COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE - Substantial Changes

I. Summary:

CS/CS/CS/SB 52 requires public schools to provide instruction on social media safety, and defines “social media” as a form of interactive electronic communication through an Internet website or application by which a user creates a service-specific identifying profile to connect with other users for the purpose of communicating and sharing information. Specifically the bill:

- Requires the Department of Education to make social media safety instructional material available online and district school boards to notify parents of the material’s availability. The department may procure such material from a vendor or provider.
- Requires social media safety material to include age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate instruction for students in grades 6-12, and focus on the social, emotional, and physical effects of social media.
- Requires social media safety instruction to include:
 - Risks of social media on mental health, including addiction, the distribution of misinformation, how social media manipulates behavior, the permanency of sharing materials online.
 - How to safely use social media, such as maintaining personal security and identify cyberbullying, predatory behavior, and human trafficking, and how to report suspicious behavior encountered on the internet.
- Requires each school district to prohibit student access to social media platforms through the use of Internet access provided by the school district, except when used solely for educational purposes as directed by the student’s teacher.

The bill has no impact on state revenues or expenditures. The bill may have a fiscal impact on school districts. See section V.

This bill is effective July 1, 2023.

II. Present Situation:

Social Media Safety

Over the past decade, social media has become a dominant force in modern life. It has changed the way we communicate, share information, and interact with the world.¹ Most teens and many preteens use some form of social media and have a profile on a social networking site. Many visit these sites every day.² Teens credit social media for helping to build stronger friendships and exposing them to a more diverse world, but they express concern that these sites lead to drama and social pressure.³

Risks of Social Media

Social media can be a hub for potentially dangerous or questionable activities. The risks to young people from social media vary widely. Social media gives predators an easy way to reach kids and teens.⁴ Some potential safety risks of social media include:

- Exposure to harmful or inappropriate content.
- Exposure to dangerous people.
- Cyberbullying.
- Oversharing personal information.
- Exposure to excessive advertisements.
- Privacy concerns including the collection of data about teen users.
- Identity theft or being hacked.
- Interference with sleep, exercise, homework, or family activities.⁵

Instruction in Schools

Social Media Instruction in Schools

Two-thirds of students are unable to tell the difference between news stories and ads, and 96 percent of students did not consider how ties between an advocacy website and industry might affect the site's credibility.⁶

Since 2015, at least 79 media literacy and digital citizenship bills have been introduced in at least 28 states. Of the bills introduced, at least 14 have been enacted in 10 states.

Definitions of media literacy and digital citizenship vary. Some coalitions of stakeholders and education organizations have convened and created definitions for the terms.⁷ One example of a definition provided by a national coalition of education organizations defines five competencies of digital citizenship as inclusive, informed, engaged, balanced, and alert.⁸

When considered separately, media literacy typically addresses the ability to analyze, evaluate, access, and create media, while digital citizenship typically places more emphasis on online safety and responsibility. Texas defines digital citizenship as including the ability to “access, analyze, evaluate, create, and act on all forms of digital communication” in addition to appropriate and responsible online behavior.⁹

Social Media Instruction in Florida Schools

Students are not required to receive instruction on social media. However, an instructional model for a social media course¹⁰ is available in CPALMS. The purpose of this social media course is to enable students to develop fundamental skills in the use of social media across print, multimedia, web, and broadcast platforms, including ethical and legal uses. The content of this course should include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Demonstrating entry-level skills in digital communication and packaging them across the platforms/mediums of print, multimedia, online, and broadcast;
- Demonstrating fundamental skills in social media platforms and their uses; expressing social connections with maturity and complexity appropriate to writer, audience, purpose, and context;
- Using fundamental research skills and networking formats;
- Collaborating amongst peers; and

- Using effective listening, speaking, and viewing strategies with an emphasis on the use of evidence to support or refute a claim in multimedia presentations, class discussions, and extended text discussions.¹¹

Required Instruction in Florida Schools

The mission of Florida's K-20 education system is to allow its students to increase their proficiency by allowing them the opportunity to expand their knowledge and skills through rigorous and relevant learning opportunities.¹² Each district school board must provide appropriate instruction to ensure that students meet State Board of Education (SBE) adopted standards in the following subject areas: reading and other language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, foreign languages, health and physical education, and the arts.¹³

Instructional staff of public schools,¹⁴ subject to the rules of the SBE and the district school board, must provide instruction in:

- The history and content of the Declaration of Independence.
- The history, meaning, significance, and effect of the provisions of the Constitution of the United States.
- The arguments in support of adopting our republican form of government.
- Flag education, including proper flag display and flag salute.
- The elements of civil government.
- The history of the United States.
- The history of the Holocaust.
- The history of African Americans.
- The elementary principles of agriculture.
- The effects of alcoholic and intoxicating liquors and beverages and narcotics.
- Kindness to animals.
- The history of the state.
- The conservation of natural resources.
- Comprehensive age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate K-12 instruction on health education and life skills.
- The study of Hispanic contributions to the United States.
- The study of women's contributions to the United States.
- The nature and importance of free enterprise to the United States economy.
- Civic and character education.
- The sacrifices that veterans and Medal of Honor recipients have made serving the country.¹⁵

When students bring their wireless communications devices (primarily cell phones) to school it creates more opportunities for the student to engage in use of the device. Usage of such device creates a distraction or disruption. These distractions cause issues with focus and concentration. Studies have concluded that cell phone usage in schools leads to poor learning outcomes.¹⁶

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill amends s. 1003.42, F.S., to require instructional staff of public schools to provide instruction on social media safety, and defines “social media” as a form of interactive electronic communication through an Internet website or application by which a user creates a service-specific identifying profile to connect with other users of the Internet website or application for the purpose of communicating and sharing information, ideas, news, stories, opinions, images, and other content.

The bill requires the Department of Education to make social media safety instructional material available online and district school boards to notify parents of the material’s online availability.

The bill requires social media safety material to include age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate instruction for students in grades 6-12, as well as, focus on the social, emotional, and physical effects of social media and promote best practices in digital citizenship. The bill defines “digital citizenship” as the norms of appropriate, responsible, and healthy behavior related to social media, including digital literacy, ethics, etiquette, and security.

The bill specifies that the social media safety instruction must include:

- Risks of social media on mental health, including addiction, the distribution of misinformation, how social media manipulates behavior, the permanency of sharing materials online.
- How to safely use social media, such as maintaining personal security and identify cyberbullying, predatory behavior, and human trafficking, and how to report suspicious behavior encountered on the internet.

The bill amends s. 1006.07, to prohibit student use of a wireless communication device during instructional time, except when used solely for educational purposes as directed by the student’s teacher. The bill authorizes a teacher to withhold a student’s wireless communication device during instructional time.

Additionally, the bill creates s. 1006.1494, F.S., which prohibits student access to social media platforms through the use of Internet access provided by the school district, except when used solely for educational purposes as directed by the student’s teacher.

The bill is effective July 1, 2023.

IX. Additional Information:**A. Committee Substitute – Statement of Substantial Changes:**
(Summarizing differences between the Committee Substitute and the prior version of the bill.)**CS/CS/CS by Fiscal Policy on March 28, 2023:**

The committee substitute retains the provisions in the bill. The committee substitute also:

- Adds that students can utilize wireless communication devices during instructional time when used solely for educational purposes as directed by the student’s teacher.
- Adds that students can utilize social media platforms through the use of Internet access provided by the school district when used solely for educational purposes as directed by the student’s teacher.
- Removes the provision that authorizes career and technical education course instruction to access social media platforms.

CS/CS by Appropriations Committee on Education on March 14, 2023:

The committee substitute retains the requirement of the bill regarding social media safety instruction and the Department of Education responsibilities for instructional materials.

The committee substitute also:

- Removes the need to have instruction on the advantages of social media use.
- Adds the requirement that social media safety focus on how social media manipulates behavior and how to identify cyberbullying.
- Adds that the Department may procure the instructional material from a vendor or provider.
- Adds the prohibition of wireless communication device usage during instruction time. Clarifying a teacher may withhold the student’s wireless communication device during instructional time.
- Prohibits student access to social media platforms through the use of internet access provided by the school. Adds clarifying language that this prohibition does not apply to career and technical education course instruction.

CS by Education Pre-K -12 on February 7, 2023:

The committee substitute retains requirements in the bill regarding social media safety instruction and Department of Education responsibilities for instructional materials. The committee substitute also:

- Adds a requirement that the social media safety material must include age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate instruction for students in grades 6-12.
- Adds the requirement that the social media safety material must focus on the social, emotional, and physical effects of social media and promote best practices of digital citizenship.
- Adds a definition for “digital citizenship”.
- Adds specifying language that social media safety instruction must include:
 - Advantages of using social media. Such instruction may only include career and resume building for future academic or employment opportunities, sharing information with familiar family and friends, and safely connecting with other users with like interests.

- Risks of social media, such as social media addiction, publication of misinformation, negative effects on mental health, and the permanent nature of content shared online.
- How to safely use social media, such as maintaining personal security, preventing oversharing of personal information, identifying predatory behavior and human trafficking, and reporting suspicious behavior.
- Creates s. 1006.1494, F.S., which prohibits student access to social media platforms through the use of Internet access provided by the school district.

 58 3. For students in grades 6 through 12, awareness of the

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benefits of sexual abstinence as the expected standard and the consequences of teenage pregnancy.

4. Life skills that build confidence, support mental and emotional health, and enable students to overcome challenges, including:

- a. Self-awareness and self-management.
- b. Responsible decisionmaking.
- c. Resiliency.
- d. Relationship skills and conflict resolution.
- e. Understanding and respecting other viewpoints and backgrounds.

f. For grades 9 through 12, developing leadership skills, interpersonal skills, organization skills, and research skills; creating a resume, including a digital resume; exploring career pathways; using state career planning resources; developing and practicing the skills necessary for employment interviews; workplace ethics and workplace law; managing stress and expectations; and self-motivation.

5.a. For students in grades 6 through 12, the social, emotional, and physical effects of social media. This component must include, but need not be limited to, the negative effects of social media on mental health, including addiction; the distribution of misinformation on social media; how social media manipulates behavior; the permanency of sharing materials online; how to maintain personal security and identify cyberbullying, predatory behavior, and human trafficking on the Internet; and how to report suspicious behavior encountered on the Internet.

b. The Department of Education shall make available online

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the instructional material being used pursuant to this subparagraph, and each district school board shall notify parents of its availability. The department may procure the instructional material from a vendor or provider.

