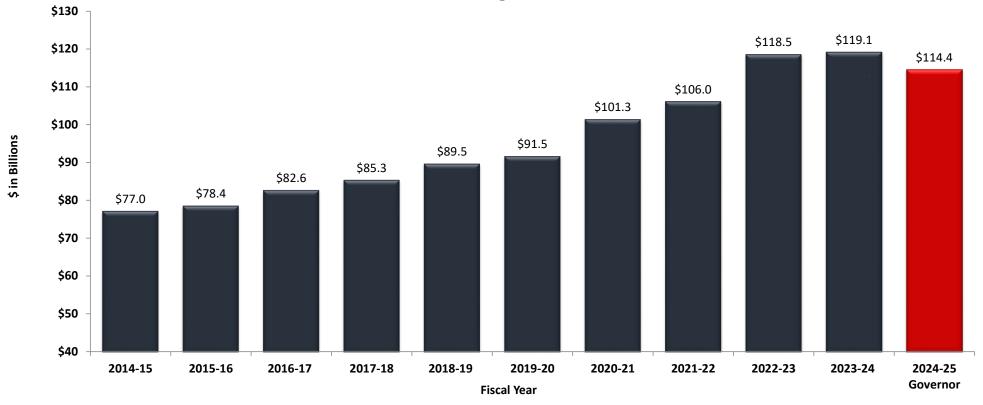

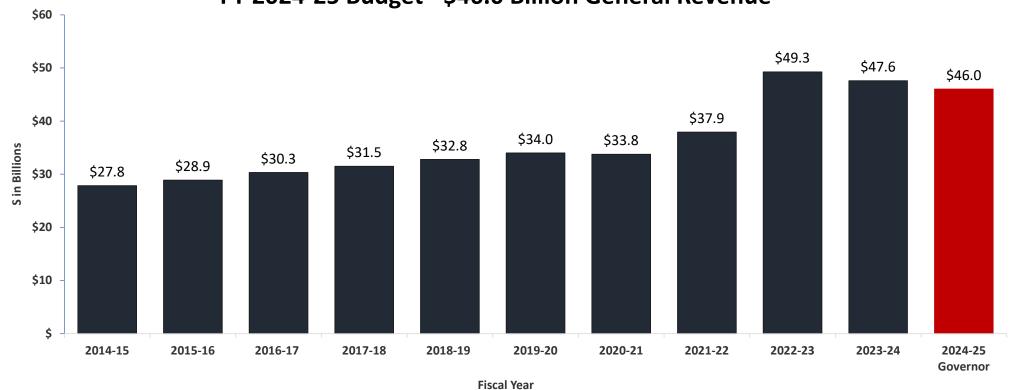

FY 2024-25 Budget - \$114.4 Billion



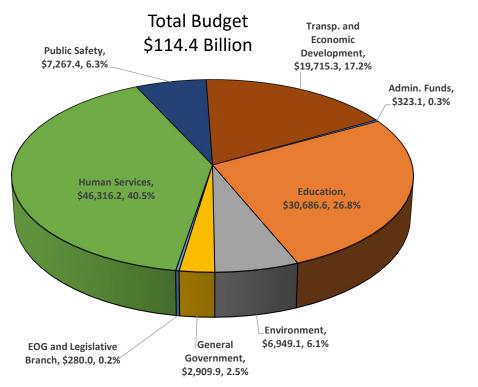


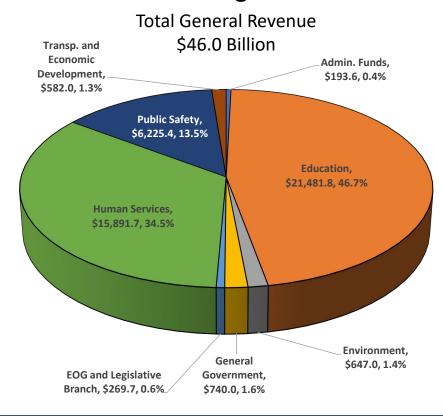
FY 2024-25 Budget - \$46.0 Billion General Revenue



