14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of this project is to restore 45 acres of lost seagrass meadows into the IRL south of the Fort Pierce Inlet. The benefits of seagrass meadows include providing critically important functions for fisheries production, reducing harmful algae blooms (HABs), sediment stabilization, absorbing nutrients, providing a food source for manatees, and building coastal resilience.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project funds will be used to permit and implement a seagrass restoration project. The benefits of the project will be communicated through public outreach campaigns. Seagrass for the project will be grown, planted, and protected in an area that has sufficient water quality and clarity to promote seagrass growth within the South IRL. Herbivore exclusion cages will be placed over newly planted grasses to allow their roots to become established before grazing can occur. Once the grasses are established, they will provide a food source for manatees in the south IRL.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Seagrass meadows are critical for improving water quality and clarity. They stabilize sediments in the water body and filter nutrients from stormwater and wastewater runoff. By doing so, healthy seagrass beds reduce the frequency and intensity of HABs. Better water quality in the South IRL will increase recreational opportunities which, in turn, will stimulate the local economy. Citizens will benefit directly and indirectly from the ecosystem services provided by enhanced seagrass meadows in the South IRL.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will enhance the quality of the lagoon, which will benefit all of Florida's residents and an estimated 7.4 million tourists who visit Florida each year. The lagoon adds an estimated annual boost of \$7.6 billion to Florida's economy. According to an economic valuation report by the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council, every dollar spent on improving the health of the lagoon yields a return of \$33 back to Florida's economy.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is to permanently restore seagrass meadows in the South IRL by utilizing scientifically validated techniques. Monthly maintenance and a three year monitoring program will take place to measure the success and outputs of this project. Regular progress reports will be submitted to the FDEP and the legislature for regular updates on seagrass expansion.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If deliverables are not achieved, then funds should be withheld for nonperformance.
