14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funding will be spent on the construction of Phase 1, Segment 1D for the Laudertrail project. Specifically, funding will be used to extend an existing greenway and connect it to Holiday Park.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Return funding to the state.

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Post Design services and Construction activities will be provided to install the sidewalk, green infrastructure such as absorbent greenways, ADA ramps and pavement markings will be provided with the appropriations of these funds.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Trail User services include a continuous connection across districts from Fort Lauderdale's 93 acre Holiday Park to George English Park. The proposed trail segment will serve segments of the neighborhood that do not currently provide infrastructure that is within ADA compliance which poses as a danger to pedestrians. The trail segment also intends to coordinate with Florida Department of Transportation on signalization upgrades, in order to provide safe crossings for trail users along Sunrise Blvd.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The LauderTrail Project is a city-wide trail system that will be implemented in stages, as funding becomes available. This project intends to be of service to all 186,598 of its citizens. It spans across 42 miles of trail greenways, side paths, green alleys, neighborhood greenways, cycle tracks and woonerf.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased usage of the greenway by cyclists along the FEC corridor; joggers will use the loop in Holiday Park for their morning exercise; and other residential, visitor, and business uses to spur healthy living and economic growth.
