14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This funding request will ensure that nearly 70,000 students enrolled in agricultural education in Florida will benefit from programming that will provide opportunities for premier leadership, personal growth, and workforce training through their intracurricular involvement with FFA. FFA program delivery will be enhanced to complement the STEM-Based learning that takes place in Florida's agriculture classrooms. Enhancements will be made to the FFA Leadership Training Facility.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to provide premier leadership, personal growth, and STEM-based career training opportunities to nearly 70,000 students enrolled in agricultural education throughout Florida.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will be provided with opportunities for leadership development and STEM-based career exploration within the agricultural industry. Activities will include leadership seminars and industry related competitive events that allow for the application of classroom instruction. Students will be provided opportunities for leadership and career training at the FFA Leadership Training Center.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project include grade school students, high school students, university/college students. All students (~70,000) enrolled in agricultural education in Florida public middle/high schools.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The delivery of premier leadership, personal growth, and STEM-based career success opportunities through agricultural education will increase from 26,000 to more than 70,000 students. Every student enrolled in agricultural education in Florida will benefit from the complete agricultural education experience, which includes: STEM-based Classroom Instruction, Leadership Experiences and participation in a Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE). FFA student affiliation at the local, state, and national level will increase from 26,000 to over 70,000 in accordance with public law as measured by the Quality FFA Chapter Report.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

All funds would be used in accordance with agreed upon contracts. Failure to do so would result in forfeiture of future funding.
