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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds will be used for the initial planning of construction for the approximately 163,867 gross square foot (GSF) of new space for the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building C. It will also provide renovation funds for the non-assignable spaces for the tie-in areas between the existing and new construction, and allow for upgrading and replacing signage and wayfinding (currently done on paper). To accommodate the growth of the college, completing of the originally conceived three-building complex is necessary and urgent.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

University officials will use funds for the purpose of contracting out the planning associated with carrying out the construction of additional space for Building C of the joint FAMU-FSU College of Engineering.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The joint college's primary goal is to provide a challenging and educational experience for our students that will enable them to become effective engineering professionals in a society where demand for engineers is ever-present. However, the college's facilities are not equipped to provide the students with the space they need to conduct research, learn, or even study. These funds will be used to better support engineering students.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is university students at FSU and FAMU, which is more than 800 students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will improve quality of education. It will serve 6 critical engineering disciplines that are all of strategic importance within the STEM field. Engineering is critical for startup, job creation, and the health of the State economy. This investment will pay off by allowing high-quality entrepreneurial students to positively impact the economy. According to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, engineering jobs are projected to grow 10.9% from 2017 to 2025, with even larger growth projected in the key fields of study offered at the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering, including a 14.6% increase in environmental, 15.2% in civil, and 23.7% in biomedical.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Revert state appropriation and withhold future funding for this initiative.
