c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This program ensures that youths aged 6 -17 who are in a serious mental health crisis receive intensive psychiatric intervention to ensure their health and the health of others and can rapidly return to their homes and their schools while also being linked to vital outpatient programs within the Apalachee system of care to ensure their continued success in all aspects of life.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Youths aged 6 - 17 who are in a serious mental health crisis. 167 additional children and youths annually (25% increase over current annual admissions).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Patients served will improve physical, psychiatric, and behavioral health relative to the results of initial psychiatric, psychological, and psychosocial evaluations performed at admission.

Patients will be closely followed by the BEACH clinical team through admission and receive psychiatric, medication, psychological, counseling, social service and psychoeducational interventions as indicated by evaluation and directed by initial treatment plan.