Health education and life skills instruction and materials may not contradict the principles enumerated in subsection (3).

The State Board of Education is encouraged to adopt standards and pursue assessment of the requirements of this subsection. I. Summary:

CS/SB 76 allows Florida residents to reserve state park cabins and campsites one month before nonresidents. Specifically, the bill requires the Division of Recreation and Parks of the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to allow Florida residents to reserve state park cabins and campsites, including sites for RV, tent, boat, and equestrian camping up to 11 months in advance, and up to 10 months in advance for nonresidents. Florida residents must provide proof of residency (a Florida driver license or identification card) when making reservations more than 10 months in advance.

The DEP may incur expenditures to update its reservation website but this can be absorbed within existing resources.

II. Present Situation:

Florida State Parks

Florida residents and visitors from around the world are drawn to the state's 175 award-winning¹ parks, spanning nearly 800,000 acres and 100 miles of coastline.² During fiscal year 2021-2022, over 32 million people visited our state parks.³ While approximately 75 percent of those visitors were "non-local," meaning they traveled from more than 50 miles away,⁴ Florida residents have, on average, made up 61 percent of all overnight visitors.⁵

Florida state parks offer a variety of camping options:

- Fifty-six state parks offer campgrounds, 52 of which have amenities specifically for RV campers.⁶ Full-facility campsites for tent and RV campers include water, electricity, a grill and picnic table, as well as centralized showers, restrooms, and dump stations.⁷
- Twenty-eight state parks provide primitive campgrounds. These sites have limited improvements, such as a fire ring and a cleared area for tent camping, but generally have no electric power, and may or may not have potable water or bathroom facilities and are typically accessible by foot, bicycle, or canoe/kayak only.⁸
- Nineteen state parks offer cabins,⁹ with options varying from fully equipped modern cabins with kitchens, fireplaces, and screened porches to more primitive hand-hewn, lumber, or palm-log cabins.¹⁰
- Eighteen state parks offer camping for equestrians and their horses.¹¹ Amenities vary by park and range from ride-in primitive sites to areas suitable for rigs.¹² Some equestrian campsites include paddocks or stable facilities and restrooms with showers.¹³

- Seven state parks offer glamping (glamorous camping), which includes a canvas tent, a queen bed with linens, a seating area, device charging stations, and a cooling and heating unit.¹⁴ Glamping reservations are booked through third-party vendors.
- Six state parks provide boat slips with water and electricity. Boaters have access to park restrooms, showers, pump-outs, and other amenities. Boaters can also anchor overnight at Bill Baggs Cape Florida State Park and John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park.¹⁵

Camping Reservations

Florida state parks¹⁶ allow visitors to make reservations up to 11 months in advance, either by phone or online.¹⁷ This booking window applies to both Florida residents and nonresidents. New dates become available daily at 8:00 a.m.¹⁸ Any new sites that become available throughout the day due to a cancellation are randomly released back into inventory following the cancellation.¹⁹

The maximum length of stay for a single reservation is 14 nights total. After 14 nights, visitors must leave the park for at least three nights before returning for a new stay. Based on availability and once the camper is registered and on-site, the park manager or designee may at their discretion extend a camper's current stay up to an additional 14 nights. Maximum continuous length of stay in any one park is 28 nights. Campers are permitted up to 56 nights of total occupancy in any one park in each six-month period, defined as October 1 - March 31, and April 1 - September 30. All campsites or cabins not reserved or occupied may be rented to walk-in visitors on a first-come, first-served basis.²⁰

Campsite fees and rental rates vary by park and are generally the same for residents and nonresidents.²¹ Only certain Florida citizens—those who are 65 years of age or older, disabled, or who operate a licensed family foster home—are eligible for a discount (50 percent).²² Recipients of such discounts must provide proof of eligibility.²³

A Florida resident who wishes to book a campsite more than 10 months in advance must provide proof of residency (a valid Florida driver license or identification card issued under s. 322.051, F.S.), when making a reservation. The bill also makes technical changes.

It provides that reservations made for non-residents may be made up to 10 months in advance rather than 11 and Florida residents may make reservations 11 months in advance rather than 12. It also provides that a Florida resident who wishes to book a state park in advance must provide his or her valid Florida driver license number or identification number as proof of Florida residency when making a reservation.

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE - Substantial Changes

I. Summary:

CS/CS/SB 284 revises the vehicle procurement requirements for the state purchasing plan. Specifically, the bill requires vehicles of a given use class to be selected for procurement based on the lowest lifetime ownership costs, including costs for operations, maintenance, and fuel when fuel economy data is available, rather than on the greatest fuel efficiency available, when fuel economy data is available. The current exemption to this requirement is continued for emergency response vehicles.

The bill requires, when available, the use of ethanol and biodiesel blended fuels and natural gas fuel when a state agency purchases a vehicle with an internal combustion engine.

The bill requires the Department of Management Services to make recommendations before July 1, 2024, regarding the procurement of electric vehicles and natural gas fuel vehicles and other vehicles powered by renewable energy. The recommendations must include best practices for integrating these vehicles into existing fleets.

The bill expands the definition of “single-trade inspection” for purposes of building code inspection services to include inspections of the installation of electric vehicle charging stations and solar energy and energy storage installations or alterations. This allows the property owner to contract with a private provider for the inspection services rather than rely solely on the local government code inspectors.

The Department of Management Services will incur costs modifying the configuration of the Fleet Management Information System. Local governments may have reduced workloads relating to code inspections, but will experience a similar decline in revenues associated with those inspections conducted by private providers.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2023.

II. Present Situation:

Procurement of Commodities or Contractual Services

Chapter 287, F.S., specifies the procedures for the state procurement of commodities or contractual services. The Department of Management Services (DMS) oversees state purchasing activity, including professional and contractual services, as well as commodities needed to support agency activities.¹ The DMS establishes purchasing agreements and procures state term contracts for commodities and contractual services, and establishes uniform procurement policies, rules, and procedures.² The DMS negotiates contracts and purchasing agreements that are intended to leverage the state's buying power. The DMS is directed to consider the life-cycle cost of commodities purchased by the state.³ The DMS is authorized to establish energy-efficiency standards for major energy-consuming products.⁴

State agencies may use a variety of procurement methods, depending on the cost and characteristics of the needed good or service, the complexity of the procurement, and the number of available vendors. These methods include the following:

- Single source contracts,⁵ used when an agency determines that only one vendor is available to provide a commodity or service at the time of purchase;
- Invitations to bid,⁶ used when an agency determines that standard services or goods will meet needs, wide competition is available and the vendor's experience will not greatly influence the agency's results;
- Requests for proposals,⁷ used when the procurement requirements allow for consideration of various solutions and the agency believes more than two or three vendors exist who can provide the required goods or services; and
- Invitations to negotiate,⁸ used when negotiations are determined to be necessary to obtain the best value and involve a request for highly complex, customized, mission-critical services, by an agency dealing with a limited number of vendors.

For procurement of commodities or contractual services in excess of \$35,000, agencies must use a competitive solicitation process.⁹ However, specific contractual services and commodities are not subject to competitive solicitation requirements.¹⁰

Climate-friendly Public Business

Section 286.29, F.S., requires state agencies to:

- Consult with the “Florida Climate-Friendly Preferred Products List,”¹¹ in procuring products from state term contracts.¹² If the price is comparable, then they shall procure such products.¹³
- Contract only with hotels or conference facilities for meetings and conferences as recognized by the Green Lodging Program.^{14,15}
- Ensure vehicles meet minimum maintenance schedules shown to reduce fuel consumption and report such compliance to the DMS.¹⁶ When procuring new vehicles, to define the intended purpose for such vehicle which will then be chosen based on greatest fuel efficiency available for a given use class, when fuel economy data is available.¹⁷
- Use ethanol and biodiesel blended fuels when available.¹⁸
- Procure biofuels for fleet, to the greatest extent practicable, if the agency administers central fueling operations.¹⁹

Florida Building Codes

The purpose and intent of the Florida Building Code (building code) is to provide a mechanism for the uniform adoption, updating, interpretation, and enforcement of a single, unified state building code.²⁰ The Building Code consists of a single set of documents that apply to the design, construction, erection, alteration, modification, repair or demolition of public or private

buildings, structures, or facilities in Florida. The Building Code must be applied, administered, and enforced uniformly and consistently from jurisdiction to jurisdiction.²¹

Contractors and property owners are permitted to hire licensed Building Code administrators, engineers, and architects, referred to as “private providers,” to review building plans, perform building inspections, and prepare certificates of completion.²² A private provider and any duly authorized representative may only perform building code inspection services that are set forth in statute, including single-trade inspections. A “single-trade inspection” is defined as:

[a]ny inspection focused on a single construction trade, such as plumbing, mechanical, or electrical. The term includes, but is not limited to, inspections of door or window replacements; fences and block walls more than 6 feet high from the top of the wall to the bottom of the footing; stucco or plastering; reroofing with no structural alteration; HVAC replacements; ductwork or fan replacements; alteration or installation of wiring, lighting, and service panels; water heater changeouts; sink replacements; and repiping.²³

A private provider cannot provide building code inspection services to any building designed or constructed by the private provider or the private provider’s firm.²⁴ A fee owner or the fee owner’s contractor who uses a private provider to provide building code inspection services must notify the local building official in writing that a private provider has been contracted to perform the required inspections of construction, including single-trade inspections.²⁵ If the fee owner or the fee owner’s contractor makes any changes to the listed private providers or the services to be provided by such private providers the fee owner’s contractors must update the notice to reflect such changes.²⁶

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1 amends s. 286.29, F.S., to require any governmental entity that purchases under the state purchasing plan to select vehicles based on the lowest lifetime ownership costs, including costs for operations, maintenance, and fuel when fuel economy data is available. The section also requires, when available, the use of ethanol and biodiesel blended fuels and natural gas fuel when a state agency purchases a vehicle with an internal combustion engine. The current exemption to this requirement continues for emergency response vehicles.

Section 2 requires the DMS to make recommendations before July 1, 2024, to state agencies, including state colleges and universities, and local governments regarding the procurement of electric vehicles and natural gas fuel vehicles and other vehicles powered by renewable energy. The recommendations must include best practices for integrating those vehicles into existing fleets.

