There are 5 stake holders that will be served by this project with the Town of Juno Beach taking the lead in the replacement process for the infrastructure. The 5 stake holders are: Florida Power & Light (60%), Ocean Trace Residential (19.5%), The Waterford Assisted Living Facility (14.3%), Town of Juno Beach (5.2%) AND DSS Jupiter LLC (1%). The total cost of the project will be divided among the stake holders as indicated.

### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The project involves the installation of a new drainage system for flood control along Universe Blvd. The new drainage system will consist of the installation of approximately 2,000 linear feet of HDPE pipe and the associated catch basins and manholes. The project will mitigate the damage from flooding due to heavy rain and sea level rise. If the project is not completed, the roadway and other underground infrastructure will remain at risk for damage and disruption of critical services. If the structure is not replaced, there is a possibility that the failure of the stormwater system will result in damage to the main potable water line that feeds a residential community, an assisted living facility and the headquarters of Florida Power & Light.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

The replacement of the stormwater infrastructure will ensure flood mitigation and protecting the potable water main that provides water to this section of town. This will also improve the water quality that discharges into the Intracoastal Waterway and protect the adjacent residential homeowners and businesses from flooding and sea level rise.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

Flood protection

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

There are 5 stake holders that will be served by this project. Approximately 2,000 people work at the headquarters of Florida Power & Light, 256 residential units with approximately 500 residents in Ocean Trace and 492 residents currently living in an assisted living facility with an additional 146 beds that will be added for a total of 638 residents.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The outcome is a new stormwater system replacing an almost 50 year old system and protecting the homes and business in this area from flooding and any possible compromise to the water main.

Funding will be withheld if project deliverables are not met.
