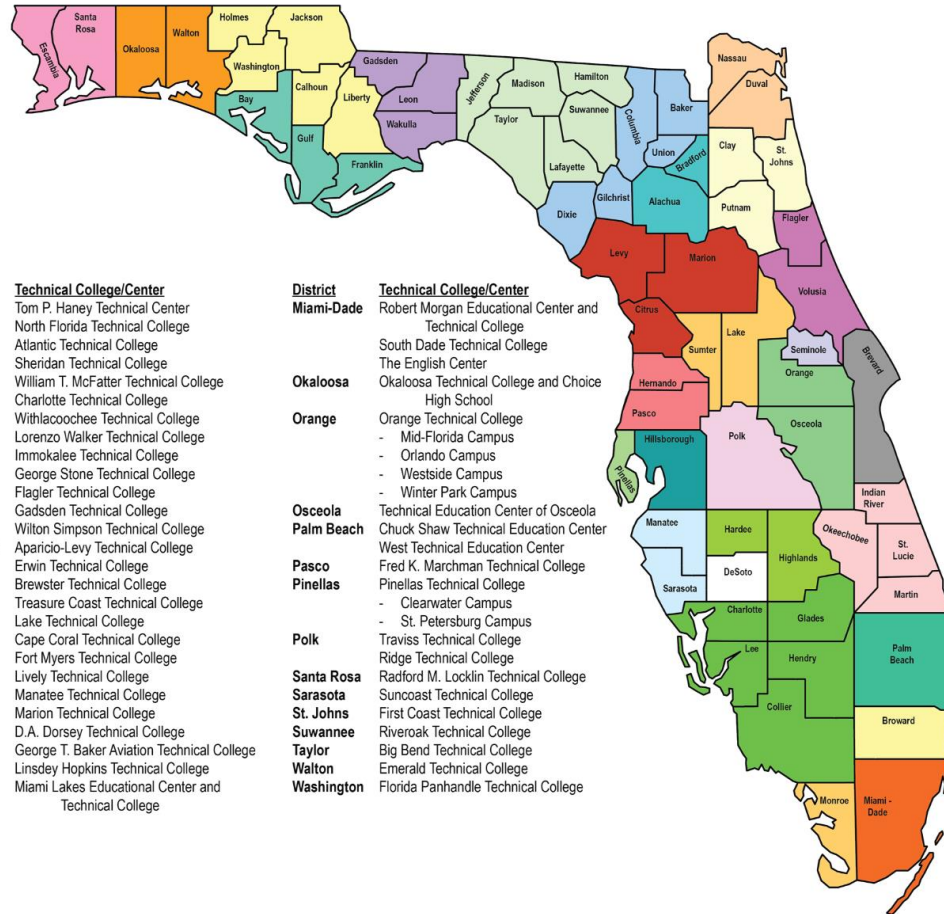

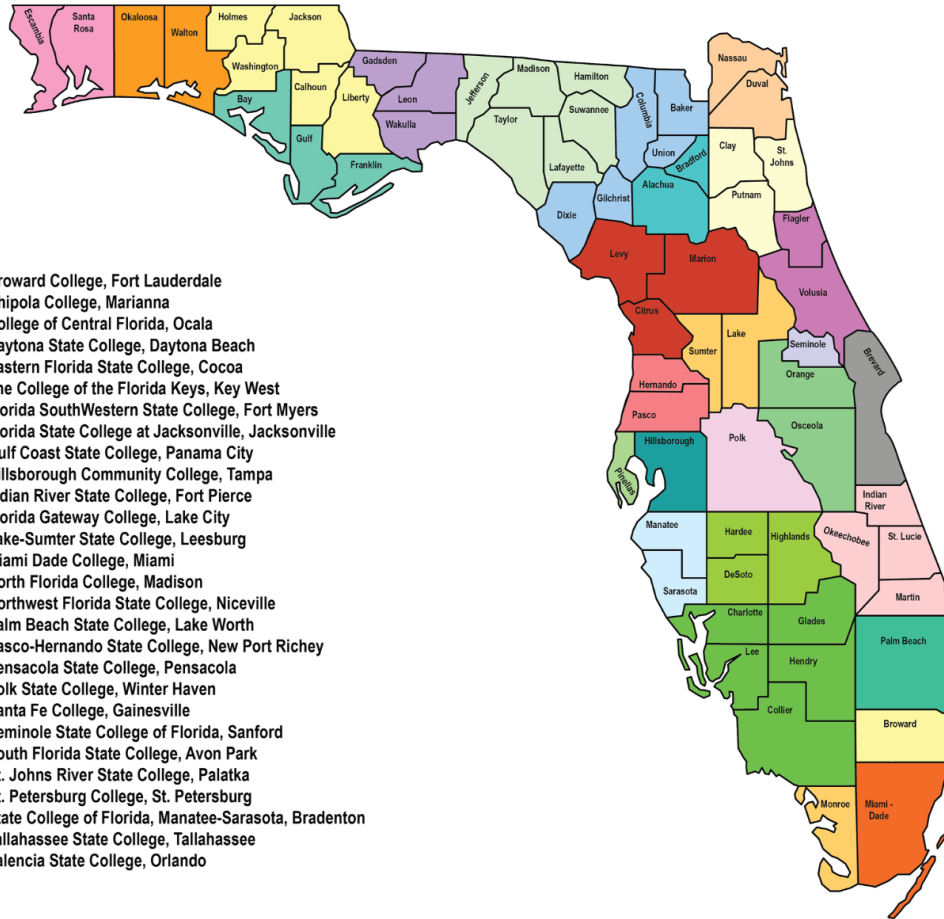

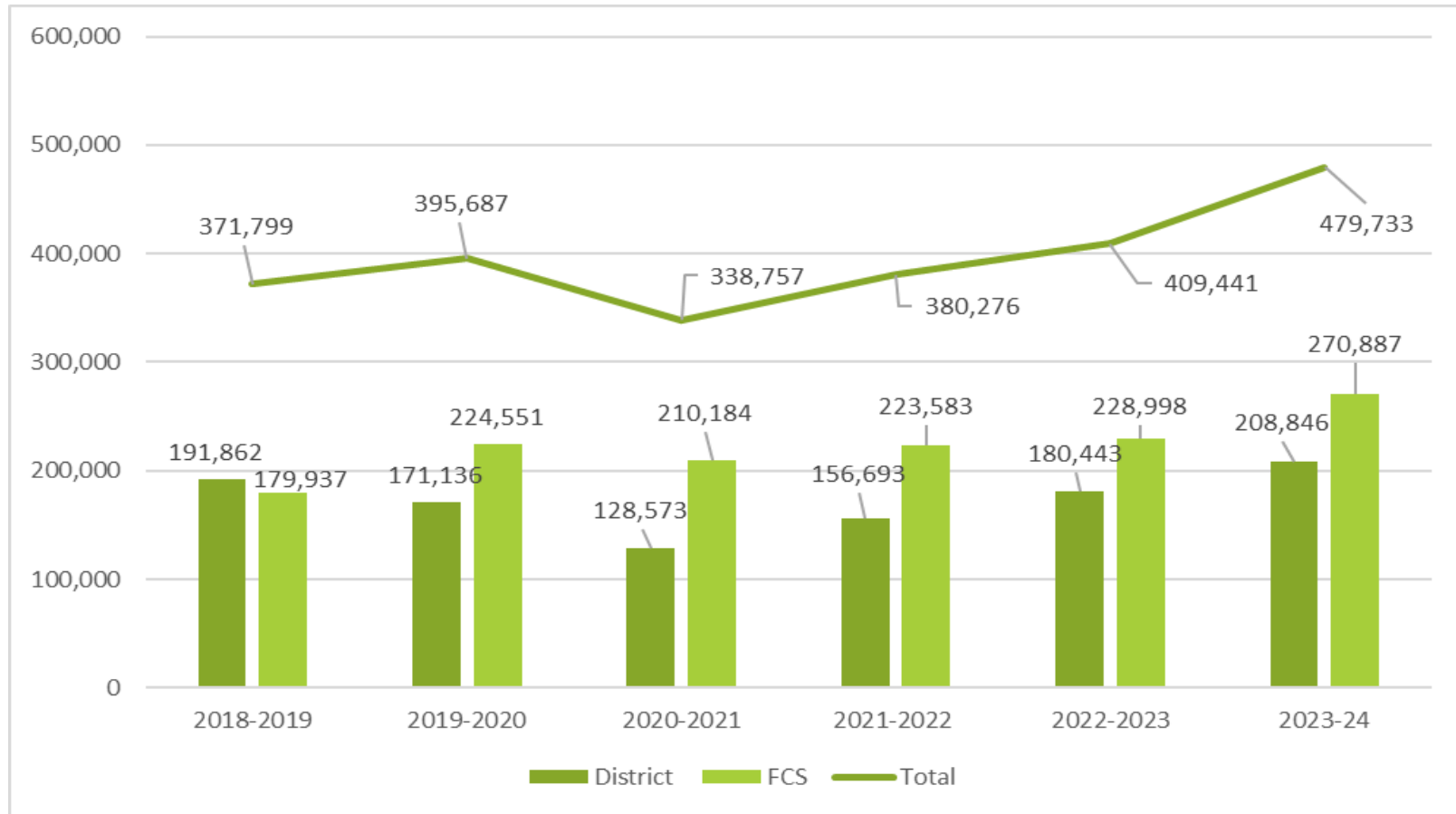

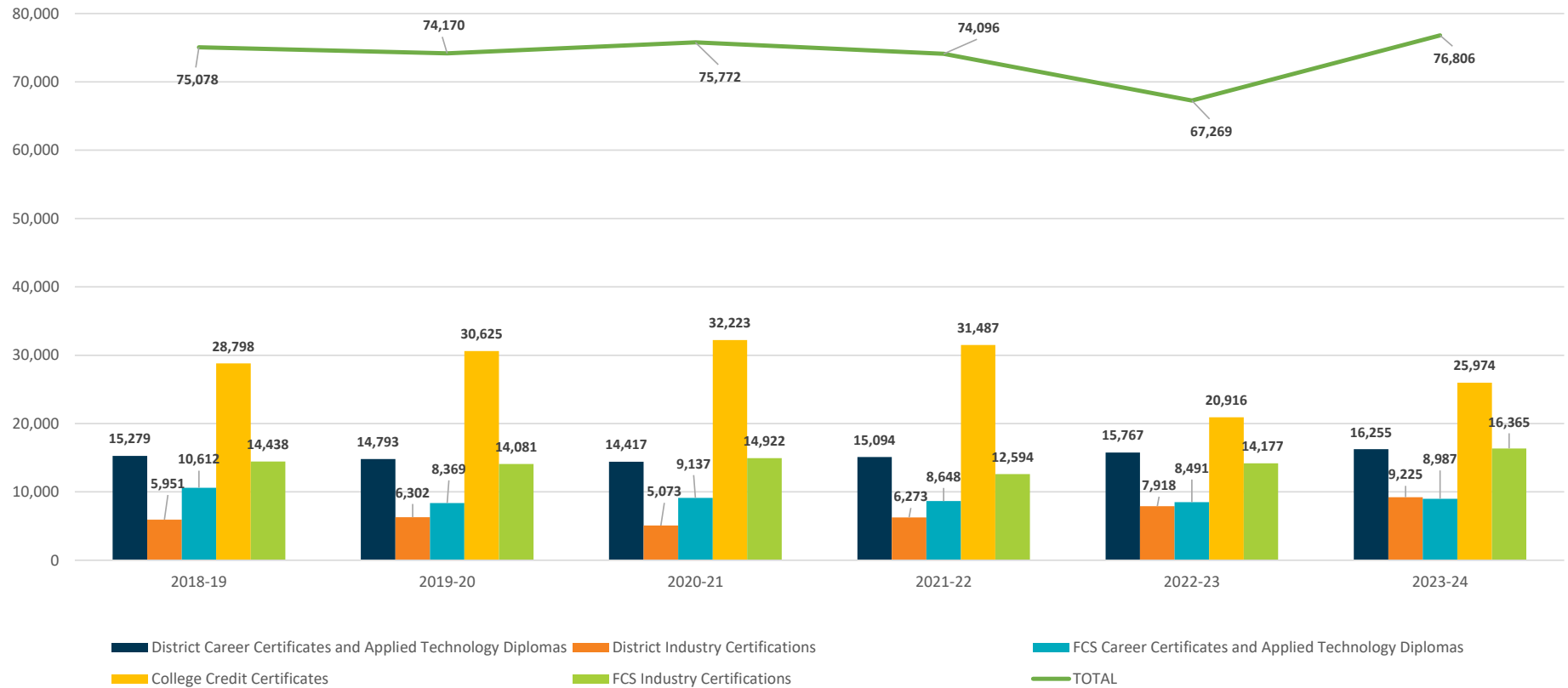

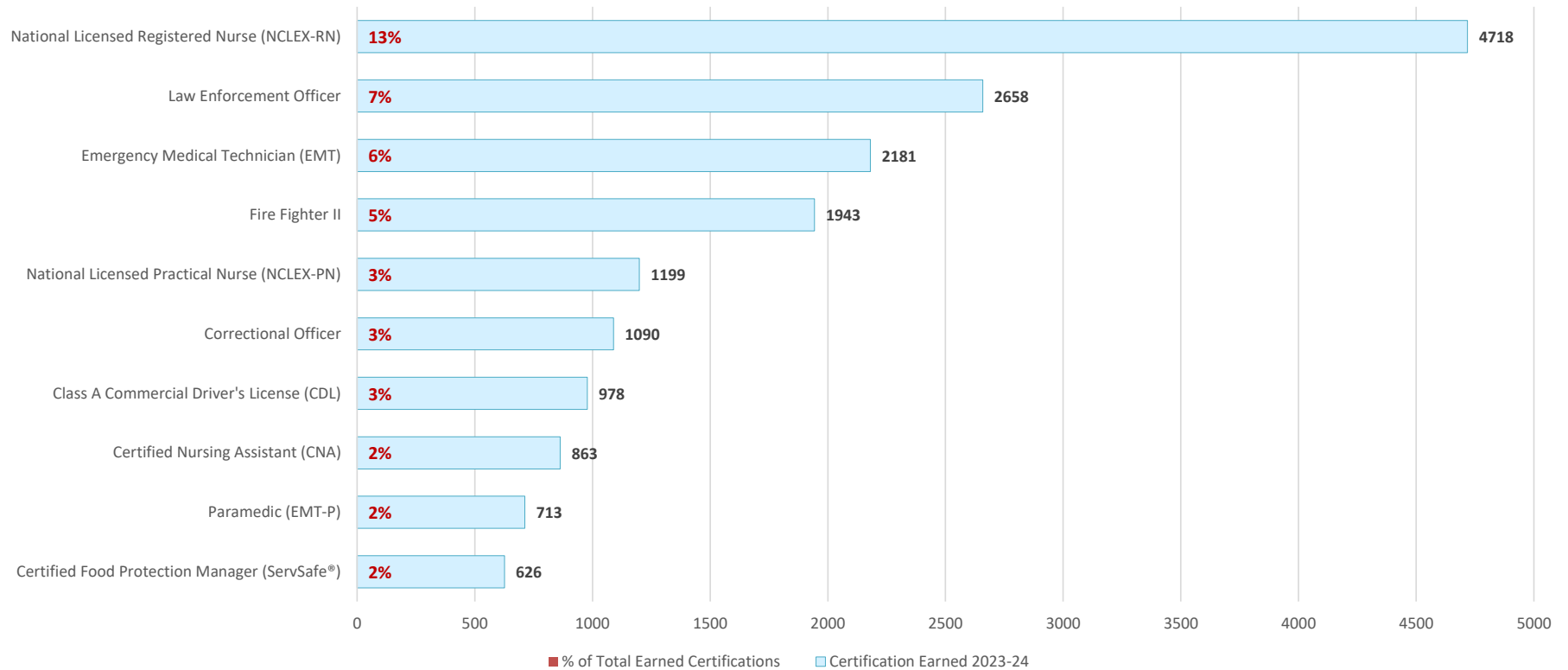
Postsecondary CTE Enrollment Trends

- [Rule 6A-10.0342](#), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), Career and Technical Education Program Quality Audit Rule, also known as the **CTE Audit Rule**, sets forth the procedures, thresholds, and timelines for reviewing secondary and postsecondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs in accordance with Section (s.)1003.491(5), F.S.
- The rule also describes the CTE Program Quality Targets that programs are expected to meet and the required actions for programs that do not meet those targets.
- **Beginning in calendar year 2026**, programs that fail to meet the targets for a metric will be notified for the phase out process outlined in subsections (5) and (6) of the rule.

