### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Provide clear visibility to monitor and deter illegal activity on two campuses including Ruth Eckerd Hall, the Bilheimer Capitol Theater, and the Marcia P. Hoffman School of the Arts, ensuring rapid response and real-time information to law enforcement and fire departments, including mobile alerts and status updates. Provide video records for law enforcement investigations.

Ensure unimpeded radio communication for emergency personnel at 700, 800 MHz public safety frequencies with 100% coverage in compliance with fire code NFPA 1225 2022.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project is being overseen by a security director with over 20 years in law enforcement in cooperation with local police and fire departments. Ruth Eckerd Hall employs its own on-site security at the campuses, who are trained to monitor systems, activate emergency plans, and support first responders appropriately. Clearwater's Community Connect initiative provides the technology to link a private surveillance system to the Clearwater Police Department in emergencies.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Visitors and users of the facilities will have added assurance that measures are in place to monitor suspicious activity, deter attacks, and in the case of threat, building security and first responders have the tools needed to respond quickly and efficiently. In addition, video records are available for law enforcement investigations.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The activities for mass gatherings include performances, classes, recitals, graduations, school field trips, banquets, trade shows, seminars and other special events. REH projects over 250,000 individuals annually will directly benefit from the safety measures this investment will provide including patrons, students, artists, volunteers, employees, and first responders.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The objective is to mitigate risk of injury and property damage so incident rates would be tracked similar to the ability to quantify the weapons stopped at the door by other safety measures. Any emergency situation would be reviewed post-incident to assess the role and impact of these enhancements and the resulting favorable outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Unspent funds would be returned to the State.