The bill defines “renewable energy” to mean electrical energy produced from a method that uses one or more of the following fuels or energy sources: hydrogen produced or resulting from sources other than fossil fuels, biomass, solar energy, geothermal energy, wind energy, ocean energy, and hydroelectric power. The term includes the alternative energy resource, waste heat, from sulfuric acid manufacturing operations and electrical energy produced using pipeline-quality synthetic gas produced from waste petroleum coke with carbon capture and sequestration.

Section 3 amends s. 553.791, F.S., to expand the definition of “single-trade inspection” to include the inspection of an installation of electric vehicle charging stations and solar energy and energy storage installations or alterations.

Section 4 provides the bill takes effect July 1, 2023.

IV. Constitutional Issues:

A. Municipality/County Mandates Restrictions:

Not applicable. The bill does not require counties and municipalities to spend funds, limit the ability of counties and municipalities to raise revenue, or reduce the percentage of state tax shared with counties and municipalities.

D. State Tax or Fee Increases:

The bill does not create or increase a state tax or fee as specified in Article VII, s. 19 of the Florida Constitution.

E. Other Constitutional Issues:

V. Fiscal Impact Statement:

A. Tax/Fee Issues:

None.

B. Private Sector Impact:

Section 4 of the bill, allowing the use of private providers to inspect the installation of electric vehicle charging stations and solar energy and energy storage installations or alterations, may increase efficiencies and lower costs for its owners. Additionally, persons qualified to be a private provider will be able to offer official inspection services, increasing business opportunities.

C. Government Sector Impact:

To implement section 3 of the bill, the DMS states that modifications, including a possible configuration in the Fleet Management Information System, will be necessary to capture information needed to make recommendations.²⁷

Section 4 of the bill, allowing the use of private providers to inspect the installation of electric vehicle charging stations and solar energy and energy storage installations or alterations, may reduce the workload of the local governments relating to inspections; however, each inspection performed by a private provider will reduce the revenue otherwise collected by the local governmental entity that would have conducted the inspection.

VI. Technical Deficiencies:

None.

VII. Related Issues:

The Department of Management Services has stated that the July 1, 2024, implementation date would be challenging due to the need to consult with outside experts on best practices for integrating electric vehicles into the existing fleet.²⁸

VIII. Statutes Affected:

This bill substantially amends the following sections of the Florida Statutes: 286.29 and 553.791.

The committee substitute:

- Removes the sales and use tax exemption for components and labor used in electric vehicle conversions and the associated definition.

- Requires DMS to make recommendations to certain state entities and local governments before July 1, 2024, regarding the procurement of vehicles powered by renewable energy.

CS by Governmental Oversight and Accountability on February 20, 2023:

The committee substitute:

- Exempts from sales tax the components and labor used in an electric vehicle conversion.
- Defines “electric vehicle conversion” to mean replacing the gas or diesel powertrain technology of a motor vehicle with 100 percent battery electric powertrain technology.

I. Summary:

SB 300 amends and creates multiple provisions of law related to pregnancy support and wellness services, the state's Family Planning Program, and the termination of pregnancies.

The bill prohibits abortion after six weeks of gestation unless an exception is met. Current-law exceptions to abortion time frames are maintained and a new exception is established for cases in which the pregnancy is the result of rape or incest. This new exception is available until the 15th week of gestation under the bill.

The bill specifies that abortions, including medical abortions,¹ may not be provided through telehealth and that medication intended for the use in a medical abortion may only be dispensed by a physician and may not be dispensed via the U.S. Postal Service or by any other carrier. The bill also prohibits any person, educational institution, and governmental entity from expending state funds for a person to travel to another state to receive services that are intended to support an abortion, unless such expenditure is required by federal law or there is a legitimate medical emergency.

SB 300 also amends the pregnancy support and wellness services network established in s. 381.96, F.S., to expand eligibility for such services to women who have given birth in the past 12 months and to parents or guardians of children under the age of three for up to 12 months. The bill adds new services and assistance which the network is required to provide, including counseling, mentoring, educational materials, and classes as well as material assistance including clothing, car seats, cribs formula, and diapers. The bill also requires that the Department of Health (DOH) report to the Governor and the Legislature annually on the types, amount, and costs of services provided as well as demographic information on persons who receive such services.

The bill appropriates \$25 million in recurring general revenue for the expanded network and specifies that contracted organizations in the network must spend at least 85 percent of the funds received on providing services and maintaining a hotline.

The bill also appropriates \$5 million in recurring general revenue, above what is currently appropriated in the General Appropriations Act (GAA), for family planning services provided by the Department of Health pursuant to s. 381.0051, F.S.

The bill makes other technical and clean-up changes, including repealing s. 390.01112, F.S., which is unused; clarifying that the current-law exception for fatal fetal anomalies is available until the third trimester of pregnancy, rather than until fetal viability; and repealing rulemaking language that is no longer applicable.

The provisions of the bill, other than the expansion of the pregnancy support network and the appropriations which are effective upon becoming law, are effective 30 days after one of several events occurs. These events include a Florida Supreme court ruling overturning *In re T.W.*,² or one of several other related cases; a Florida Supreme court ruling stating that the privacy clause in the Florida Constitution does not protect the right to abortion; or an amendment to the Florida Constitution which provides the same.

II. Present Situation:

Federal Case Law on Abortion

Roe v. Wade

In 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court issued the landmark *Roe v. Wade* decision.³ Using the strict scrutiny standard, the Court determined that a woman's right to terminate a pregnancy is protected by a fundamental right to privacy guaranteed under the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Further, the Court reasoned that state regulations limiting the exercise of this right must be justified by a compelling state interest and must be narrowly drawn.

Casey

In 1992, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled on the constitutionality of a Pennsylvania statute involving a 24-hour waiting period between the provision of information to a woman and the performance of an abortion. In that decision, *Planned Parenthood of Southeastern Pennsylvania v. Casey* (a.k.a. "*Casey*"),⁴ the Court upheld the statute and relaxed the standard of review in abortion cases involving adult women from "strict scrutiny" to "unduly burdensome." Under *Casey*, an undue burden exists and makes a statute invalid if the statute's purpose or effect is to place a substantial obstacle in the way of a woman seeking an abortion before the fetus is viable.

The Court held that the undue burden standard is an appropriate means of reconciling a state's interest in human life with the woman's constitutionally protected liberty to decide whether to terminate a pregnancy. The Court determined that, prior to fetal viability, a woman has the right to an abortion without being unduly burdened by government interference. Before viability, a state's interests are not strong enough under *Casey* to support prohibiting an abortion or the imposition of a substantial obstacle to the woman's right to select the procedure. However, once viability occurs, a state has the power to restrict abortions if the law contains exceptions for pregnancies that endanger a woman's life or health.

Dobbs

On June 24, 2022, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled on *Jackson Women's Health Org. v. Dobbs* (a.k.a. "*Dobbs*"),⁵ a case involving Mississippi's Gestational Age Act. The Gestational Age Act prohibited all abortions after 15 weeks of gestational age and was permanently enjoined by the lower courts in 2019. In *Dobbs*, the U.S. Supreme Court explicitly and entirely overruled *Roe v. Wade* and *Casey*, returning all abortion regulation decisions back to state control. The Court stated:

[*Roe v. Wade*] was...egregiously wrong and on a collision course with the Constitution from the day it was decided. *Casey* perpetuated its errors, calling both sides of the national controversy to resolve their debate, but in doing so, *Casey* necessarily declared a winning side. Those on the losing side—those who sought to advance the State's interest in fetal life—could no longer seek to persuade their elected representatives to adopt policies consistent with their views. The Court short-circuited the democratic process by closing it to the large number of Americans who disagreed with *Roe*.⁶

The Court's final holding was that "the Constitution does not confer a right to abortion; *Roe* and *Casey* are overruled; and the authority to regulate abortion is returned to the people and their elected representatives."⁷

In Florida, however, abortion restrictions established under Florida Statutes are still held to the stricter standard established in *In re T.W.* (discussed below) unless the Florida Supreme Court eventually overturns the decision in that case.

Abortion Law in Florida

Under Florida law, abortion is defined as the termination of a human pregnancy with an intention other than to produce a live birth or remove a dead fetus.⁸ The termination of a pregnancy must be performed by a physician⁹ licensed under ch. 458, F.S., or ch. 459, F.S., or a physician practicing medicine or osteopathic medicine in the employment of the United States.¹⁰ The

Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) is responsible for licensing abortion clinics pursuant to ch. 390, F.S.

The termination of a pregnancy may not be performed after 15 weeks gestation¹¹ unless there is a medical necessity or the fetus has a fatal fetal abnormality. Specifically, an abortion may not be performed after 15 weeks unless two physicians certify in writing that, in reasonable medical judgment, the termination of the pregnancy is necessary to save the pregnant woman's life or avert a serious risk of substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a major bodily function of the pregnant woman, other than a psychological condition. If a second physician is not available, one physician may certify in writing to the medical necessity for legitimate emergency medical procedures for the termination of the pregnancy.¹² Additionally, an abortion may not be performed on a minor under the age of 18 without the consent of the minor's parent or guardian or without the minor obtaining authorization for the abortion from a court.¹³

Sections 390.0111(4) and 390.0112(3), F.S., provide that if a termination of pregnancy is performed during the third trimester or during viability, the physician who performs or induces the termination of pregnancy must use that degree of professional skill, care, and diligence to preserve the life and health of the fetus, which the physician would be required to exercise in order to preserve the life and health of any fetus intended to be born and not aborted. However, the woman's life and health constitute an overriding and superior consideration to the concern for the life and health of the fetus when the concerns are in conflict. A termination of pregnancy after viability in an emergency situation must be performed in a hospital.¹⁴

Legal Challenge of the 15-Week Time Frame

The portions of ch. 2022-69, L.O.F., related to abortion were challenged by Planned Parenthood (Planned Parenthood v. the State of Florida), and the Second Judicial Circuit Court issued a temporary injunction preventing the law from being enforced, stating that the law does not meet the constitutional standards established under Florida case law in *In re T.W.*, (551 So. 2d 1186 (Fla. 1989)). However, upon appeal, the injunction was automatically stayed and the First District Court of Appeal declined to reverse the automatic stay.

