The Chabad of Kendall/Pinecrest offers religious services and outreach, schooling, community services and operates the Friendship Circle- a program which provides one-of-a-kind, inclusive social programs for children and adults with special needs. Our fortification and expansion will ensure the Jewish community has a safe place to observe religious beliefs. Synagogues have been under random attack in Miami. We will also grow the number of individuals with disabilities served from 450 to 2,000.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our temple will be made safer with professional security enhancements through upgraded fencing, higher walls, shatter resistant doors, alarms and cameras with an upgraded security booth. The entrance will face the interior of the complex so there is no egress or ingress from main roads.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

There will be no outside visibility to the public so all activities will only be seen from the inside corridor area. This will allow our children safer areas to play in, and congregants safer areas to pray in, without public visibility or access without security.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Jewish community at large and those with children who have disabilities. We expect to serve almost 2000 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased safety and security for the Jewish community participating in worship and social gatherings who are the targets of recent anti-semitic acts. This will also protect children and adults with special needs who are often targeted by bullying and other harmful behavior. We will measure that by recording the number of incidents or threats against the Chabad, and, also separately, Jewish people living in South Miami, Dade, one year after completion of the new campus
