# Overview of Specialty License Plates

- The first specialty license plate was enacted in 1986.
- There are currently 144 specialty license plates authorized by the legislature. Of these, 109 are active and 35 are in the "pre-sale" process.
- There is a statutory cap of 135.
- Revenue generated from the plates (\$15 25) goes to the sponsoring organizations.

# Establishing a Specialty License Plate

- Enacted by legislature.
- Organization designs the plate.
- Sell 3,000 vouchers within two years.
- If the pre-sale requirement is not met, the specialty license plate is discontinued.



# SB 364 (2022 Session)

- Lowered the cap from 150 to 135.
- Extended pre-sale period for specialty license plates that had not sold 3,000 vouchers.
- Established nine new specialty license plates.
- Allowed Independent Colleges & Universities of Florida (ICUF) using standard plate to count as one specialty license plate for the 3,000 registration threshold.

# **Maintaining Valid Status**

- Organizations must maintain a minimum number of active registrations outlined in law.
- Any organization falling below the threshold is placed on probation for one year. Any discontinued specialty license plate may be retained by the customer until the end of the 10-year license plate cycle. However, the specialty license plate fee is not charged to the customer at the time of renewal for the remainder of the cycle.



## **Audit & Attestation**



If annual expenditures are less than \$750,000, the organization must file an attestation with the department within 9 months of the organization's fiscal year end.



Otherwise, a CPA audit, in accordance with F.S. 215.97 (Florida Single Audit), must be filed with FLHSMV and Auditor General within 45 days after delivery of the audit to the entity, but no later than nine months of entity's fiscal year end.



The department is required to audit each organization that files an attestation every three years.



# FDOT LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

# WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT & EMERGENCY RESPONSE









### SUPPORTING TRUCK DRIVERS

- Gives Department authority to provide and pay for training and certification fees for Commercial Driver License (CDL).
- Focuses on recruiting and retaining truck drivers to support a healthy supply chain.
- Amends Section 334.044, F.S.

### **RESPONDING TO EMERGENCIES**

- Supports the Department's emergency Fast Response Contracts for rapid completion of emergency needs, such as bridge damage and sink holes.
- Increases the Fast Response Contract Cap Amount from \$250,000 to \$500,000.
- Amends Section 337.11, F.S.





### **CUTTING RED TAPE**



### PUBLIC INFORMATION AND EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGNS

- Aligns with updated federal law to allow the Department to provide education on emerging technologies such as Electric Vehicles and Automated Vehicles.
- Amends Section 334.044, F.S.

### ALIGNING WITH FEDERAL LAW REGARDING PUBLIC TRANSIT

- Aligns state transit reporting to match updated federal reporting and planning requirements.
- Amends Sections 341.052 and 341.071, F.S.

### REDUCING DELAYS IN INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

- Allows Work Program modifications to be approved by Chairs of Appropriations Committees if the Legislative Budget Commission is unable to convene as scheduled.
- Keeps the Department project pipeline moving and reduces project delays.
- Amends Section 339.135, F.S.





### **STATUTORY CLEAN-UPS**



### FINANCING INFRASTRUCTURE

- Expands the Department's financing options by authorizing the Florida Development Finance Corporation to issue public activity bonds.
- Amends Section 288.9606, F.S.

### TRANSFERRING BRIDGE FACILITY TO TURNPIKE ENTERPRISE

- Transfers the Garcon Point Bridge facility to the FDOT Turnpike Enterprise inventory.
- Reduces tolls and increases route options for the traveling public.
- Amends section 334.044, F.S.

### RATING AGENCY ENGAGEMENT

- Enables the Department to directly engage with Rating Agencies for bond analysis.
- Amends Chapter 287, F.S.