Planned Parenthood of Southwest and Central Florida appealed the order declining to reverse the stay to the Florida Supreme Court. Additionally, Planned Parenthood asked the Supreme Court to accept jurisdiction over the case. On Jan. 23, 2023, the Court both accepted jurisdiction of the case and denied the motion to vacate the automatic stay of the temporary injunction. Currently, the case resides at the Supreme Court. The Petitioner's initial brief on the merits of the case was served on Feb. 27, 2023, and the response to the brief is due 30 days from then.¹⁵

Florida Case Law on Abortion: *In re T.W.*

In the 1989 case *In re T.W.*, a Minor,¹⁶ the Florida Supreme Court upheld a lower court ruling striking the requirement that a minor obtain parental consent prior to obtaining an abortion. This ruling is the controlling case law for abortion law in Florida and is of consequence because, rather than standing the ruling upon the established federal case law of *Roe v. Wade* and *Casey*, the Florida Supreme Court determined that:

To be held constitutional, the instant statute must pass muster under both the federal and state constitutions. Were we to examine it solely under the federal Constitution, our analysis necessarily would track the decisions noted above. However, Florida is unusual in that it is one of at least four states having its own express constitutional provision guaranteeing an independent right to privacy,... and we opt to examine the statute first under the Florida Constitution. If it fails here, then no further analysis under federal law is required.

The Court determined that the right to privacy enshrined in Art. I, S. 23 of the Florida Constitution “is clearly implicated in a woman's decision of whether or not to continue her pregnancy.” Therefore, unlike under the Federal Constitution which requires a state only to show that a restriction on abortion is not “unduly burdensome,” in Florida the state must show that the abortion restriction “furthers a compelling state interest through the least intrusive means.”

The court further determined that “Under our Florida Constitution, the state's interest becomes compelling upon viability, as defined below. Until this point, the fetus is a highly specialized set of cells that is entirely dependent upon the mother for sustenance. No other member of society can provide this nourishment. The mother and fetus are so inextricably intertwined that their interests can be said to coincide. Upon viability, however, society becomes capable of sustaining the fetus, and its interest in preserving its potential for life thus becomes compelling.”

Florida Pregnancy Support and Services Network

Section 381.96, F.S., establishes the Florida Pregnancy Care Network (Network) defined as a “not-for-profit statewide alliance of pregnancy support organizations that provide pregnancy support and wellness services through a comprehensive system of care to women and their families.” The statute requires the DOH to contract with the network for the management and delivery of pregnancy support and wellness services to eligible clients and draws a distinction between pregnancy support services and wellness services. Pregnancy support services are services that promote and encourage childbirth, including:

- Direct client services, such as pregnancy testing, counseling, referral, training, and education for pregnant women and their families. A woman and her family shall continue to be eligible to receive direct client services for up to 12 months after the birth of the child.
- Program awareness activities, including a promotional campaign to educate the public about the pregnancy support services offered by the network and a website that provides information on the location of providers in the user’s area and other available community resources.

- Communication activities, including the operation and maintenance of a hotline or call center with a single statewide toll-free number that is available 24 hours a day for an eligible client to obtain the location and contact information for a pregnancy center located in the client's area.

Wellness services are services or activities intended to maintain and improve health or prevent illness and injury, including, but not limited to, high blood pressure screening, anemia testing, thyroid screening, cholesterol screening, diabetes screening, and assistance with smoking cessation.

Pregnancy support services are available to a pregnant woman or woman who suspects she is pregnant, and the family of such a woman, while wellness support services are available to any woman who seeks such services.

The section establishes contracting provisions which require the DOH to:

- Establish, implement, and monitor a comprehensive system of care through subcontractors to meet the pregnancy support and wellness needs of eligible clients.
- Establish and manage subcontracts with a sufficient number of providers to ensure the availability of pregnancy support and wellness services for eligible clients, and maintain and manage the delivery of such services throughout the contract period.
- Spend at least 90 percent of the contract funds on pregnancy support and wellness services.
- Offer wellness services through vouchers or other appropriate arrangements that allow the purchase of services from qualified health care providers.
- Require a background screening under s. 943.0542, F.S., for all paid staff and volunteers of a subcontractor if such staff or volunteers provide direct client services to an eligible client who is a minor or an elderly person or who has a disability.
- Annually monitor its subcontractors and specify the sanctions that shall be imposed for noncompliance with the terms of a subcontract.
- Subcontract only with providers that exclusively promote and support childbirth.
- Ensure that informational materials provided to an eligible client by a provider are current and accurate and cite the reference source of any medical statement included in such materials.

This section of statute specifies that services provided pursuant to the section must be provided in a non-coercive manner and may not include religious content.

The Comprehensive Family Planning Act

Section 381.0051, F.S., establishes the Comprehensive Family Planning Act (Act). The Act requires the DOH to implement a comprehensive family planning program which must include, but is not limited to:

- Comprehensive family planning education and counseling programs.
- Prescription for and provision of all medically recognized methods of contraception.
- Medical evaluation, including cytological examination and other appropriate laboratory studies.

- Treatment of physical complications other than pregnancy resulting from the use of contraceptive methods.

The program must provide services at locations and times readily available to the population served and must emphasize service to postpartum mothers. The services are to be available to anyone who desires them on a fee schedule based on the cost of service and the individual's ability to pay.¹⁷ Family planning and related health services are available in all 67 counties through local county health departments or contracted agencies.¹⁸

Minors are able to receive maternal health, contraceptive information, and services of a nonsurgical nature¹⁹ if the services are provided by a physician or by the DOH directly through the program and if the minor:

- Is married;
- Is a parent;
- Is pregnant;
- Has the consent of a parent or legal guardian; or
- May, in the opinion of the physician, suffer probable health hazards if such services are not provided.

Medical Abortion

Medical abortion is a two-step process that does not require surgical intervention. Medical abortions consist of a health care practitioner, usually a physician, providing a patient with mifepristone and misoprostol. The FDA has approved the use of these drugs during the first 70 days of a pregnancy under the following dosing regimen:²⁰

- 200 mg of mifepristone taken by mouth. This blocks progesterone, which is a hormone that is necessary for a pregnancy to continue. Without progesterone, the embryo or fetus detaches from the uterine wall.
- 24 to 48 hours after taking mifepristone: 800 mcg of misoprostol taken buccally (in the cheek pouch), at a location appropriate for the patient. This softens and dilates the cervix and causes uterine contractions that expel the detached embryo or fetus.
- Seven to fourteen days after taking mifepristone: follow-up visit with the health care provider to confirm that the abortion is complete.

Originally, the FDA required practitioners to dispense mifepristone only in clinics, medical offices, and hospitals.²¹ This necessitates an in-person visit to obtain the drugs. This requirement

discourages the use of telemedicine, although there is no express federal prohibition against using telemedicine for a medical abortion.

In April 2021, the FDA waived this in-person dispensing requirement for the duration of the COVID-19 federal public health emergency.²² This allowed patients to receive abortion-inducing drugs through the mail or other home delivery services. This increased the probability of prescribers using telemedicine to perform medical abortion in states where not prohibited by state law. On December 16, 2021, the FDA permanently removed the in-person dispensing requirement.²³

Telehealth

Telehealth is a mechanism for delivery of health care services. Health care professionals use telehealth as a platform to provide traditional health care services in a non-traditional manner. These services include, among others, preventative medicine and the treatment of chronic conditions.²⁴ Section 456.74, F.S., enacted in 2019, regulates the use of telehealth by Florida and out-of-state health care providers.

Current law broadly defines telehealth as the use of synchronous or asynchronous telecommunications technology by a telehealth provider to provide health care services, including, but not limited to:²⁵

- Assessment, diagnosis, consultation, treatment, and monitoring of a patient;
- Transfer of medical data;
- Patient and professional health-related education;
- Public health services; and
- Health administration.

A patient receiving telehealth services may be in any location at the time services are rendered and a telehealth provider may be in any location when providing telehealth services to a patient.

Health care services may be provided via telehealth by a Florida-licensed health care practitioner, a practitioner licensed under a multistate health care licensure compact of which Florida is a member,²⁶ or an out-of-state-health care provider who registers with the Department of Health.²⁷

Current law requires telehealth providers to meet the same standard of care required for in-person health care services to patients in this state. This ensures that a patient receives the same standard of care irrespective of the modality used by the health care professional to deliver the services.²⁸

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Abortion Restrictions

SB 300 amends several sections of the Florida Statutes, and creates one new section of law, relating to abortion.

The bill amends s. 390.0111, F.S., to prohibit a physician from knowingly performing or inducing an abortion after six weeks of gestation.²⁹ The bill maintains current-law exceptions to abortion time frames and applies them to the six-week prohibition, including exceptions for the life and health of the mother, for emergency situations, and for a fetus with a fatal fetal abnormality.

The bill adds one new exception for cases in which the pregnancy is the result of rape or incest and the gestational age of the fetus is not more than 15 weeks. In order to qualify for the exception for rape or incest, at the time a pregnant woman schedules or arrives for her appointment to obtain the abortion, she must provide a copy of a restraining order, police report, medical record, or other court order or documentation providing evidence that she is obtaining the abortion because she is the victim of rape or incest. If the woman is a minor, the bill requires that the physician report the incident of rape or incest to the central abuse hotline as required by s. 39.201, F.S.

The bill specifies that only an allopathic or osteopathic physician may perform or induce an abortion and that a physician may not use telehealth to perform an abortion, including, but not limited to, medical abortions. The bill also amends s. 456.47, F.S., to include the prohibition on the use of telehealth in the established practice standards for telehealth.

The bill prohibits medications intended for use in a medical abortion from being dispensed by anyone other than a physician and from being dispensed through the United States Postal Service or by any other courier or shipping service.

Additionally, the bill creates s. 286.31, F.S., to prohibit any person, educational institution, or governmental entity from using state funds³⁰ for a person to travel to another state to receive services that are intended to support an abortion. The bill defines:

- “Educational institution” to mean any public institutions under the control of a district school board, a charter school, a state university, a developmental research school, a Florida College System institution, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, the Florida Virtual School, private school readiness programs, voluntary prekindergarten programs, private K-12 schools, and private colleges and universities.
- “Governmental entity” to mean the state or any political subdivision thereof, including the executive, legislative, and judicial branches of government; the independent establishments of the state, counties, municipalities, districts, authorities, boards, or commissions; and any agencies that are subject to ch. 286, F.S.

