The Senate is proposing 3 additional issues:

- 1. Extension of Estate Tax Filing Requirements
- 2. Beverage and Tobacco Wholesaler Reports
- 3. Dynamic Scoring Process

Estate Tax Filing Requirements

<u>Present situation:</u> Florida imposes an estate tax. Due to its interaction with federal law, Florida's estate tax has equaled \$0 for all estates of decedents who have died since 2004. In order to prevent estates from having to file returns when \$0 in tax is owed, Florida law was amended to not require a return on these estates through December 31, 2010. (This date was chosen because the federal law that is causing Florida's estate tax to equal \$0 would have either been fully repealed or return to its prior form as of December 31, 2010).

However, the federal law that causes Florida's estate tax to equal \$0 has been extended until December 31, 2012. In order to keep from requiring Florida estates to file a return when the tax is \$0, Florida law needs to be amended.

<u>Proposed change</u>: Extend the provision of the estate tax law that relieves Florida estates of the responsibility of filing a return for persons dying before 2012.

Section #. Effective upon this act becoming a law, and applicable retroactive to January 1, 2011, subsection (4) of section 198.13, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

198.13 Tax return to be made in certain cases; certificate of nonliability.—

- (4) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section and applicable to the estate of a decedent who dies after December 31, 2004, if, upon the death of the decedent, a state death tax credit or a generation-skipping transfer credit is not allowable pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended:
- (a) The personal representative of the estate is not required to file a return under subsection (1) in connection with the estate.
- (b) The person who would otherwise be required to file a return reporting a generation-skipping transfer under subsection(3) is not required to file such a return in connection with the estate.

The provisions of this subsection do not apply to estates of decedents dying after December 31, $2012 \frac{2010}{2010}$.

Beverage and Tobacco Wholesaler Reports

<u>Present situation</u>: The Department of Revenue has recognized that there are recurring tax law compliance problems in retail businesses with substantial alcohol and tobacco sales. The department periodically requests third-party information from wholesalers that sell these products to retail businesses in an effort to improve compliance, and some wholesalers and distributors provide the information voluntarily. Others, however, require the department to resort to expensive and cumbersome legal processes to obtain the information.

<u>Proposed change</u>: The bill creates s. 212.131, F.S., which requires alcohol and tobacco wholesalers to provide annual sales information to the department upon request. The report is due each July 1 for the preceding July 1 through June 30 period and is delinquent if not received by the department by September 30. The information report must be filed electronically through the department's specified data file format to ensure that the information is kept confidential. The electronic filing requirement may be waived if the seller demonstrates it causes problems for the seller, and any seller who fails to provide the information report timely is subject to a penalty of \$1,000 for every month the report is not provided, up to a maximum amount of \$10,000.

Section #. Section 212.131, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- <u>212.131 Information reports required for sales of alcoholic</u> beverages and tobacco products.—
- (1) (a) For the purpose of enforcing the collection of the tax levied by this chapter, the department may require every seller of alcoholic beverages or tobacco products to file an information report of any sales of those products to any retailer in this state.
 - (b) As used in this section, the term:
- 1. "Seller" means any manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor of alcoholic beverages or tobacco products.
- 2. "Retailer" means a person required to hold a license pursuant to chapter 561 or a permit pursuant to chapter 569.
- (2) (a) The information report must be filed electronically through the department's specified data file format to ensure that the information is kept confidential. The information report must contain the seller's name and the following information regarding sales to the retailers: the names, addresses, and resale certificate numbers; the dates the products were sold; the quantity of each type of product sold; and the sales price of each type of

product sold.

- (b) The department may waive the requirement to submit the information report through an electronic data interchange due to problems arising from the seller's computer capabilities, data system changes, or operating procedures. The request for waiver must be in writing and the seller must demonstrate that such circumstances exist. A waiver under this paragraph does not operate to relieve the seller from the obligation to file an information report.
- (3) The information report must contain the required information for the period from July 1 through June 30. The information report is due annually on July 1 for the preceding reporting period and is delinquent if not received by the department by September 30.
 - (4) Any seller who fails to provide the information report when due is subject to a penalty of \$1,000 for every month, or part thereof, the report is not provided, up to a maximum amount of \$10,000.

Dynamic Scoring Process

<u>Present situation:</u> Section 216.138, F.S., provides that "the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives may request special impact sessions of consensus estimating conferences to evaluate proposed legislation based on tools and models not generally employed by the conferences." The requests for special impact sessions will likely address every area of state operations and the staffing of the special impact conferences must be flexible enough to address the breadth of issues facing the state economy.

<u>Proposed change</u>: Amend s. 216.138, F.S., to provide for the creation of special impact estimating conferences, which would require the appointment of 4 principals each time a special impact session is requested. These principals—one each from EOG, EDR, Senate professional staff, and House of Representatives professional staff—would be appointed on the basis of their appropriate fiscal expertise in the subject matter of the proposal to be evaluated.

Section #. Section 216.138, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

216.138 Authority to request additional analysis of legislative proposals legislation.—

- (1) The President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives may request special impact sessions of consensus estimating conferences to evaluate legislative proposals proposed legislation based on tools and models not generally employed by the conferences, including cost-benefit, return-on-investment, or dynamic scoring techniques, when suitable and appropriate for the legislative proposal legislation being evaluated.
- (2) (a) Unless exempt from s. 119.07(1), information used to develop the analyses shall be available to the public.
- (b) All meetings of the special impact estimating conference shall be open to the public.

The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, jointly, shall be the sole judge for the interpretation, implementation, and enforcement of this subsection.

(3) The special impact estimating conference shall consist of four principals: one person from the Executive Office of the Governor; the coordinator of the Office of Economic and Demographic Research, or his or her designee; one person from the professional staff of the Senate; and one person from the professional staff of

the House of Representatives. Each principal must have appropriate fiscal expertise in the subject matter of the legislative proposal.

A separate special impact estimating conference may be appointed for each proposal.

- (4) After the designation of the four principals, the special impact estimating conference shall convene to adopt official information relating to the proposal.
- (a) A principal may invite any person to participate in the special impact estimating conference. Such person shall be designated as a participant. A participant shall, at the request of any principal before or during any meeting of the conference, collect and supply data, perform analyses, or provide other information needed by the conference.
- (b) The principal from the Office of Economic and Demographic Research may convene any of the conferences established in s.

 216.136 to adopt supplemental information required for the analysis of the legislative proposal.
- (c) All official information of the special impact estimating conference must be adopted by consensus of all of the principals of the conference. For the purposes of this subsection, the terms "official information" and "consensus" have the same meanings as defined in s. 216.133.