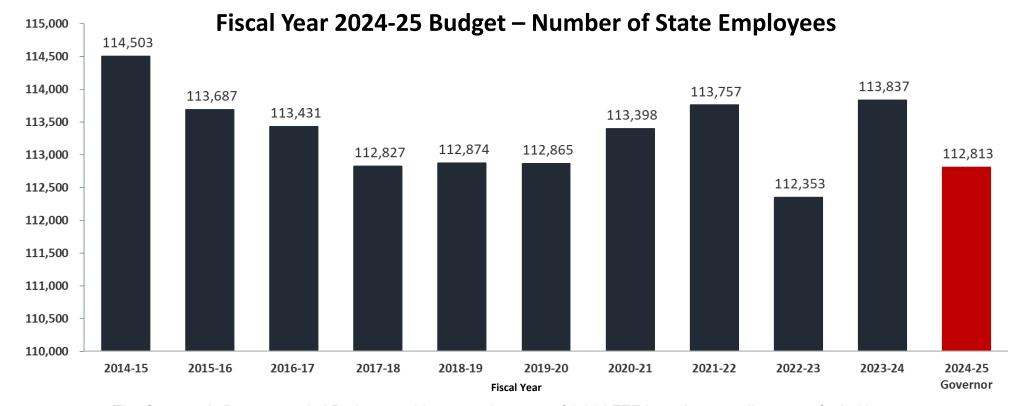

The Governor's Recommended Budget provides a net decrease of <u>1,024 FTE</u> based on a realignment of priorities across state agencies, reducing excess vacant positions to accommodate new positions for critical programs and services.

Debt Reduction

- \$455 million provided to reduce the amount of State debt outstanding
 - Administered by the Division of Bond Finance to maximize savings in connection with paying-off State debt
 - State bonds can either be defeased (redeemed prior to maturity) or purchased at a discount on the open-market and cancelled (tendered)
 - The State saves money by avoiding interest on bonds outstanding or purchasing bonds at a discount, or both

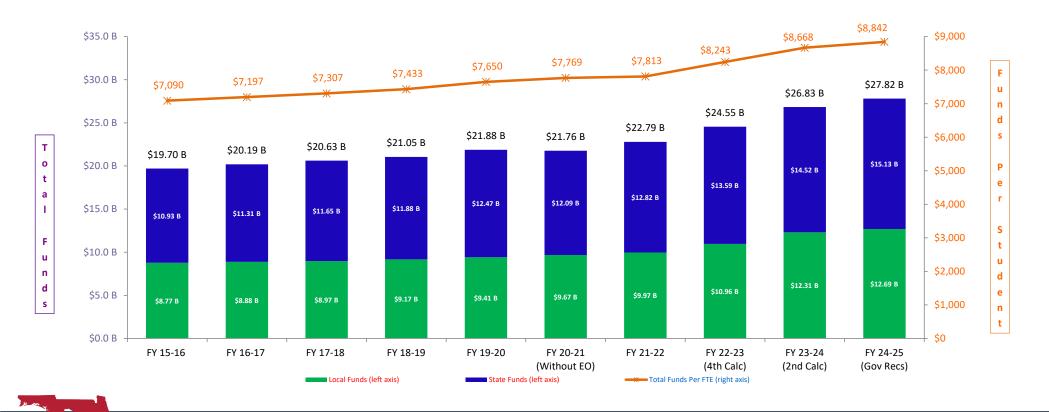

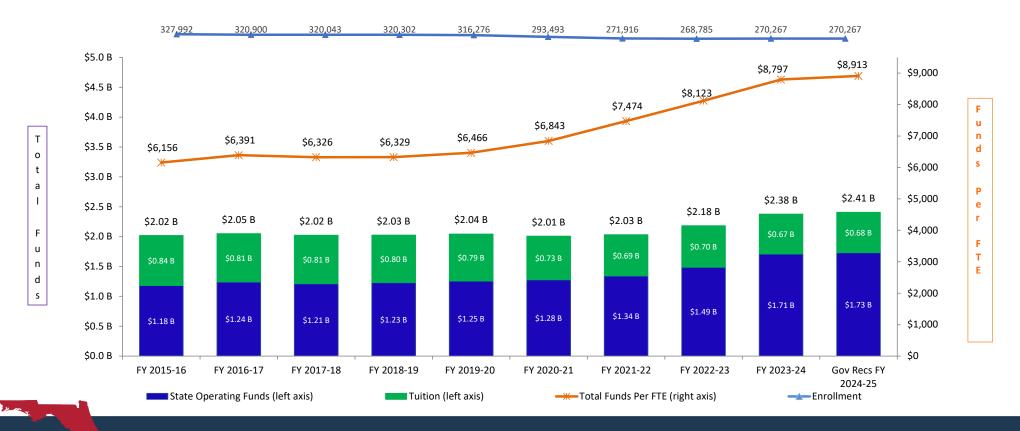


Historic Total, State, & Per Student K-12 Public School Funding