The bill provides exceptions to this prohibition when the person, governmental entity, or educational institution is required by federal law to expend state funds for such a purpose and for cases of a medical necessity for legitimate emergency medical procedures for termination of the pregnancy to save the pregnant woman's life or to avert a serious risk of imminent substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a major bodily function of the pregnant woman, other than a psychological condition.

Expansion of the Florida Pregnancy Care Network

SB 300 amends s. 381.986, F.S., to expand the Network.

The bill amends to the definition of "eligible client" to add eligibility for:

- Women who have given birth in the previous 12 months; and
- Parents, or legal guardians, for up to 12 months after the birth of a child or the adoption of a child younger than three years of age.

The bill also amends the definition of "pregnancy support services" to be "pregnancy and parenting support services" and makes the following services available:

- Nonmedical material assistance that improves the pregnancy or parenting situation of families, including, but not limited to, clothing, car seats, cribs, formula, and diapers; and
- Counseling or mentoring, education materials, and classes regarding pregnancy, parenting, adoption, life skills, and employment readiness.

The bill requires the DOH's contract with the Network to require the Network to spend at least 85 percent of contract funds on pregnancy and parenting support services and to exclude network awareness activities from the services that qualify to make up the required 85 percent.³¹

Additionally, by July 1, 2024, and annually thereafter, the bill requires the DOH to report to the Governor and the Legislature on the amount and types of services provided by the network; the expenditures for such services; and the number of, and demographic information for, women, parents, and families served by the network. The bill also requires DOH's contract with the Network to ensure the DOH is provided with all information necessary for the annual report detailed below.

Funding Provisions

In addition to any funds appropriated in the General Appropriations Act, SB 300 appropriates \$5 million in recurring funds from the General Revenue Fund (GR) to the DOH for the purpose of implementing the Family Planning Program, specifically subsections (3), (4), and (6) and s. 381.0051, F.S.

The bill also appropriates \$25 million in recurring GR funds to the DOH for the purpose of implementing the expanded Florida Pregnancy Care Network.

Clean-Up Provisions

SB 300 repeals s. 390.01112, F.S., which restricts abortion at the point of viability. This section is obsolete and is not used. Additionally, the bill strikes rule language requiring AHCA rules for abortion clinics to not impose an unconstitutional burden on a woman's freedom to decide whether to terminate her pregnancy. If the bill becomes effective due to one of the effective date triggers (detailed below), this provision will no longer be applicable as there will no longer be constitutional restraints on the ability for the Legislature to restrict abortion.

Effective Date

Other than the expansion of the Network and the appropriation provisions, which are effective upon becoming law, SB 300 provides that the bill is effective 30 days after one of the following occurs:

- A decision by the Florida Supreme Court holding that the right to privacy enshrined in s. 23, Article I of the State Constitution does not include a right to abortion;
- A decision by the Florida Supreme Court in *Planned Parenthood v. State*, SC2022-1050, that allows the prohibition on abortions after 15 weeks in s. 390.0111(1), F.S., to remain in effect, including a decision approving, in whole or in part, the First District Court of Appeal's decision under review or a decision discharging jurisdiction;
- An amendment to the State Constitution clarifying that s. 23, Article I of the State Constitution does not include a right to abortion; or
- A decision from the Florida Supreme Court after March 7, 2023, receding, in whole or in part, from *In re T.W.*, 551 So. 2d 1186 (Fla. 1989), *North Fla. Women's Health v. State*, 866 So. 2d 612 (Fla. 2003), or *Gainesville Woman Care, LLC v. State*, 210 So. 3d 1243 (Fla. 2017).

(d) Offer wellness services through vouchers or other appropriate arrangements that allow the purchase of services from qualified health care providers.

(e) Require a background screening under s. 943.0542 for all paid staff and volunteers of a subcontractor if such staff or volunteers provide direct client services to an eligible client who is a minor or an elderly person or who has a disability.

(f) Annually monitor its subcontractors and specify the sanctions that shall be imposed for noncompliance with the terms of a subcontract.

(g) Subcontract only with providers that exclusively promote and support childbirth.

(h) Ensure that informational materials provided to an eligible client by a provider are current and accurate and cite the reference source of any medical statement included in such materials.

(i) Ensure that the department is provided with all



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information necessary for the report required under subsection

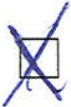

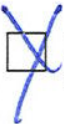

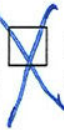

I. Summary:

CS/CS/SB 306 creates the Catalytic Converter Antitheft Act, which addresses tampering with and theft of a catalytic converter, a device the bill defines as an emission control device that is designed to be installed and operate in a motor vehicle to convert toxic gases and pollutants in the motor vehicle's exhaust system into less toxic substances via chemical reaction. There have been numerous incidents throughout the United States of catalytic converters being detached from motor vehicles and stolen due to precious metals contained in the devices.

The bill requires recordkeeping and records inspection and disclosure regarding certain transactions involving a catalytic converter, and punishes certain unlawful transactions involving a catalytic converter. Specifically, the bill:

- Defines key terms;
- Limits purchase of a detached catalytic converter to a registered secondary metals recycler and requires that this recycler comply with statutory recordkeeping and other requirements;
- Provides that it is a third degree felony to knowingly possess, purchase, sell, or install a stolen catalytic converter, a catalytic converter removed from a stolen vehicle, a new or detached catalytic converter from which specified information has been removed, or a detached catalytic converter without proof of ownership (with exceptions).
- Provides that it is a second degree felony to knowingly import, manufacture, purchase for the purpose of reselling, etc., a counterfeit, fake, or nonfunctional catalytic converter;

- Provides that proof that a person was in possession of two or more detached catalytic converters, unless satisfactorily explained, gives rise to an inference that the person in possession of the catalytic converters knew or should have known that the catalytic converters may have been stolen or fraudulently obtained; and
- Prohibits a secondary metals recycler from processing or removing from the recycler's place of business a catalytic converter the recycler has purchased for a period of 10 business days after the date of purchase. This prohibition does not apply to a purchase from another secondary metals recycler, a salvage motor vehicle dealer, or a person or entity except under s. 538.22, F.S.

The Legislature's Office of Economic and Demographic Research preliminarily estimated that the original bill would have a "positive indeterminate" prison bed impact (an unquantifiable increase in prison beds). See Section V. Fiscal Impact Statement.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2023.

II. Present Situation:

Theft of Catalytic Converter

The U.S. Justice Department has described a catalytic converter as "a component of an automotive vehicle's exhaust device that reduce the toxic gas and pollutants from a vehicle's internal combustion engine into safe emissions."¹ The reason why catalytic converters are tampered with (detached) and stolen is the high volume of precious metals in the center or "core" of the converter, "especially the precious metals palladium, platinum, and rhodium."²

Some of these precious metals are more valuable per ounce than gold and their value has been increasing in recent years. The black-market price for catalytic converters can be above \$1,000 each, depending on the type of vehicle and what state it is from. They can be stolen in less than a minute. Additionally, catalytic converters often lack unique serial numbers, VIN information, or other distinctive identification features, making them difficult to trace to their lawful owner. Thus, the theft of catalytic converters has become increasingly popular because of their value, relative ease to steal, and their lack of identifying markings.³

There do not appear to be any official national or statewide data on the number of catalytic converter thefts. However, the National Insurance Crime Bureau, a not-for-profit organization that assists insurers, law enforcement, and representatives of the public in preventing and combatting insurance fraud and crime, reports: “In 2018, there were 1,298 catalytic converter thefts for which a claim was filed. In 2019, it was 3,389 thefts with a claim. In 2020, catalytic converter theft claims jumped massively to 14,433, a 325% increase in a single year.”⁴

The Congressional Research Service reports that “the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration ... issued a Federal Motor Vehicle Theft Standard, which requires manufacturers to apply or stamp a car’s unique Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) on the engine, transmission, and a dozen other major vehicle parts so law enforcement agencies can better identify vehicles from which the parts were stolen. However, the standard does not require automakers to stamp identification numbers on catalytic converters.”⁵

Federal Law on Tampering with Catalytic Converters

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), tampering with a catalytic converter “is illegal under federal law[.]” The EPA cites to a 1990 amendment to Part A of Title II of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. s. 7521-7554) which was codified at 42 U.S.C. s. 7522(a)(3)), and which broadened earlier federal tampering provisions to apply them to “everyone, including car owners.”⁶

The Congressional Research Service cites the following federal criminal statutes that authorize federal law enforcement agencies to investigate vehicle or vehicle part theft but notes this theft does not appear to be a priority for these agencies:

- 18 U.S.C. s. 2312, which punishes transportation of a stolen motor vehicle in interstate commerce;
- 18 U.S.C. s. 2313, which punishes receiving, possessing, concealing, storing, bartering, selling, or disposing of a stolen car that has crossed state lines;
- 18 U.S.C. s. 2321, which punishes buying, receiving, possessing, or obtaining control of a car part, with the intent to sell or otherwise dispose of it, if the person knows that the identification number was removed, obliterated, tampered with, or altered; and
- 18 U.S.C. s. 2322, which punishes operating, owning, maintaining, or controlling a chop shop or conducting operations in a chop shop.⁷

However, the sale of vehicles that have had the emission control system removed, disabled, or tampered with may be further governed by state or local laws.” *Id.*

National Motor Vehicle Title Information System and Catalytic Converter Theft

The National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) was established by federal law “to protect consumers from fraud and unsafe vehicles and to keep stolen vehicles from being resold.”⁸ The U.S. Department of Justice says the NMVTIS is “a tool that assists local, state, and federal law enforcement in investigating, deterring, and preventing vehicle-related crimes.”⁹ The NMVTIS is “[a]dministered by the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators” and “requires regular reporting by scrap recyclers and salvage yards”¹⁰

Florida Law

Section 812.014(1), F.S., provides that a person commits theft if he or she knowingly obtains or uses, or endeavors to obtain or use, the property of another with intent to, either temporarily or permanently:

- Deprive the other person of a right to the property or a benefit from the property; or
- Appropriate the property to his or her own use or to the use of any person not entitled to the use of the property.

The statute, in part, provides for escalating punishment for grand theft based on the property value range applicable to the value of the property stolen in the theft.

