# I. Summary:

This bill eliminates the Community-Based Development Organization Assistance Act.

This bill repeals the following sections of the Florida Statutes: 163.455, 163.456, 163.457, 163.458, 163.459, 163.460, 163.461, and 163.462.

### II. Present Situation:

In 2000,<sup>1</sup> the Legislature established the Community-Based Development Organization Assistance Act for the purpose of providing community-based development organizations (CBDOs) with administrative and operating funds to retain project staff to plan, implement, and manage job-generating and community revitalization developments in distressed neighborhoods.<sup>2</sup> The program has not been funded or implemented since it was created by the Legislature in 2000.<sup>3</sup>

The Community- Based Development Organization Assistance Act authorized the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) to award core administrative and operating grants used for staff salaries and administrative expenses for eligible CBDOs selected using a competitive three-tiered process for housing and economic development projects. DCA is required to adopt by

rule<sup>5</sup> a set of criteria for three-tiered funding that ensures equitable statewide geographic distribution of the funding. The plan must include emerging, intermediate, and mature CBDOs recognizing the varying needs of the three tiers. Each eligible CBDO may apply for a grant of up to \$50,000 per year for a period of 5 years.<sup>6</sup> When the act was created, the Legislature appropriated \$1 million to be distributed as grants to CBDOs. Subsequently, the appropriation<sup>7</sup> was vetoed by the Governor and as a result, no grants were awarded.

Eligible activities include, but are not limited to:<sup>8</sup>

- Preparing grant and loan applications, proposals, fundraising letters, and other documents essential to securing additional administrative or project funds.
- Monitoring and administering grants and loans, providing technical assistance to businesses, and any other administrative tasks essential to maintaining funding eligibility or meeting contractual obligations.
- Developing local programs and home ownership housing projects to encourage the participation of financial institutions, insurance companies, attorneys, architects, planners, developers, and other professional firms and individuals providing services beneficial to redevelopment efforts.
- Providing technical, accounting, and financial assistance and information to businesses and entrepreneurs interested in locating, expanding, or operating in the service area.
- Coordinating with state, federal, and local governments and nonprofit organizations to ensure that activities meet local plans and ordinances to avoid duplication of tasks.
- Assisting service area residents in identifying and determining eligibility for state, federal, and local housing programs including rehabilitation, weatherization, home ownership, rental assistance, or public housing programs.
- Developing, selling, owning, and managing subsidized affordable housing designed for persons with very low incomes or low incomes, or for WAGES recipients, or developing, selling, owning, and managing subsidized affordable industrial parks providing jobs to such persons.
- Obtaining technical assistance to build capacity to support community-based development organization projects.

In order to be eligible for assistance, a CBDO must be a nonprofit corporation under state law and s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; maintain a service area in which economic and housing development projects are located; and meet other specific criteria as provided by law. In addition, a majority of the CBDO's board members must be elected by those members of the nonprofit corporation who are stakeholders, comprising a mix of service area residents, area business property owners, area employees, and low-income residents.<sup>9</sup>

A CBDO applying for a core administrative and operating grant must also submit a proposal to DCA.<sup>10</sup> Those CBDOs receiving funds must submit an annual report providing information specified by law and other information as may be required by DCA.<sup>11</sup>

DCA was abolished by the Legislature during the 2011 legislative session and several of its programs and functions, including the Division of Housing and Community Development, which manages grant programs, were incorporated into the newly created Department of Economic Opportunity.<sup>12</sup>

# II. Present Situation:

In 1992, the Legislature created the Florida Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Act (the Act). The purpose of the Act was to prevent, combat, and reduce motor vehicle theft in Florida, and to improve and support the law enforcement, prosecution, and administration of motor vehicle theft

laws.<sup>2</sup> The Act also established the Florida Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Authority (the Authority), within the Department of Legal Affairs.<sup>3</sup>

# **Powers and Duties of the Authority**

The powers and duties of the Authority include:

• Applying for, soliciting, receiving, establishing priorities for, allocating, disbursing, contracting for, and spending funds that are made available to the Authority from any source to effectuate the purposes of the Act;

- Assessing the scope of the problem of motor vehicle theft;
- Developing and sponsoring the implementation of statewide plans and strategies to combat motor vehicle theft and to improve the administration of the motor vehicle theft laws and provide an effective forum for identification of critical problems associated with motor vehicle theft;
- Coordinating the development, adoption, and implementation of plans and strategies relating
  to interagency or intergovernmental cooperation with respect to motor vehicle theft law
  enforcement; and
- Providing an annual report on the activities of the Authority to specified entities.<sup>4</sup>

### **Membership of the Authority**

The powers and duties of the Authority are vested in and exercised by a Board of Directors (Board), established within the Authority, which includes the following members:

- The Chief Financial Officer or his or her designee;
- The executive director of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles;
- The executive director of the Department of Law Enforcement; and
- Six additional members, each of whom are appointed by the Attorney General as follows: a state attorney or city or county executive, a chief executive law enforcement official, a sheriff, one representative of companies authorized to sell motor vehicle insurance, one representative of insurers authorized to write motor vehicle insurance in this state, and one representative of purchasers of motor vehicle insurance in this state who is not employed by or connected with the business of insurance.<sup>5</sup>

# Florida Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Trust Fund

In addition to the Authority, the Act created the Florida Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Trust Fund (Trust Fund). The Trust Fund was funded pursuant to s. 320.08046, F.S., which appropriated 18 percent of a \$1 license tax surcharge (vehicle registration fee) to the Trust Fund. Trust Fund dollars were required to be used to:

- Pay the Authority's cost to administer the Board and the Trust Fund; and
- Achieve the purposes and objectives of the Act.<sup>9</sup>

In 2003, the Legislature terminated the Trust Fund and amended s. 320.08046, F.S., to remove the language appropriating 18 percent of the \$1 license tax surcharge to the Trust Fund. <sup>10</sup> As a result, the Authority has not been funded since 2003. <sup>11</sup> According to the Office of the Attorney General (OAG), the OAG has not administered the Authority since funding was eliminated. However, statutes relating to the Authority still exist, despite the program not being operational.

Auto theft is much less prevalent today than it was in 1992 when the Florida Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention Authority was established. In fact, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement reports that the occurrence of auto theft in Florida has decreased by nearly fifty percent since 2003 when the Authority stopped operating.
