dentistry;** Requiring individuals and entities that provide dental services through telehealth to provide each patient with specified information regarding the dentists treating such patient; requiring that there be a dentist of record for each patient treated through telehealth; requiring that advertisements of specified dental services provided through telehealth contain a specified disclaimer; specifying that only certain dental practitioners may perform specified functions of dentistry, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/SB 252 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Burton—**

**Protection from Discrimination Based on Health Care Choices;** Prohibiting business entities and governmental entities from requiring a person to provide certain documentation or requiring a COVID-19 test to gain access to, entry upon, or service from such entities or as a condition of contracting, hiring, promotion, or continued employment; prohibiting business and governmental entities from refusing to hire persons, discharging persons, depriving or attempting to deprive persons of employment opportunities, adversely affecting persons with respect to employment, or otherwise discriminating against any person based on knowledge or belief of a person's vaccination or COVID-19 postinfection recovery status or failure to take a COVID-19 test; requiring such entities to provide exemptions and reasonable accommodations for religious and medical reasons, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect June 1, 2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 238 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Health Policy and Senator Burton—**

**Public Records/Protection from Discrimination Based on Health Care Choices;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain information held by the Department of Legal Affairs or the Department of Health relating to complaints or investigations regarding violations of provisions protecting from discrimination based on health care choices; authorizing the disclosure of such information under certain circumstances; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 252 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/SB 278 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator Rodriguez—**

**State Estate Tax;** Providing that provisions relating to a condition for the discharge of a personal representative of an estate do not apply under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/HB 619(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

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**SB 596 (SO) by Senator Martin—**

**Board of Governors of the State University System;** Granting the Office of the Inspector General of the Board of Governors additional authority to take certain actions in carrying out its duties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/CS/SB 618 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Yarborough—**

**Rights of Law Enforcement Officers and Correctional Officers;** Providing rights of law enforcement officers and correctional officers relating to Brady identification systems; prohibiting a law enforcement officer or correctional officer from being discharged, suspended, demoted, or otherwise disciplined or threatened with discipline for certain reasons; providing that a prosecuting agency is not required to maintain a Brady identification system; authorizing a law enforcement officer or correctional officer to request reconsideration of the inclusion of his or her name and information in a Brady identification system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/HB 95(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/CS/CS/SB 1690 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Ingolia—**

**Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking;** Requiring residential treatment centers for children and adolescents to place specified signage; requiring the Department of Children and Families, in consultation with the Agency for Health Care Administration, to adopt rules; requiring the department to develop a process to certify adult safe houses that provide housing and care to adult survivors of human trafficking; providing requirements for safe houses and safe foster homes; requiring specified signage to be placed on the premises of facilities maintained by licensed child-caring agencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 1322 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Grall—**

**Adoption;** Specifying that certain adoption consents are valid, binding, and enforceable by the court; deleting a provision regarding the sufficiency of the home study provided by the adoption entity; requiring the court to order the transfer of custody of the child to the prospective adoptive parents under certain circumstances and in accordance with a certain transition plan; requiring the adoption entity to provide monthly supervision reports for a specified time; providing that a person contemplating adoption of a child may make specified payments to the mother of the child for a specified period of time regardless of whether the medical needs of the mother require such support, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 1580 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Trumbull—**

**Protections of Medical Conscience;** Providing that health care providers and health care payors have the right to opt out of participation in or payment for certain health care services on the basis of conscience-based objections; providing requirements for a health care provider's notice and documentation of such objection; providing whistle-blower protections for health care providers and health care payors that take certain actions or disclose certain information relating to the reporting of certain violations; prohibiting boards, or the Department of Health if there is no board, from taking disciplinary action against or denying a license to an individual based solely on specified conduct, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 714 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator DiCeglie—**

**Vacation Rentals;** Requiring advertising platforms to collect and remit specified taxes for certain vacation rental transactions; defining the term "advertising platform"; revising the regulated activities of public lodging establishments and public food service establishments preempted to the state to include licensing; requiring advertising platforms to require that persons placing advertisements for vacation rentals include certain information in the advertisements and attest to certain information; authorizing the division to revoke, refuse to issue or renew, or suspend vacation rental licenses under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 266 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Education, the Committee on Education Postsecondary and Senator Grall—**

