## Welcome to the Transparency Florida Website

The Florida Legislature created Transparency Florida to provide the public with unprecedented access to state government spending information by posting Florida's operating budget and associated expenditure records online.

Transparency Florida is designed to provide a current, continually updated picture of the state's operating budget as well as daily expenditures made by state agencies. The numbers are updated nightly as funds are released to agencies, transferred between budget categories, and payments are written for goods and services.

This site is a work in progress; in the coming months our goal is to add more information regarding individual expenditures, vendor payments, and other levels of government spending. Our desire is to increase fiscal accountability in state spending by providing citizens with a useful tool for understanding how their tax dollars are being appropriated and spent.






### A bill to be entitled





Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for your invitation to appear before the Senate Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability at a workshop on the Transparency Florida Act scheduled for Thursday, January 24, 2013 to demonstrate the product previously licensed to the Florida Senate, commonly referred to by some in the Senate as "Transparency 2.0." Unfortunately, due to the short notice, I had made previous commitments and am unable to attend. However, in the interest of insuring each member of the Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee has an opportunity to see and experience the custom application software, Spider is prepared to reactivate the individual user logins and passwords for each member of the Committee and provide them with limited access through the Senate Chief Information Officer, as we have done in the past, provided the committee members agree to comply with the software terms of use previously agreed to by the Senate to protect our confidential trade secrets and intellectual property. This will permit Senators the opportunity to review the web portal, and the many features and functions available internal to the product. In addition, we could reschedule a webinar for the committee members similar to the ones we offered in the fall of 2012. Please have Senate staff contact the Senate Chief Information Officer to make those arrangements.

In addition, the Executive Office of the Governor has announced they will be publishing a formal RFP for a public transparency web portal in the near future. Spider Data plans to participate in that activity. We do not plan to offer any public demonstrations of our product in advance of the RFP submission process as such demonstrations could give competitors a competitive advantage in gaining access to our confidential and proprietary technology. It is likely that competitors will be in attendance at the workshop.

As for responding to questions from committee members, please refer to the response we submitted to questions posed by Senator Gaetz in December 2012, copy attached.

Since there seems to be some confusion surrounding the Senate contract with Spider Data Services, I would like to clarify a couple of points about Spider's obligations under the contract which recently expired.

First and foremost, the Senate contracted with Spider Data Services to obtain a limited license for 600 authenticated users to access and use Spider Data's patented technology through a customized secure web portal. The software is proprietary not unlike all other software programs licensed for use by the Florida Legislature. The contract called for Spider to license a custom application consisting of a comprehensive collection of state data currently residing on four (4) separate state government legacy systems which reside in separate silos, managed by separate state government entities. The data from these systems would be co-located and integrated onto one web platform accessible through a secure website. This application was customized as a tool for members and professional staff of the Florida Legislature. This service could be analogized to other web-based applications used by the legal community, such as the LexisNexis platform, a collection of government data which has been processed, organized and categorized to serve the requirements of an exclusive user community, lawyers.

The Spider custom application contains strategic data relevant to the planning and expenditure of funds in the annual \$70 billion state budget. Although this system was designed to serve an exclusive user community, the Florida Senate, it can certainly be adapted for use by the public giving everyone access to the same information. However, the Florida Senate did not contract with Spider Data Services to develop a comprehensive web portal to be used for external public use. Some of this confusion seems to center on the product name "Transparency 2.0." This was the name assigned to the product by the Florida Senate professional staff in September 2011. Transparency 2.0 was not a deliverable under the terms of the contract.

Spider Data concluded the design and development of the custom web portal in November 2011, working closely with Senate professional staff throughout the process which also included a 15 member Senate Beta Testing Team. Demonstrations of the product were conducted for Senate leadership and staff. However, upon completion and delivery of the product to the Senate, no formal roll-out of the product to all Senators and Committee Staff was announced or scheduled by the Senate President's office even though Spider Data had been informed that this would occur in December 2011. Spider Data worked closely with the Senate Chief Information Officer to schedule multiple educational opportunities; however, they were all subsequently rescheduled and ultimately cancelled by the Senate.

