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

- 2,200 Certified Probation Officers






Two Sides of the House – Institutions

Correctional Institution (CI) Diagram


CIs are self-contained and include:

- Healthcare
- Education

- Vocational Programs
- Religious Services / Chapel
- Food Service
- Laundry Facility

- General and Law Libraries
- Main units and annexes each contain up to eight dorms and house up to 1,500 inmates
- Work camps consist of three or four dorms and house up to 430 inmates

Staffing

Correctional Officers

- 11,351 state employees providing care, custody, and control to 71,000 inmates*
- 12 weeks of basic training and 51 hours a year of required continuing education *10,000 Florida inmates supervised in private prisons. 2,000 inmates supervised in contract work-release centers.

Certified Probation Officers

- 2,200 state employees supervising 145,000 offenders
- 14 weeks of initial training and 40 hours of annual continuing education

Administrative and Logistical Support