Grand theft is theft of property valued at \$750 or more. If the property stolen is valued at:

- \$750 or more, but less than \$5,000, it is grand theft of the third degree and a Level 2¹¹ third degree felony;¹²
- \$5,000 or more, but less than \$10,000, it is grand theft of the third degree and a Level 3 third degree felony;¹³
- \$10,000 or more, but less than \$20,000, it is grand theft of the third degree and a Level 4 third degree felony;¹⁴

- \$20,000 or more, but less than \$100,000, it is grand theft of the second degree and a Level 6 second degree felony;¹⁵ and
- \$100,000 or more, it is grand theft of the first degree and a Level 7 first degree felony.¹⁶

It is also grand theft of the third degree, a third degree felony, to commit theft of any item specified in s. 812.014(1)(c)1.-13., F.S. (e.g., theft of a will, firearm, fire extinguisher, or stop sign).¹⁷

A catalytic converter is not an item specified in s. 812.014(1)(c)1.-13., F.S., so theft of a catalytic converter would be punished as either petit theft or grand theft based on the value of the device. For example, if the value of the catalytic converter stolen is \$1,000, the theft of this device is a grand theft of the third degree, which is a Level 2 third degree felony. The offender who commits this offense is unlikely to receive a prison sentence absent the commission of an additional offense, prior criminal history, or other factors that score enough sentence points to make the offender eligible for a prison sentence.¹⁸

Tampering with a Catalytic Converter and Related Offenses

Section 316.2935, F.S., addresses a motor vehicle's air pollution control device or system and tampering with that device. This section defines "tampering" as the dismantling, removal, or rendering ineffective of any air pollution control device or system which has been installed on a motor vehicle by the vehicle manufacturer except to replace such device or system with a device or system equivalent in design and function to the part that was originally installed on the motor vehicle.¹⁹

At the time of sale, lease, or transfer of title of a motor vehicle, the seller, lessor, or transferor must certify in writing to the purchaser, lessee, or transferee that the air pollution control equipment of the motor vehicle has not been tampered with by the seller, lessor, or transferor or their agents, employees, or other representatives.²⁰ A licensed motor vehicle dealer must also visually observe those air pollution control devices listed by rule of the Florida Department of

Environmental Protection (DEP),²¹ and certify that they are in place, and appear properly connected and undamaged.²²

It is a second degree misdemeanor²³ (first violation) or first degree misdemeanor²⁴ (second or subsequent violation) for any person or motor vehicle dealer to knowingly and willfully offer or display for retail sale or lease, sell, lease, or transfer title to, a motor vehicle in Florida that has been subject to tampering.²⁵

It is a noncriminal traffic infraction for a person to operate any gasoline-powered motor vehicle, except a motorcycle, moped, scooter, or an imported nonconforming motor vehicle which has received a one-time exemption from federal emission control requirements under 40 C.F.R. 85, subpart P,²⁶ on the public roads and streets of this state which emits visible emissions from the exhaust pipe for more than a continuous period of 5 seconds. Further, a person may not operate on the public roads or streets of this state any motor vehicle that has been subject to tampering.²⁷

Salvage Motor Vehicle Dealer Requirements Relating to Major Component Parts

Section 319.30(j), F.S., defines a “major component part.” Relevant to motor vehicles and trucks, this definition includes a catalytic converter.²⁸ Section 319.30, F.S., in part, requires a salvage motor vehicle dealer to record the date of purchase of a major component part and the name, address, and personal identification card number of the person selling such part, as well as the vehicle identification number, if available. The dealer must also obtain such documentation as may be required by s. 319.30(2), F.S., which, in part, requires the dealer to notify the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System and provide certain information when a motor vehicle is sold, transported, delivered to, or received by a salvage motor vehicle dealer or a derelict motor vehicle is sold, transported, or delivered to a licensed salvage motor vehicle dealer.²⁹

Recordkeeping Requirements for Secondary Metals Recyclers

Section 538.19, F.S., requires a secondary metals recycler to maintain a legible paper record and to maintain and transmit an electronic record³⁰ of all purchase transactions to which such secondary metals recycler is a party. This section specifies when the electronic record must be

submitted to the appropriate law enforcement official. This electronic record does not contain the price paid for the items; the original transaction form must include the price paid for the items.³¹

The following information must be maintained on the form approved by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for each purchase transaction:

- The name and address of the secondary metals recycler.
- The name, initials, or other identification of the individual entering the information on the ticket.
- The date and time of the transaction.
- The weight, quantity, or volume, and a description of the type of regulated metals property purchased in a purchase transaction.
- The amount of consideration given in a purchase transaction for the regulated metals property.
- A signed statement from the person delivering the regulated metals property stating that she or he is the rightful owner of, or is entitled to sell, the regulated metals property being sold.
- The distinctive number from the personal identification card of the person delivering the regulated metals property to the secondary metals recycler.
- A description of the person from whom the regulated metals property was acquired, including:
 - Full name, current residential address, workplace, and home and work phone numbers.
 - Height, weight, date of birth, race, gender, hair color, eye color, and any other identifying marks.
 - The right thumbprint, free of smudges and smears.
 - Vehicle description to include the make, model, and tag number of the vehicle and trailer of the person selling the regulated metals property.
 - Any other information required by the form approved by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.
- A photograph, videotape, or digital image of the regulated metals being sold.
- A photograph, videotape, or similar likeness of the person receiving consideration in which such person's facial features are clearly visible.³²

A secondary metals recycler complies with the informational requirements of this section if it maintains an electronic database containing the information previously described as long as that information, along with an electronic oath of ownership with an electronic signature of the seller of the secondary metals being purchased by the secondary metals recyclers and an electronic image of the seller's right thumbprint that has no smudges and smears, can be downloaded onto a paper form in the image of the form approved by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.³³

A secondary metals recycler must maintain or cause to be maintained the information required by this section for not less than 3 years from the date of the purchase transaction.³⁴

Unlawful Acts by a Secondary Metal Recycler That May Involve Catalytic Converter Theft

Section 538.26, F.S., addresses unlawful acts by a secondary metal recycler. A secondary metal recycler is a person who:

- Is engaged, from a fixed location, in the business of purchase transactions or gathering or obtaining ferrous or nonferrous metals that have served their original economic purpose or is in the business of performing the manufacturing process by which ferrous metals or nonferrous metals are converted into raw material products consisting of prepared grades and having an existing or potential economic value; or
- Has facilities for performing the manufacturing process by which ferrous metals or nonferrous metals are converted into raw material products consisting of prepared grades and having an existing or potential economic value, other than by the exclusive use of hand tools, by methods including, without limitation, processing, sorting, cutting, classifying, cleaning, baling, wrapping, shredding, shearing, or changing the physical form or chemical content thereof.

With some exclusions, “regulated metals property” is any item composed primarily of any nonferrous metals.³⁵ “Restricted regulated metals property” are any regulated metals property listed in s. 538.26(5)(b), F.S., the sale of which is restricted as provided in s. 538.26(5)(a), F.S.³⁶

Among the regulated metals property listed in s. 538.26(5)(b), F.S., as restricted regulated metals property is a catalytic converter or any nonferrous part of a catalytic converter unless purchased as part of a motor vehicle.³⁷ It is a first degree misdemeanor for a secondary metals recycler to purchase or allow the purchase of this device unless the recycler obtains reasonable proof that the seller:

- Owns such property. Reasonable proof of ownership may include, but is not limited to, a receipt or bill of sale; or
- Is an employee, agent, or contractor of the property’s owner who is authorized to sell the property on behalf of the owner. Reasonable proof of authorization to sell the property includes, but is not limited to, a signed letter on the owner’s letterhead, dated no later than 90 days before the sale, authorizing the seller to sell the property.³⁸

It is a third degree felony or second degree felony (third or subsequent violation) for a secondary metals recycler to knowingly and intentionally:

- Violate s. 538.20, F.S., relating to law enforcement inspection of regulated property and records, or s. 538.21, F.S., relating to law enforcement’s issuance of a hold notice to a secondary metals recycler on regulated metals property in the recycler’s possession that law enforcement reasonably believes is stolen;

- Purchase restricted regulated metals property from any seller who presents such property for sale at the registered location of the secondary metals recycler when such property was not transported in a motor vehicle; or
- Accept cash in any amount for the purchase of restricted regulated metals property or in a manner other than specified in s. 538.235(3), F.S.³⁹

Any person who knowingly gives false verification of ownership or who gives a false or altered identification and who receives money or other consideration from a secondary metals recycler in return for regulated metals property commits:

- A third degree felony if the value of the money or other consideration received is less than \$300; or
- A second degree felony if the value of the money or other consideration received is \$300 or more.⁴⁰

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill creates s. 860.142, F.S., the title of which is the “Catalytic Converter Antitheft Act.” The bill addresses tampering with and theft of a catalytic converter, a device the bill defines as an emission control device that is designed to be installed and operate in a motor vehicle to convert toxic gases and pollutants in the motor vehicle’s exhaust system into less toxic substances via chemical reaction.

The bill provides that a person may not knowingly purchase a detached catalytic converter⁴¹ unless he or she is a registered secondary metals recycler.

The bill requires a registered secondary metals recycler who purchases a detached catalytic converter to comply with recordkeeping requirements in s. 538.19, F.S., and other requirements in s. 538.26, F.S.⁴² The recycler is subject to first degree misdemeanor, third degree felony, or second degree felony penalties for noncompliance, depending on the requirement or number of violations.⁴³

The bill provides that it is a third degree felony for a person to knowingly possess, purchase, sell, or install a:

- Stolen catalytic converter;
- Catalytic converter that has been removed from a stolen motor vehicle;
- New or detached catalytic converter from which the manufacturer’s part identification number, aftermarket identification number, or owner-applied number has been removed, altered, or defaced; or

- Detached catalytic converter without proof of ownership, unless the person is a registered secondary metals recycler, a salvage motor vehicle dealer, or meets the criteria for exemption provided in s. 538.22, F.S.⁴⁴

The bill provides that proof that a person was in possession of two or more detached catalytic converters, unless satisfactorily explained, gives rise to an inference that the person in possession of the catalytic converters knew or should have known that the catalytic converters may have been stolen or fraudulently obtained.⁴⁵

The bill also creates s. 860.142, F.S., which provides that it is a second degree felony for a person to knowingly import, manufacture, purchase for the purpose of reselling or installing, sell, offer for sale, or install, or reinstall in a motor vehicle a counterfeit,⁴⁶ fake,⁴⁷ or nonfunctional catalytic converter.⁴⁸

The bill also amends s. 538.26, F.S., to prohibit a secondary metals recycler from processing or removing from the recycler's place of business a detached catalytic converter the recycler has purchased for a period of 10 business days after the date of purchase. This prohibition does not apply to a purchase from another secondary metals recycler, a salvage motor vehicle dealer, or a person or entity exempt under s. 538.22, F.S.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2023.