It is important to note that from February 2011 to the end of December 2012, Spider Data was not in control of who was given access to the custom web portal rather this was a responsibility of the Florida Senate. In October 2012, the Senate President's Office made an effort to put the application in the hands of the intended users, the Florida Senate. Spider Data subsequently sent webinar email invitations to all Senate District Offices which offered comprehensive online training on the custom application. The webinars were conducted and the Senate District Offices who expressed interest in learning more about the product were in attendance.

This is my response to your letter of December 21, 2012 regarding “Transparency 2.0.” I have restated your questions and provided my answers to each separately.

You stated the “Transparency 2.0” website is owned by Spider Data and is not available to the public and that allowing the media and the public access to the site would require an undetermined additional investment of taxpayer money over and above the \$5 million already spent and beyond the estimated \$1 million in annual “maintenance fees.” You agreed to provide those cost estimates for making the website available to the general public.

**Response:** *PUBLIC ACCESS: The contract between the Florida Senate and Spider Data Services dated February 4, 2011 was for the creation of a custom budget planning and analysis software platform developed for the Florida Senate. As required by the contract, the information available on this site was delivered via a secure web portal. The contract states the Senate shall provide the Services Provider (“Spider”) with a list of the individual account User names so that the Service Provider can give these individuals access to the system. (Contract Page 7). Spider has given access to this system to all persons on the list the Senate furnished to Spider. A publically accessible web portal was not a deliverable under the terms of the contract. To make the site available to the public would require a change to the contract, which Spider could not unilaterally accomplish. The cost of implementing such an amendment to the contract cannot be calculated until the specific technical requirements are determined. For example, modifying usage constraints from 600 users to potentially millions users would obviously require significant resources. This has not been provided to Spider, and to date the Senate has not asked Spider to consider making the site public nor provided any specifications for modifications. Spider Data does believe, however, that some version of this site which links all the financial data of the State of Florida together in a searchable format for the first time according to our design and patented software should be made available to the public since significant public resources have been spent to build it. We believe the people of Florida deserve access to it and hope that the Senate shares that goal. We note that the Office of the Governor has stated their intention to take the funds made available to them for transparency by the Legislature in the FY 2012-2013 Budget to issue an RFP to acquire such a site. We hope to be allowed to submit a proposal for that site based on the work done for the Senate.*

You also agreed to provide a detailed estimate of the estimated \$1 million in annual fees associated with maintaining the Senate’s license to utilize your product.

**Response:** *\$1,000,000 annually which includes hosting on five (5) dedicated secure servers located in three (3) separate data centers; 24/7/365 technical support and system maintenance; monthly data loads consisting of millions of records originating from four (4) separate state-managed legacy systems, including the budget system (LAS/PBS), the accounting system (FLAIR), the human resources system (People First), and the state contracts management system (SCMS); and product licensing. For comparison purposes, the annual maintenance and support costs of the LAS/PBS are in excess of \$4,000,000; and the annual contract maintenance and support costs of the People First system are \$39,000,000.*

You acknowledged that the data on your website is only updated monthly and does not include fund transfers within and between agencies which are significant. The effect of not including fund transfer data means the site contains incomplete or outdated information which could be misleading if relied upon. You agreed to provide suggestions for additional steps necessary to ensure ongoing accuracy of data.

**Response:** *In the meeting it was acknowledged that the data was refreshed monthly. There was no requirement in the contract to provide updates more frequently. Additionally, there was no discussion during this meeting between the Senate President and Spider Data concerning fund transfer data. Perhaps this discussion occurred between the Senate President and Systems Design and Development after the meeting. The fund transfer data was not a part of the Service Providers obligations under the terms of the contract. Spider's obligations and duties under this contract were quite specific. Spider had no authority to depart from the terms of the agreement without the direction of the Senate and an amendment to the contract.*

You were unable or unwilling to reveal all of the names of your company's owners or individuals or entities with financial interests which would profit from the marketing or use of this product by other government entities, despite the Senate's current contractual relationship premised on the \$5.5 million no-bid contract. You agreed to provide that information.

