4. Project/Program Description

Upgrade facilities through design and construction to bolster infrastructure and provide adequate facilities contained in a Memorandum of Understanding with FDEM designating Volusia as the alternate location of the State of Florida's EOC should a disaster require re-location of FDEM services from Tallahassee to Volusia. An All-hazards Fire Station (\$19.5M) doubling as a safe room for workforce personnel which adds to best response efforts, thus adding to continuity of operations. A multi-purpose room at the EOC (\$4.9M) will add capacity for those responding to a natural disaster.

The Fire Station will provide hardened infrastructure for safe room shelters under FEMA 361 standards. The multipurpose room allows for adequate rest areas for deployed responders to a declared emergency.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The general citizenry would not benefit at this time. The project assists those who provide emergency services during a disaster.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

First responders and those activated due to a natural disaster. Depending on the disaster, the EOC/Fire Station would house approximately 300 personnel.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Lack of space to provide adequate work rest cycles is proven to create fatigue and foster decision making errors. OSHA, NFPA and IAFF have published studies depicting a strong physical and mental environment provides for an efficient response to a disaster.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Volusia County is in good standing with the State of Florida and federal government as it receives funds from both entities. Clawback of unspent funds as well as any and all protocols the state currently has in place to ensure good stewardship of funds received.
