CEPD will develop a comprehensive resilience strategy and propose,

develop and assess projects to protect Captiva's property values, tourism industry, and regionally important critical infrastructure



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The overall goal of this project will be to develop comprehensive resilience strategies and projects to address flood risk to Captiva's \$1.5 billion in property values, its thriving local tourism industry, and its regionally important critical infrastructure. Adaptation measures and projects will be identified and assessed for suitability and feasibility based on environmental conditions, level of community support, and the benefits delivered relative to cost

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

CEPD will partner with consulting firms, stakeholders, and the public to plan for adaptation to flood risks. This process will include identifying and developing adaptation measures along with the associated engineering and design work as applicable.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The resulting strategies, engineering, and projects from this effort will bolster the community's resilience to flooding from impacts like storm surge and sea level rise while protecting important local infrastructure and economic drivers like business and tourism.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will benefit Captiva residents, businesses, and over 180,000 yearly visitors. More than 180,000 individuals are expected to gain benefits from this project on a yearly basis.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will provide many benefits. Strategies using green infrastructure can preserve environmental quality as measured through pre- and post-monitoring. Adaptation strategies can reduce risk of public harm to residents, business owners, and visitors and preserve the use of local and county transportation and evacuation routes. These can be measured by modeling flood reduction benefits. This project will safeguard economic activity and business profits by protecting infrastructure and tourism from coastal flooding risks. This can be measured through pre and post-monitoring of local tourism and business statistics. Overall project success will be measured through the adoption of community-supported adaptation measures.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

CEPD will negotiate a time extension in order to provide deliverables or the return of funds.