**Higher Education;** Revising the duties of the Board of Governors relating to the mission of each state university; requiring the Board of Governors Accountability Plan to annually report certain research expenditures of a specified amount; prohibiting specified educational institutions from expending funds for certain purposes; revising how general education core courses are established; specifying a one-time limit on the requirement to change accrediting agencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 112 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Step-therapy Protocols;** Defining the term "serious mental illness"; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to approve drug products for Medicaid recipients for the treatment of serious mental illness without step-therapy prior authorization under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

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## **SB 140 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez—**

**Fees/Professional Counselors Licensure Compact;** Authorizing member states of the Professional Counselors Licensure Compact to charge individuals a fee for the privilege to practice under the compact, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to **CS/HB 385(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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## **CS/SB 444 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Ingoglia—**

**Residency of Local Elected Officials;** Prohibiting the consideration of the residential addresses of certain persons during the district-drawing process for boards of county commissioners; requiring municipalities to fix the boundaries of their districts in a certain manner; specifying that district changes may be made only in odd-numbered years; providing that an elected candidate for district school board must reside in the district school board member residence area by the date she or he assumes office instead of upon qualifying for office, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Compare to **HB 411(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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## **CS/SB 454 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Avila—**

**Physician Assistant Licensure;** Revising requirements for an applicant for licensure as a physician assistant, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Committee on Education Postsecondary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/HB 1133(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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## **SB 546 (SO) by Senator Avila and others—**

**Restoration of Osborne Reef;** Requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to submit a status report on the Osborne Reef cleanup and tire removal project to the Legislature by a specified date; requiring the department to develop a restoration plan for the reef by a specified date; providing requirements for the restoration plan; requiring the department to submit a report to the Legislature upon completion of the plan; providing requirements for the report, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

*Identical to **HB 641(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

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## **CS/CS/SB 1718 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Rules and Senator Ingoglia—**

**Immigration;** Prohibiting counties and municipalities, respectively, from providing funds to any person, entity, or organization to issue identification documents to an individual who does not provide proof of lawful presence in the United States; specifying that certain driver licenses and permits issued by other states exclusively to unauthorized immigrants are not valid in this state; requiring certain hospitals to collect patient immigration status data information on admission or registration forms; requiring the Department of Economic Opportunity to enter a certain order and require repayment of certain economic development incentives if the department finds or is notified that an employer has knowingly employed an unauthorized alien without verifying the employment eligibility of such person, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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## **SB 562 (SO) by Senator Gruters—**

**Notices of Commencement;** Requiring the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to furnish for distribution a uniform notice of commencement; requiring owners and authorized agents of owners to use such uniform notice, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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## **CS/CS/SB 1146 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Yarborough—**

**Shared Parental Responsibility After the Establishment of Paternity;** Authorizing a parent to request certain determinations and the creation of a parenting plan and time-sharing schedule; requiring that the determination of parental responsibility and child support and the creation of a parenting plan and a time-sharing schedule be established through a certain action; specifying that the mother of a child born out of wedlock and a father who has established paternity of such child are the natural guardians of the child and are entitled and subject to the rights and responsibilities of being parents if certain conditions are met, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 775(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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## **SB 348 (SO) by Senator Hooper and others—**

**9/11 Heroes Day;** Requiring the Governor to proclaim September 11 of each year as "9/11 Heroes Day"; requiring that the day be observed in public schools and by public exercise; requiring certain middle and high school students to receive specified instruction; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt certain revised social studies standards, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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## **SB 1388 (SO) by Senator Wright—**

**Immunity of Motor Vehicle Dealer Leasing and Rental Affiliates;** Defining the term “control”; defining the term “motor vehicle dealer’s leasing or rental affiliate” to specify the entities that are immune from causes of action and that are not liable for harm to persons and property under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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## **CS/CS/SB 346 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Community Affairs and Senator DiCeglie—**

**Public Construction;** Requiring that certain contracts provide the estimated cost to complete each item on a specified list; revising the timeframe within which proceedings must commence to resolve disputes between vendors and local governmental entities; requiring that undisputed portions of payment requests be paid within a specified timeframe; revising the conditions that require a public entity to pay or release amounts subject to certain disputes or claims, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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## **CS/SB 536 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Garcia—**

**Child Support;** Revising requirements for the deferment of payment agreements for child support; revising the procedures for collection and distribution of court depository fees; removing exceptions to the prohibition on treating incarceration as voluntary employment; revising requirements for the Department of Revenue to commence proceedings regarding paternity and child support, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **HB 1087(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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## **CS/CS/SB 136 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Commerce and Tourism, Senator Gruters and others—**