IV. Constitutional Issues:

A. Municipality/County Mandates Restrictions:

The bill does not appear to require cities and counties to expend funds or limit their authority to raise revenue or receive state-shared revenues as specified by Art. VII, s. 18, of the Florida Constitution.

The Criminal Justice Impact Conference, which provides the final, official estimate of the prison bed impact, if any, of legislation, has not yet reviewed the bill. The Legislature's Office of Economic and Demographic Research (EDR) preliminarily estimated that the original bill would have a "positive indeterminate" prison bed impact (an unquantifiable increase in prison beds).⁴⁹ According to the EDR, there is no data on how many stolen catalytic converters have been sold in the manner described in the newly-created felonies created by the bill, "nor is there data available on the sales of counterfeit, detached, fake, or junk-filled catalytic converters."⁵⁰

This bill creates sections 860.142 and 860.147 of the Florida Statutes.

IX. Additional Information:**A. Committee Substitute – Statement of Substantial Changes:**

(Summarizing differences between the Committee Substitute and the prior version of the bill.)

CS/CS by Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice on March 14, 2023:

The committee substitute:

- Limits purchase of a detached catalytic converter to a registered secondary metals recycler and requires that this recycler comply with statutory recordkeeping and other requirements;
- Provides that it is a third degree felony to knowingly possess, purchase, sell, or install a stolen catalytic converter, a catalytic converter removed from a stolen vehicle, a new or detached catalytic converter from which specified information has been removed, or a detached catalytic converter without proof of ownership (with exceptions);
- Provides that it is a second degree felony to knowingly import, manufacture, purchase for the purpose of reselling, etc., a counterfeit, fake, or nonfunctional catalytic converter;
- Provides that proof that a person was in possession of two or more detached catalytic converters, unless satisfactorily explained, gives rise to an inference that the person in possession of the catalytic converters knew or should have known that the catalytic converters may have been stolen or fraudulently obtained; and
- Prohibits a secondary metals recycler from processing or removing from the recycler's place of business a catalytic converter the recycler has purchased for a period of 10 business days after the date of purchase. This prohibition does not apply to a purchase from another secondary metals recycler, a salvage motor vehicle dealer, or a person or entity exempt under s. 538.22, F.S.

CS by Criminal Justice on February 14, 2023:

The CS prohibits a secondary metals recycler from processing or removing from the recycler's place of business a catalytic converter the recycler has purchased for a period

I. Summary:

SB 508 revises three statutes that govern admission to, and participation in, the state’s “problem-solving courts.” The problem-solving courts are pre-trial intervention court programs that afford a defendant the opportunity to participate in getting the help he or she needs and avoid a criminal conviction. This bill expands eligibility for pretrial intervention programs, creates consistency within the criteria of the programs, and revises data reporting requirements for the programs.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2023.

II. Present Situation:

Problem-solving Courts

Florida’s “problem-solving courts” are unique among the trial and appellate courts in the state. They are specifically designed to address the root causes of why people are involved in the criminal justice system and to help those people receive the treatment they need to leave the system. Presently, there are more than 185 problem-solving courts operating in the state.¹ While participation in these court programs is voluntary, there is a list of factors, such as the commission of violent crimes, which can disqualify someone from participating.

Rather than operate in the traditional adversarial model, problem-solving courts provide non-adversarial proceedings with a dedicated judge who holds each participant accountable for his or her actions. The courts also provide a broad-based problem-solving team made up of case managers, attorneys, treatment professionals, even law enforcement and correctional officers,

and a guardian ad litem, if necessary.² The programs require regular court appearances by the participants and the length of the program is often, though not always, determined by the progress the participant makes as measured against specific guidelines.³

The problem-solving courts currently include adult drug courts, juvenile drug courts, dependency drug courts, veterans' courts, mental health courts, a community court, and a delinquency pretrial intervention court program.^{4,5}

Section 948.08, F.S., addresses *felony* pretrial intervention programs while s. 948.16, F.S., establishes *misdemeanor* pretrial intervention programs.

Treatment-based Drug Court Programs (Section 1)

Authorization, Admission, Disqualifying Criteria

Each county is authorized to fund a treatment-based drug court program for people in the justice system who have a substance abuse problem.⁶ Under current law, participation is voluntary, but admission is not guaranteed.

Previously Rejected Offer

Pursuant to s. 948.08(6)(c)1., F.S., the court or a state attorney may deny a defendant entry into the program if he or she was previously offered admission to the program and the defendant rejected that offer on the record.⁷

Dealing or Selling Controlled Substances

Pursuant to 948.08(6)(c)2., F.S., if the state attorney believes the defendant was involved in the dealing and selling of controlled substances, a court will hold a preadmission hearing. If the state attorney establishes by a preponderance of the evidence that the defendant was involved in dealing or selling controlled substances, the court is required to deny the defendant admission into the program.

Program Coordinator, Data Reporting Requirements

If the Legislature appropriates sufficient funding annually, each judicial circuit must establish at least one coordinator position for the treatment-based drug court program within the state courts system. Among other assigned tasks, the coordinator is responsible for coordinating the

responsibilities of the participating agencies and providers as well as provide program evaluation and accountability.

Each judicial circuit is required to report client-level and programmatic data to the Office of the State Court Administrator (OSCA) annually for program evaluation. Client-level data includes cataloguing primary offenses that resulted in drug court referral or sentence and other details. Programmatic data includes referral and screening procedures, eligibility criteria, and similar categories.

According to the OSCA, it does not perform program evaluations such that it does not need to receive the client-level data from the circuits. The OSCA has stated that requiring this data collection also puts an unnecessary burden on the circuits to report the data and an unnecessary burden on the OSCA to collect the data.⁸

In contrast, the mental health court programs require each *program*, not each *circuit*, to gather client-level data and programmatic information for evaluation purposes. Of that information, only certain program information regarding client admissions and terminations are reported to the OSCA each year.

Pretrial Intervention Program for *Felony* Offenses (Section 2)

Section 948.08, F.S., establishes three categories of pretrial intervention programs for felony offenses:

- Substance abuse education and treatment intervention, including a drug court program.
- Veterans treatment court program for veterans and service members.
- Mental health court program.

Substance Abuse Education and Treatment Intervention Program

Program Duration – Not Less than 1 Year

Section 948.08(6)(b), F.S., states that a person admitted into a pretrial substance abuse education and treatment intervention program is admitted for a period “of not less than 1 year in duration” if he or she meets certain criteria.

Possible Disqualifying Criteria – Previously Violent Crime or Rejection of Previous Offer for Admission

Section 948.08(6)(b)3., F.S., lists an offense that will prohibit a defendant from entering a treatment-based drug court program: the defendant has been charged with a crime involving violence which includes, but is not limited to, murder, sexual battery, robbery, carjacking, home-invasion robbery, or any other crime involving violence.

As discussed above, pursuant to s. 948.08(6)(c)1., F.S., the court or a state attorney may deny a defendant entry into the program if he or she was previously offered admission to the program and the defendant rejected that offer on the record.

Mental Health Court Program Eligibility

Section 948.08(8)(a), F.S., lists the requirements for a defendant to be eligible for voluntary admission into a pretrial mental health court program. The defendant must be identified as having a mental illness, not have been convicted of a felony, but is charged with certain crimes.

Pretrial Substance Abuse Education and Treatment Intervention Program for Misdemeanor Offenses (Section 3)

Section 948.16(1)(a), F.S., establishes the criteria for a defendant to participate in a misdemeanor pretrial substance abuse education and treatment program, misdemeanor pretrial veterans treatment intervention program, and a misdemeanor pretrial mental health court program. To qualify for admission into the substance abuse education and treatment intervention, a defendant may not have been convicted of a felony. In addition to being identified as having a substance abuse problem, these offenses, for which the defendant is currently charged, will permit him or her to be considered for admission into the program:

- A nonviolent, nontraffic-related misdemeanor;
- A misdemeanor possession of a controlled substance or drug paraphernalia under chapter 893, F.S.;
- Prostitution under s. 796.07, F.S.;
- Possession of alcohol while under 21 years of age under s. 562.111, F.S.;
- Possession of a controlled substance without a valid prescription under s. 499.03, F.S.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill amends three statutes dealing with pretrial intervention programs. The bill makes the eligibility criteria provisions more consistent with each other, revises the data reporting requirements for treatment-based drug court programs, and expands the current eligibility requirements for admission into a misdemeanor pretrial treatment-based drug court program.

Treatment-based Drug Court Programs (Sections 1 & 2)

Admission for Participation is Expanded

Under existing law, a defendant may be denied an opportunity to be admitted into a pre-trial treatment-based drug court program by the court or the prosecution if he or she previously rejected the opportunity to do so before trial. Under the bill, persons who reject opportunities to participate are no longer subject to being barred from participation for that reason.

Data Reporting Requirements Shift from Circuit Responsibility to the Program

The bill adds a new provision that removes the responsibility of managing the collection of data from the circuits and places the responsibility on the treatment-based drug court program. In addition, each program is now required to annually report the programmatic information and the

aggregate data regarding the number of admissions and terminations, by type of termination, to the OSCA. The collection and reporting requirements will be consistent with the requirements placed on mental health court program reporting requirements.

Pretrial Intervention Program for *Felony* Offenses (Section 2)

Substance Abuse Education and Treatment Intervention Program

Duration Revised

The substance abuse education and treatment intervention program mandatory duration period “of not less than 1 year” is deleted and the court is given discretion as to how long a defendant needs to remain in the program, based upon his or her clinical needs. This makes the duration period consistent with the duration, described in s. 948.08(8)(a), F.S., for participation in a mental health court program.

Criteria – Previous Violent Crime Criteria Deleted

The bill deletes the language that excluded a defendant from participation for having been charged with a crime of violence. As revised, a defendant is excluded from participating only if he or she is currently charged with a crime of violence. By making this change, the statute becomes consistent with eligibility requirements contained in other problem-solving court statutes.

