14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The goal of the project is to intercept, treat, and then reuse nutrient rich stormwater run off before it gets to Lake Apopka. The filtered and treated storm-water will be used for irrigation purposes which reduces the Town's reliance on high quality potable water. This will assist us in meeting the goals set forth by the Central Florida Water Initiative, and further compliment the efforts to improve the water quality of Lake Apopka.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project will intercept and treat nutrient rich stormwater before it gets to Lake Apopka. Initially, the treated water will be sent through transmission lines to 3 residential developments with the existing infrastructure to be used solely for irrigation purposes. The alternative water treatment plant is designed in such a way that with expansion, other neighborhoods can be relatively easily connected.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

There are 3 residential developments and a multi-family development that have dual water systems that are currently served by potable water. Once the alternative water facility is constructed, and the transmission lines are in place, the irrigation side of the dual water system can be easily converted by making a single connection. Thereby using the alternative water rather than the potable water. This will help the Town conserve the precious potable water and meet the future needs of the entire Town within the current consumptive use permit.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Initially, the project will serve 3 developments with at least 650 single family dwelling units with the capacity to serve at least 1 more development with 150 units. It will also be able to serve the irrigation needs of a 342 unit multifamily development. Overall it will serve the entire Town with a population of nearly 5,400 residents by conserving potable water for the needs of the entire Town.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefit of the project will be supplanting potable water for irrigation with a lower quality alternative water supply. It will be tracked by the number of gallons of stormwater that is processed and then distributed for irrigation. This project will also in a small part contribute to the reduction of nutrient loading of Lake Apopka including nitrogen and phosphorus levels.