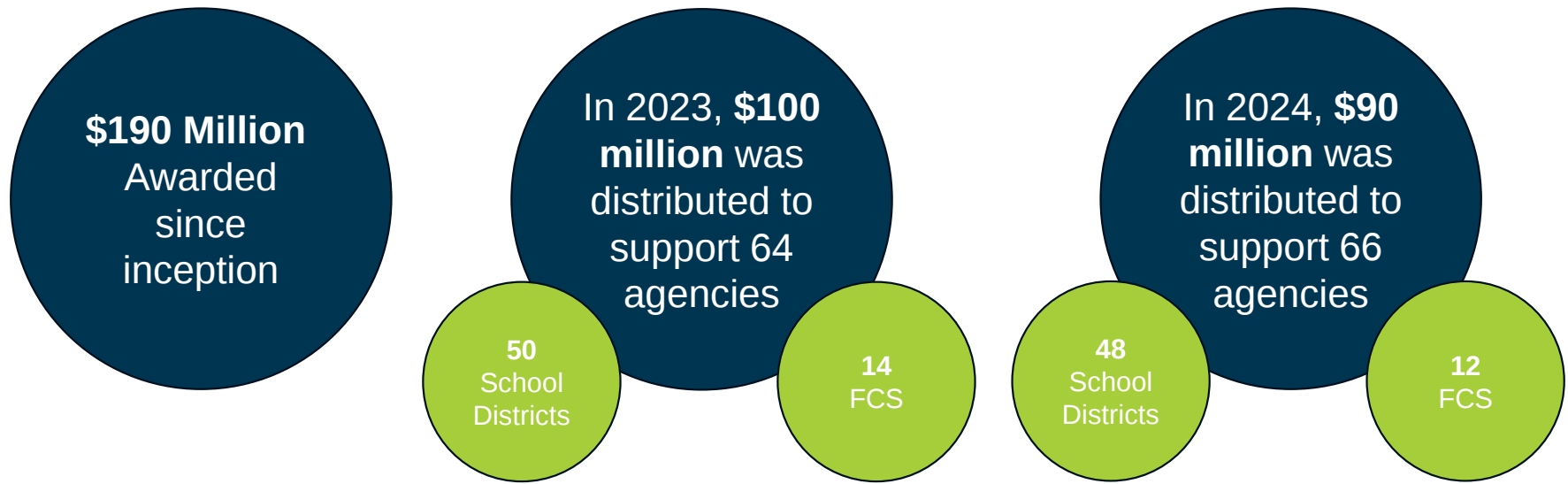

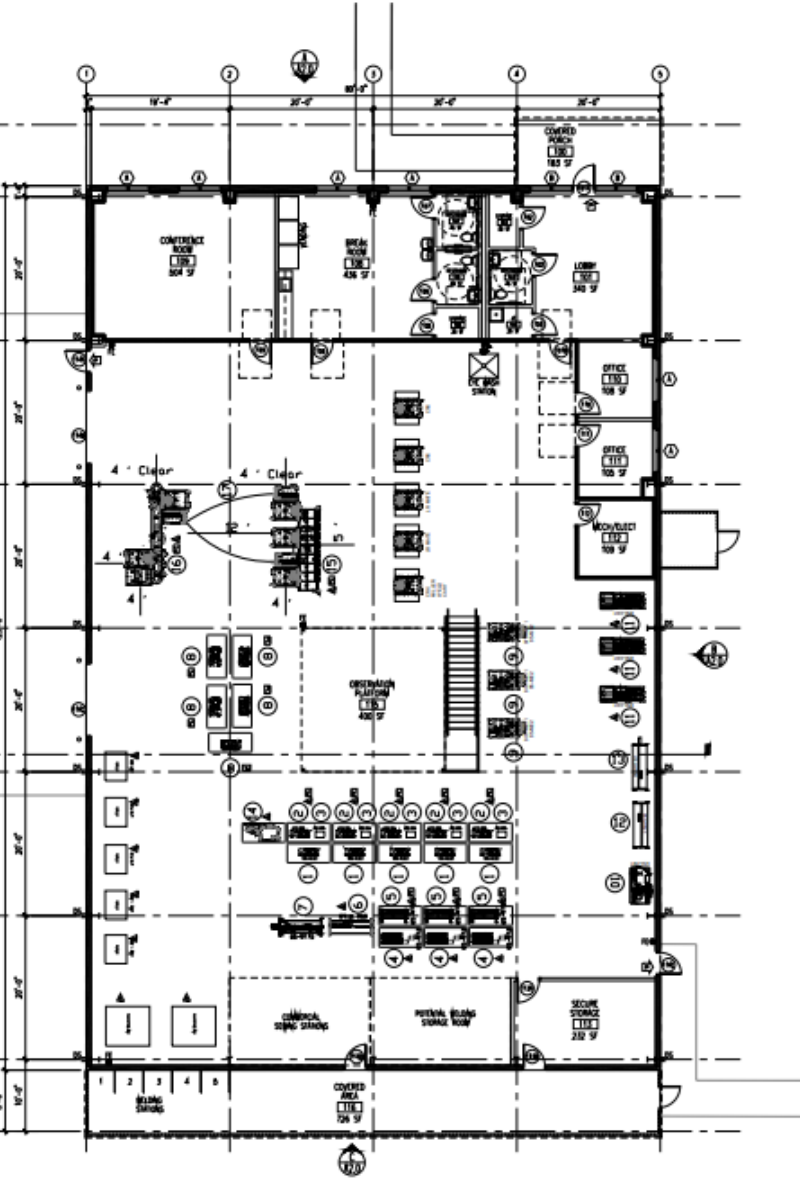
