FY 2014-15 Proposed Implementing Bill Summary

AHCA: Medicaid Hospital Funding Programs and DRG Methodology References

 Incorporates by reference the document entitled "Medicaid Hospital Funding Programs" for the purpose of displaying the calculations used by the Legislature in making appropriations for the Low-Income Pool and Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) programs, and for the Diagnosis Related Group (DRG) reimbursement methodology for Medicaid hospital inpatient services.

DCF: Managing Entities

• Requires the Department of Children and Families to amend its contracts with each managing entity, as necessary, to remove any contractual provisions that have the effect of requiring a managing entity to conduct a provider network procurement during the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

DOH: Nitrogen Reduction Study

- Provides requirements to govern the continuation of the Department of Health's Florida Onsite Sewage Nitrogen Reduction Strategies Study.
- Prohibits state agencies from implementing regulations with higher standards than those currently in place until the Department of Health's Florida Onsite Sewage Nitrogen Reduction Strategies Study is completed.

APD: Wait List Transition and Waiver Services

- Maintains current criteria for transitioning individuals from the waiting list to the Home and Community Based Waiver.
- The first and second wait list criteria remain unchanged. Individuals "in crisis" will continue to be the highest-priority individuals offered a transition to the Waiver. Children in the child welfare system that are to be adopted or reunified with their families and will be living in the family home will continue to be the second tier of individuals that may transition to the Waiver.
- For the next two tiers individuals with intensive needs or individuals with caregivers over the age of 70 the Agency shall use the Wait List Priority Tool developed in 2013 to prioritize individuals determined to have the greatest need.
- Requires the Agency to allow an individual who meets the eligibility requirements provided under s. 393.065(1), Florida Statutes, to receive home and community-based services in Florida if the individual's parent or legal guardian is an active-duty military service member and, at the time of the service member's transfer to Florida, the individual was receiving home and community-based services in another state.
- Provides that persons remaining on the wait list are not deemed to have been substantially affected by agency action and are not entitled to an Administrative Hearing.

Proposed Medicaid Conforming Bill 2014

Definition of Rural Hospital:

Section 1 of the bill.

s. 395.602(2)(e), F.S.

Adds "sole community hospital" to Florida's definition of rural hospital. Sole community hospitals are designated by the federal government as rural hospitals for Medicare under different criteria than Florida law. Florida has seven hospitals designated as sole community hospitals, and two of those are not rural hospitals under s. 395.602, F.S.

Disproportionate Share Hospital Programs:

Section 2 of the bill.

s. 409.911, F.S.

Updates the years of audited data AHCA uses to determine Medicaid days and charity care.

Statewide Medicaid Managed Care and Provider Service Networks:

Sections 3 and 5 of the bill.

ss. 409.962(13) and 409.974(1), F.S.

Revises the definition of "provider service network" in Statewide Medicaid Managed Care. Provides that AHCA must maintain a contract with at least one PSN per region.

Statewide Medicaid Managed Care and Medically Needy:

Sections 4 and 7 of the bill.

ss. 409.972(1) and 409.975(7), F.S.

Removes from statute the requirement for Medically Needy recipients to enroll in managed care plans in Statewide Medicaid Managed Care. These sections of the bill take effect upon becoming law.

Statewide Medicaid Managed Care and Voluntary Enrollment:

Section 4 of the bill.

s. 409.972(2), F.S.

Provides that Medicaid recipients residing in a group home facility licensed under chapter 393 are exempt from mandatory managed care enrollment but may enroll voluntarily. This section of the bill takes effect upon becoming law.

Statewide Medicaid Managed Care and the CMS Network:

Section 6 of the bill.

s. 409.974(4), F.S.

Allows the CMS Network to function as a fee-for-service PSN in statewide managed care until the fiscal year after it qualifies to operate as a prepaid plan. Requires the CMS Network to use AHCA's fiscal agent to pay claims until then. This section of the bill takes effect upon becoming law.

Effective Date:

Section 8 of the bill.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2014, except as otherwise provided.