**Response:** *After consulting with my counsel, I have been advised it has never been a requirement to furnish lists of all persons who may have an ownership interest in a company doing business with the State of Florida, either as a partner, general partner, or stockholder. There is no requirement in the contract for Spider to do so. The private financial interests of such owners may wish to remain so. We see no reason to divulge such information and I have been advised I have no authority to do so.*

When we met, you indicated that you did not know how many, if any, Senate employees were actually regularly using the site or for what purposes. You indicated that you would research that issue and provide a list of Senators and Senate staff with access to the site as well as information detailing their login and use history.

**Response:** *From the period beginning September 21, 2011, through December 14, 2011, the Senate security records show a total of 58 individual account usernames were established for*

*access to the system. These individual accounts were established in coordination with the Senate Chief Information Officer; he will have those records. A list that was in my possession is attached.*

I noted in your demonstration that you prominently feature the Senate seal on your product. You agreed to provide a copy of the written documentation you received from the Senate authorizing your use of the Senate seal.

**Response:** According to the contract, the Senate Transparency System was to be accessed only through the secure Senate Intranet System, which would allow only Senate users to view the System. It was considered a Senate System and was treated as such until the contract expired on December 31, 2012. Additionally, all materials, including the Senate Seal, were provided for approval to the Senate Chief Information Office and the Senate President's Office. The System was delivered in separate modules as outlined in the contract. The modules were demonstrated and subsequent testing performed on each module by the Senate Contract Manager. Upon the delivery of the integrated Modules which comprised the System, including: Planning (LAS/PBS), Budget (LAS/PBS), Accounting (FLAIR), Personnel (People First), and Contracts (State Contracts Management System), the Senate President's Office appointed a Senate Beta Testing Team on October 20, 2011 to perform System testing and provide user feedback. Final acceptance testing was completed on November 9, 2011. Multiple demonstrations of the product were conducted throughout the development cycle which included but were not limited to demonstrations for: Senator J.D. Alexander, Senator Mike Haridopolos, yourself, and Senator Lizbeth Benequisto. Additionally, at the request of the Senate, Governor Rick Scott was provided with a demonstration in the Senate President's Conference Room. All feedback from these demonstrations indicated the Senators and Governor found this to be an excellent product. The Senate Seal was prominently displayed during the many demonstrations of the Senate System conducted in the Senate President's Conference room. After all these reviews, no objection to the display of the Seal was ever communicated to Spider, and since the product was clearly intended only for the internal use of the Florida Senate we do not understand the nature of the objection to the use of the seal. The Senate Seal has now been removed from the website following the expiration of the contract.

Finally, you contended that missing or incorrect information on the site was due to the Senate's failure to provide such information. Given that these communications occurred prior to my being sworn in as the presiding officer of the Senate, you agreed to provide copies of your correspondence with legislative staff as well as any public records requests you may have filed if your attempts to obtain information from staff were not fruitful.

**Response:** All data requests were submitted through the Senate Chief Information Officer. He will have records of all correspondence. Outstanding data requests which were not delivered to Spider Data include:

- House Budget Bill for Fiscal Year 2011-12
- House Budget Details for Fiscal Year 2011-12
- House Budget Bill for Fiscal Year 2012-13

- *House Budget Details for Fiscal Year 2012-13*
- *Final General Appropriations Act Bill for Fiscal Year 2012-13*
- *Final General Appropriations Act Budget Details for Fiscal Year 2012-13*
- *Agency Legislative Budget Requests for Fiscal Year 2013-14.*

Additionally, it has come to my attention that the First Amendment Foundation and other members of the press and public seek ongoing access to the Transparency 2.0 web portal. As you know the Senate does not control access to the portal. We have attached the public records requests the Senate has received and direct you to comply with your sunshine law obligations as a government contractor and provide Ms. Petersen, her organization and any other person or entity who desires access to all public records within your control. For the purposes of your responding to requests that may be submitted to you, the Senate waives any claim for exempt or confidential information that is contained in Transparency 2.0 or within your dominion or control.

