The HEROlaunch Veterans Business Accelerator at the Let Us Do Good Village in Pasco County will enable veteranowned businesses (and immediate survivors of veterans) to accelerate the growth of their company from startup to stage 2 by connecting with area industry experts, a strong mentor support network, a robust curriculum, and funding sources including venture capital and angel investors through a 3-month cohort-style accelerator program. The accelerator will be housed inside the business center of the Let Us Do Good Village (a first-in-the-nation project by Tunnel To Towers that houses our nation's Gold Star Families).

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Provide opportunity for service members, veterans, and immediate and surviving family of veterans to create economic growth and additional jobs in their communities by bringing their companies from startup phase to growth phase in an expedited manner.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Accelerator program including mentorship, coaching, structured education, connections with industry experts, venture and angel investors, and additional veteran entrepreneur support organizations. Additional opportunities will be available for local veterans and subject matter experts to serve as volunteers, mentors, and subject matter experts.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Additional jobs and opportunity in the community, will create more upward socioeconomic mobility, as well as reducing the required transit time to seek employment outside of the area. The facility will also be open for coworking, workspace, and guidance to the general public who are interested in starting a business through our existing SMARTstart programming.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Service members, veterans, living and surviving immediate family members of veterans. The number of Veteran owned businesses registered in FAVOB (The Florida Association of Veteran Owned Businesses) in our five-county region (Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Hernando, Hillsborough) is currently 109. Initially we seek to serve those in stage 1 that are seeking to accelerate their growth. We will initially seek to support 12 businesses through our cohort approach in our pilot year.

The three main outcomes are new jobs, business investment raised, company revenue growth