Mental Health Court Program Eligibility

The bill is amended to delete the provision that a defendant seeking admission to a pretrial mental health court program has not been convicted of a felony. This will expand the option for more people to enter the program who would previously be ineligible. The language would also be consistent with the criteria for entering a pretrial treatment-based drug court program.

Misdemeanor Pretrial Substance Abuse Education and Treatment Intervention Program (Section 3)

The bill expands who may be eligible for a misdemeanor pretrial substance abuse education and treatment intervention program. By eliminating the qualifying offenses currently listed in statute and opening the criteria to any person charged with a misdemeanor, but who has not previously been convicted of a felony, more people will be eligible to participate in the program. This would make the eligibility criteria consistent with the criteria for pretrial misdemeanor veterans programs and mental health programs.

“Program Administrator” Terminology Change for Consistency with the Mental Health Statute

The term “program administrator” is added in ss. 948.08(6)(e), 948.08(7)(c), and 948.16(4), F.S., for consistent referencing to the person in charge of the problem-solving court programs in these statutes.

The effective date of the bill is July 1, 2023.

The OSCA states that the changes to the data reporting requirements for the treatment-based drug court programs will reduce the workloads for the judicial circuits and the OSCA. Additionally, by reducing how long a defendant must participate in the drug court program from the current 1-year period to a time based on his or her clinical needs would possibly reduce the courts' workload if participants complete the program in less than 1 year. Finally, the OSCA does not expect the proposals that will increase the number of people who may become eligible to participate in the programs to increase court workload because admissions are discretionary and the capacity for the number of participants is limited.⁹

When ~~neither~~ s. 948.08(6)(c)1. does not apply nor 2. applies, the court may order an eligible individual to enter into a pretrial treatment-based drug court program only upon written agreement by the individual, which

shall include a statement that the individual understands the requirements of the program and the potential sanctions for noncompliance.

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE - Substantial Changes

I. Summary:

CS/SB 558 creates a new designation of “qualified medication aide” (QMA) for certified nursing assistants (CNA) who work in a nursing home and meet specified licensure and training requirements. The bill allows a nursing home to authorize a registered nurse (RN) working in the nursing home to delegate medication administration to a QMA who is working under the direct supervision¹ of the RN.

In order to be designated as a QMA, a CNA must hold a clear and active certification as CNA for at least one year preceding the delegation; complete 40 hours of training that consists of the six-hour training course currently required for a CNA to administer medication in a home health setting and a 34-hour course developed by the Board of Nursing (BON) specific to QMAs; and successfully complete a supervised clinical practice in medication administration conducted in the nursing home.

The bill amends several sections of law related to the delegation of tasks to CNAs to conform to the changes made in the bill. The bill also specifies that CNAs performing the duties of a QMA may not be counted toward staffing requirements for nursing homes.

This bill has an indeterminate fiscal impact on the Florida Department of Health. *See* Section V of this analysis.

The bill takes effect on July 1, 2023.

II. Present Situation:

Nursing Homes

Nursing homes in Florida are licensed under Part II of ch. 400, F.S., and provide 24 hour a day nursing care, case management, health monitoring, personal care, nutritional meals and special diets, physical, occupational, and speech therapy, social activities and respite care for those who are ill or physically infirm.² Nursing homes are regulated by the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA). Currently there are 708 nursing homes licensed in Florida.³

Certified Nursing Assistants

Florida's regulations of certified nursing assistants (CNA) is found in Part II of ch. 464, F.S. Section 464.201(5), F.S., defines the practice of a CNA as providing care and assisting persons with tasks relating to the activities of daily living. Activities of daily living include tasks associated with: personal care, maintaining mobility, nutrition and hydration, toileting and elimination, assistive devices, safety and cleanliness, data gathering, reporting abnormal signs and symptoms, postmortem care, patient socialization and reality orientation, end-of-life care, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and emergency care, patients' rights, documentation of nursing-assistant services, and other tasks that a CNA may perform after training.⁴

A CNA can work in a nursing home, an assisted living facility, other community-based settings, a hospital, or a private home under general supervision.⁵ The Board of Nursing (BON), within the Department of Health (DOH), certifies CNAs, who must, among other qualifications, hold a high school diploma or equivalent, complete a 120-hour BON-approved training program, and pass a nursing assistant competency exam, which includes written and practical portions.⁶ A CNA must biennially complete 24 hours of in-service training to maintain certification.⁷

The BON establishes the general scope of practice for CNAs. A CNA performs services under the general supervision⁸ of a registered nurse (RN) or licensed practical nurse (LPN).⁹ A CNA may perform the following:

- Personal care services, such as bathing, dressing grooming, and light housekeeping;
- Tasks associated with maintaining mobility, such as ambulating, transferring, positioning, lifting, and performing range of motion exercises;
- Nutrition and hydration tasks, such as feeding or assisting with eating and drinking;
- Tasks associated with elimination, such as toileting, providing catheter care, and emptying or changing ostomy bags;
- Tasks associated with using assistive devices;
- Maintaining the environment and resident safety;
- Taking measurements and gathering data, i.e. pulse, blood, pressure, height, and weight;
- Recognition and reporting abnormal resident findings, signs, and symptoms;
- Post mortem care;
- Tasks associated with resident socialization, leisure activities, reality orientation, and validation techniques;
- Tasks associated with end of life care;
- Performing basic first aid, CPR, and emergency care;
- Tasks associated with compliance with resident's rights; and
- Documentation of CNA services provided to the resident.

A CNA may not work independently and may not perform any tasks that require specialized nursing knowledge, judgment, or skills.

Medication Administration by a CNA

Current law allows a RN to delegate medication administration duties to a CNA but only in a home health care setting or in a local county detention facility.¹⁰ Specifically, a CNA may administer oral, transdermal, ophthalmic, otic, rectal, inhaled, enteral, or topical prescriptions if the CNA has completed a six-hour initial training course approved by the BON and has been found competent to administer medication to a patient in a safe and sanitary manner.¹¹ Both the training and the competency determination must be conducted by a RN.¹² Additionally, a CNA must satisfactorily complete two hours of annual in-service training to maintain his or her authorization to administer medications. BON rules require the six-hour course to include:

- A glossary of common terminology for labeling of legend medications.
- Safe administration of oral, transdermal, ophthalmic, otic, rectal, inhaled, enteral, and topical prescription and over-the-counter medications.
- Record keeping and documentation of medication administration.
- Safe storage and proper disposal of medications.
- Prevention of medication errors.

- Home health care agency policies and procedures regarding medications.
- Recognizing, documenting and reporting adverse reactions to medications.¹³

Additionally, the BON has determined some medications to be outside the scope of practice for a CNA and has prohibited a CNA from performing the following:

- Administration of controlled substances listed in Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV of Section 893.03, F.S., or 21 U.S.C. s. 812;
- Administration by subcutaneous, intramuscular, or intravenous injection;
- Administration of legend drugs without original labeling identifying the patient, medication, dose, route and frequency of administration, prescriber, and expiration date.
- Administration of over-the-counter, non-prescription, medications without an order from a physician licensed under ch. 458, F.S., an osteopathic physician licensed under ch. 459, F.S., a podiatric physician licensed under ch. 461, F.S., or an advanced practice registered nurse licensed under s. 464.012 or 464.0123, F.S.
- Administration of over-the-counter, non-prescription medications not in the original packaging from the manufacturer.¹⁴

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1 amends s. 400.211, F.S., to allow a nursing home to authorize a registered nurse (RN) to delegate tasks, including medication administration, to a certified nursing assistant (can) who has:

- Completed the six hour training course and found to be competent to administer medications pursuant to s. 464.2035, F.S.
- Has held a clear and active certification from the DOH for a minimum of one year immediately preceding the delegation.
- Completed a 34-hour training course approved by the Board of Nursing (BON) in medication administration and associated tasks. The training must include, but is not limited to:
 - Blood glucose level checks;
 - Dialing oxygen flow meters to prescribed settings; and
 - Assisting with continuous positive airway pressure devices.
- Has demonstrated clinical competency by successfully completing a supervised clinical practice in medication administration and associated tasks conducted in the nursing home.

Upon completing the requirements above, the bill provides that the CNA is designated as a qualified medication aide (QMA). The bill specifies that a QMA may only administer medication under the direct supervision¹⁵ of a nurse licensed under part I of ch. 464, F.S.; that a QMA must annually complete two hours of in-service training and validation required in s. 464.2035, F.S.; and that a nursing home must include medication administration by a QMA when complying with the federal requirement to track, analyze, and improve medical errors and adverse events.¹⁶

The bill requires the BON, in consultation with the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA), to adopt rules to implement these provisions.

Section 2 amends s. 400.23, F.S., to specify that a CNA performing the duties of a QMA may not be included in computing the hours of direct care or the staffing ratios that a nursing home is required to maintain pursuant to s. 400.23, F.S.

Section 3 amends the nurse practice act in s. 464.0156, F.S., to allow a RN to delegate the administration of medications to a resident in a nursing home to a CNA who meets the requirements above.

Section 4 amends s. 464.2035, F.S., to allow a CNA to administer medications in a nursing home as well as in a home health setting, with the exception of rectal and enteral medications. The section also directs the BON to include in rule standards and procedures for a CNA administering medication to a resident of a nursing facility.

The bill makes additional technical and conforming changes.

The bill provides an effective date of July 1, 2023.

CS/SB 558 may have a positive fiscal impact on nursing homes that are able to utilize QMA's to administer medication rather than be required to utilize an RN to perform the task.

C. Government Sector Impact:

The bill may have an indeterminate fiscal impact on the Department of Health (DOH).¹⁷

The DOH reports they will experience an increase in workload associated with additional calls, complaints, investigations, and prosecution due to the expanded authority for registered nurses to delegate the administration of medication to nursing home residents or home health agency patients to a certified nursing assistant or home health aide. The fiscal impact is indeterminate, and the DOH has not identified resources necessary to address the impact.

The DOH reports they will incur non-recurring costs for rulemaking and will experience a non-recurring increase in workload associated with updating the Licensing and Enforcement Information Database System (LEIDS), Online Service Portal (Versa Online), License Verification Search Site, Continuing Education Tracking System (CEBroker), ELI virtual agent, and the Board of Nursing website to support registration for medication authorization. However, the DOH indicates it will be able to absorb this nonrecurring impact with existing resources. The Agency for Health Care Administration reports the oversight requirements in the bill can be incorporated into existing processes and will not have an impact on state expenditures.¹⁸