**Response:** *Access was provided to the First Amendment Foundation via Barbara Petersen as soon as we were made aware of this request. ALL Public Records Requests for access to the System submitted through the Senate to Spider Data from members of the press and/or public interest groups have been honored. Under the terms of the contract there is no provision permitting Spider to provide public access to this system. As described above, the contract specifically required a secure web portal. It is also my understanding the Senate is not subject to Ch. 119 F.S., the public records statute. The Sunshine Law is not applicable. Thus, Spider was not at liberty to provide public access until the Senate gave its permission to do so, which you have done. After that occurred, Spider honored the Senate's request. Further, if this system is covered by Section 11.0431, Florida Statutes, it is the Senate, not Spider, that had the power to direct access be facilitated. Spider could not presume the Senate was willing to allow public access until the Senate so instructed it.*

Ms. Mattson,

Since our meeting on Dec. 6, the Senate has not received a response from Spider Date Services regarding the cost of making the Transparency 2.0 product available to the public. Additionally, we have not received a response to the letter from President Gaetz dated December 21, which again asked for this pricing information.

More importantly, in the letter dated December 21, President Gaetz directed you to comply with your sunshine law obligations as a government contractor to provide Barbara Petersen of the First Amendment Foundation and any other person or entity who desires access to all public records within your control. It is our understanding that you have yet to provide a response to Ms. Petersen.

President Gaetz requests an update on the status of these requests within 24 hours. Additionally, President Gaetz requests new login information so that he may access the site as the login we have for Debbie Brown, the Secretary of the Senate, is no longer working.

If these requests cannot be met within 24 hours, we request a written explanation of why your company, which is under contract with the Senate until the end of the year, can not comply with sunshine law obligations, provide access for the Senate President to a site that the senate has invested 5.5 million taxpayer dollars to create and why, understanding the significant expense already incurred by Florida's taxpayers, you are either unwilling or unable to provide an estimate of what it would cost to make the site open to the public.

Dear Chairman Ring:

Floridians are deeply interested in how government spends their money, and in our experience, the second most important document to the citizens of Florida after the state constitution is the state budget.

Given today's information and communications technologies, the public should be able to access state budget information and related records in real time and be afforded an opportunity to participate in the budget process as much as is practicable.

To that end, we recommend that a budget transparency website, at a minimum, contain access to all public records in an open data format in real-time from the following data sources:

- Statewide Budget System: Legislative Appropriations System (LAS) and Planning and Budget Subsystem (PBS).
- Florida Accounting Information Resource Subsystem (FLAIR).
- Personnel data from People First.
- OPS data from FLAIR.
- State Contract Management System (SCMS) and contract records maintained by the Department of Transportation (DOT)
- Vendor Bid System (VBS) and procurement records maintained in any other state government system.

The public would benefit from a budget transparency website containing the following components:

- Planning records: Agency planning documents, such as long range program plans and capital improvement plans; OPPAGA program summaries and entity descriptions.
- Budget records: Budget issues, budget bills and funding comparisons; as well as data from sources including agency requests, recommendations from the Governor, Senate and/or House bills, conference bills and conference bill with vetoes.
- Accounting records: Actual expenditure data from the Florida Accounting Information Resource (FLAIR) Subsystem updated in real-time.
- Contracts records: State contracts from the State Contract Management System provided by the Governor's Office and Department of Transportation contract information updated in real-time.
- Procurement records: All records related to every procurement process, including proposals from all bidders.
- Audit and inspector general report records.

- Personnel records: Salaries and benefits data for regular and vacant positions, including employee name and job title. All non-exempt data from People First, the state's personnel information system, and OPS data from the FLAIR Subsystem.

To maximize the benefits of the transparency website, the following features should be included:

- Keyword Search: Citizens should be able to easily search a term like “veterans” and see all records related to their search.
- Tracking: Tracking capability would allow members of the public to sign up for email or text alerts about issues of interest to them and be notified when new records matching keywords are uploaded.
- Budget Builder: This would enable a citizen to build his or her own state budget with all of the same information available to legislators, and then easily submit their ideas and recommended budget to lawmakers.
- Two-way Communication: Social media connectivity and opportunities for public comment and input should be available throughout the website.

We greatly appreciate the opportunity afforded us to comment, Senator. Good government depends on transparency and public access, and we believe that these recommendations for building a budget transparency website will ensure that Florida and its budget process remain in the Sunshine. 

# Web Application Development and Operations

## ARCHITECTURE

Generally speaking, all web applications available on the Internet require the following technical components to operate: web application servers on which the application is deployed and operates, a firewall solution to provide network security, load balancing solution to manage demand and ensure availability, and data storage solution for hosting data and information.
