Acquisition of Motor Vehicles
General Revenue

\$ -65,000

\$ -50,000

- This reduction will constrain the department's ability to replace vehicles as they become disabled or have surpassed replacement guidelines.
- This reduction will increase maintenance and repair expenses. The department owns six (6) vehicles which have surpassed both age and mileage requirements for replacement.
- This reduction would have a moderate negative impact to the department's ability to perform its mission.





# Other Personal Services (OPS) General Revenue

\$ -24,533

- OPS positions perform administrative duties, freeing critical staff members to perform essential office functions.
- OPS personnel are often used to supplement in many areas that FTEs are not allocated.
- One OPS employee will be laid-off if funding is reduced.
- This reduction would have a moderate negative impact to the department's ability to perform its mission.





Operating Capital Outlay
General Revenue

\$ -105,000

- This proposal reduces critical funding which supports the life cycle replacement of computer systems and peripheral equipment, i.e. servers, specialized computer systems, and printers required to support the National Guard's mission.
- This reduction would have a significant negative impact to the department's capabilities to perform its full time mission.





Contracted Services
Camp Blanding Management TF

\$ -5,000

- This reduction reduces critical funding which supports the contracted services performed on Camp Blanding Joint Training Center, i.e., minor maintenance, repairs and landscaping services.
- This reduction would have a moderate negative impact to the department's capabilities to perform its full time mission.





# Maintenance and Operations Contracts Camp Blanding Management TF

\$ -5,000

- This reduction reduces critical funding which supports the operations of the Camp Blanding Joint Training Center (CBJTC) used to pay for contract maintenance and repair of all state owned facilities on CBJTC.
- The facilities on CBJTC are aging and are at or beyond their useful life expectancy. Camp Blanding also has seen a constant budget level over the past 10 years yet has seen a dramatic increase in operational tempo and requirements.
- This reduction would have a moderate negative impact to the department's capabilities to perform its full time mission.





**Expense** 

Camp Blanding Management TF

\$ -60,202

- This reduction reduces critical funding which supports the daily operations of the Camp Blanding Joint Training Center (CBJTC).
- This appropriation is used to purchase materials and pieces of equipment to execute and facilitate first class training to thousands of soldiers, airmen and law enforcement officers per year.
- CBJTC landing has 73,000 acres and hundreds of buildings and provides training areas, ranges, education facilities, simulation platforms, maintenance, and other services to Florida's National Guard and to numerous federal, state, and local customers spanning the Joint, Interagency, Intergovernmental and Multinational (JIIM) spectrum.
- This reduction would have a significant negative impact to the department's capabilities to perform its full time mission.





### National Guard Tuition Assistance General Revenue

\$ -1,773,273

- This issue would reduce critical funding that supports the state's #1
  program to support the recruitment and retention of soldiers and airmen
  in the Florida National Guard (FLNG). The FLNG is currently ranked 53 of
  54 nationwide when comparing guard personnel to state population.
- The Educational Dollars for Duty Program (EDD) pays up to 100% of tuition at an accredited post-secondary institution and is available to qualified FLNG Servicemembers for pursuing authorized post-secondary education opportunities that include vocational/technical, industry certification training, continuing education, professional licensing/industry certification exams and academic (i.e., certificate, associate, bachelor, and master) degree programs.
- This reduction would have significant negative impact on the recruitment and retention of FLNG members in a time when the State relies heavily on the FLNG's ability to provide natural disaster support.





# Salaries & Benefits Camp Blanding Management TF

\$ -32,836

- Currently, the budgeted appropriation for salaries and benefits in the Camp Blanding Trust Fund do not meet end-of-year payroll and require the department to submit budget amendments, each year, to transfer budget authority from other expenditure categories to salaries and benefits to maintain the current full time force.
- This reduction would have a significant negative impact to the Camp Blanding. A reduction of funding, however minimal, will severely hinder Camp Blanding's ability to pay our employees and perform it's full time mission.


