4. Project/Program Description

Established in 1934, PK Yonge Developmental Research School is a separate public school district, affiliated with UF, & located on the UF campus. This project is Phase III of a 2007 Master Plan to replace 13 buildings on the campus that date back to 1957, the need as confirmed by the State Board of Education Educational Plant Surveys. A public school of choice, PK Yonge serves 1165 K-12 students, randomly selected to reflect Florida demographics ethnically, academically, and socioeconomically. Health, safety, and security issues in the current gym include: 1) severe flooring issues; 2) doors that do not close/lock properly, i.e., too many access points; 3) lack of heat/working HVAC systems; 4) inadequate electrical/lighting systems; 5) outdated plumbing/showers/locker rooms; 6) water intrusion. Phase III—a new 31,000 GSF Gymnasium and Fitness Center: 1) gymnasium; 2) PE classroom/flex space; 3) locker rooms; 4) multi-purpose room; 5) weight room; 6) workout room; 7) concessions and support space.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To address crucial physical deficiencies in 65-year old Gym to support daily athletics/physical education for 800 secondary students/365 elementary students; with growing health and fitness concerns for our nation's youth (increasing rates of Type-2 Diabetes, obesity, heart disease, and cancer) to enhance K-12 education role in supporting & sustaining the overall health/wellness of our state. The project will create avenues for research dedicated to improving adolescent health & fitness & establishing habits for lifetime fitness/health/well being. The future-focused Gym/Fitness Center will spark innovation with UF researchers, PE teachers, IT professionals, and health/fitness industry experts from across the country.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

PK Yonge's architecture has always been significant to its influence on K-12 education in the state and across the country, most recently evidenced with the construction of the new K-5 building in 2019 and the recently completed 6-12 building in 2021. The design, construction, and program planning for the new Gymnasium/Fitness Center provide reason and opportunity to bring together researchers, physical education teachers, athletic coaches, fitness, technology, AI experts, students, families committed to tackling our nation's pressing need to improve health, reduce obesity, and combat the rising diabetes epidemic, thus providing a new "blueprint" for our nation's schools.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

PK Yonge's collaboration with UF in designing/testing a youth-focused approach to teaching stress reduction/self management strategies, increasing physical activity for all students, and nurturing healthy eating habits for life that reduces adult stressors and boosts life and work satisfaction, productivity, and prosperity. Incorporating Artificial Intelligence at the forefront will both transform and inform a personalized approach to health and fitness.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Directly - PK Yonge serves 365 elementary/800 secondary students;
Indirectly - As a research and demonstration school with ties to K-12 systems across Florida and the country, an unlimited number of students in other K-12 locations could benefit from the creation of a new "Blueprint" for school athletic facilities construction and state-of-the-art health and fitness strategies.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

PK Yonge provides a functional laboratory for conducting research studies in the areas of educational management, teaching and learning. The intent of this project is to address infrastructure deficiencies as identified in PK Yonge's 2007 Master Plan, confirmed in SBE Educational Plant Surveys (2015 and 2020), and to provide 21st century technology-based learning environments including classrooms, athletic facilities, support facilities and recreational fields. Follow-up assessment by DOE in the Education Plant Survey (EPS) process; measurement of student outcomes.
