



Student Success: Graduation Rates










Florida College Transfers & SUS Enrollment

Percentage of Enrollment in SUS Upper Division




Trends in Percentage of Enrollment in SUS Upper Division







Four-Year Graduation Rates Full-Time AA Degree Transfers and SUS Natives






Average Student Semester Hours to Degree AA Degree Transfers and SUS Natives Selected Years (1994-95, 2001-02, 2009-10)



Challenge Grant Statutes

1011.32 ¹Community College Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program.—

- (1) The Legislature recognizes that the ¹community colleges do not have sufficient physical facilities to meet the current demands of their instructional and community programs. It further recognizes that, to strengthen and enhance ¹community colleges, it is necessary to provide facilities in addition to those currently available from existing revenue sources. It further recognizes that there are sources of private support that, if matched with state support, can assist in constructing much needed facilities and strengthen the commitment of citizens and organizations in promoting excellence at each ¹community college. Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature to establish a program to provide the opportunity for each ¹community college through its direct-support organization to receive and match challenge grants for instructional and community-related capital facilities within the ¹community college.
- (2) There is established the ¹Community College Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program for the purpose of assisting the ¹community colleges in building high priority instructional and community-related capital facilities consistent with s. 1004.65, including common areas connecting such facilities. The direct-support organizations that serve the ¹community colleges shall solicit gifts from private sources to provide matching funds for capital facilities. For the purposes of this section, private sources of funds shall not include any federal or state government funds that a ¹community college may receive.
- (3) The ¹Community College Capital Facilities Matching Program shall provide funds to match private contributions for the development of high priority instructional and community-related capital facilities, including common areas connecting such facilities, within the ¹community colleges.
- (4) Within the direct-support organization of each ¹community college there must be established a separate capital facilities matching account for the purpose of providing matching funds from the direct-support organization's unrestricted donations or other private contributions for the development of high priority instructional and community-related capital facilities, including common areas connecting such facilities. The Legislature shall appropriate funds for distribution to a ¹community college after matching funds are certified by the direct-support organization and ¹community college. The Public Education Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund shall not be used as the source of the state match for private contributions.
- (5) A project may not be initiated unless all private funds for planning, construction, and equipping the facility have been received and deposited in the direct-support organization's matching account for this purpose. However, this requirement does not preclude the ¹community college or direct-support organization from expending available funds from private sources to develop a prospectus, including preliminary architectural schematics or models, for use in its efforts to raise private funds for a facility and for site preparation, planning, and construction. The Legislature may appropriate the state's matching funds in one or more fiscal years for the planning, construction, and equipping of an eligible facility. Each ¹community college shall notify all donors of private funds of a substantial delay in the availability of state matching funds for this program.
- (6) To be eligible to participate in the ¹Community College Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program, a ¹community college, through its direct-support organization, shall raise a

- contribution equal to one-half of the total cost of a facilities construction project from private sources which shall be matched by a state appropriation equal to the amount raised for a facilities construction project, subject to the General Appropriations Act.
- (7) If the state's share of the required match is insufficient to meet the requirements of subsection (6), the ¹community college shall renegotiate the terms of the contribution with the donors. If the project is terminated, each private donation, plus accrued interest, reverts to the direct-support organization for remittance to the donor.
- (8) By October 15 of each year, the State Board of Education shall transmit to the Governor and the Legislature a list of projects that meet all eligibility requirements to participate in the ¹Community College Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program and a budget request that includes the recommended schedule necessary to complete each project.
- (9) In order for a project to be eligible under this program, it must be survey recommended under the provisions of s. 1013.31 and included in the ¹community college's 5-year capital improvement plan, and it must receive approval from the State Board of Education or the Legislature.
- (10) A ¹community college project may not be removed from the approved 3-year PECO priority list because of its successful participation in this program until approved by the Legislature and provided for in the General Appropriations Act. When such a project is completed and removed from the list, all other projects shall move up on the 3-year PECO priority list.
- (11) Any private matching funds for a project which are unexpended after the project is completed shall revert to the ¹community college's direct-support organization capital facilities matching account. The balance of any unexpended state matching funds shall be returned to the fund from which those funds were appropriated.
- (12) The surveys, architectural plans, facility, and equipment shall be the property of the participating ¹community college. A facility constructed under this section may be named in honor of a donor at the option of the ¹community college district board of trustees. A facility may not be named after a living person without prior approval by the State Board of Education. History.—s. 631, ch. 2002-387; s. 1, ch. 2007-61; s. 29, ch. 2009-60; s. 179, ch. 2010-102; s. 23, ch. 2010-155.

¹Note.—Section 21, ch. 2010-70, directs the Division of Statutory Revision to prepare a reviser's bill to substitute the term "Florida College System institution" for the terms "Florida college," "community college," and "junior college" where those terms appear in the Florida K-20 Education Code.

1011.85 Dr. Philip Benjamin Matching Grant Program for ¹Community Colleges.—

(1) There is created the Dr. Philip Benjamin Matching Grant Program for ¹Community Colleges as a single matching gifts program that encompasses the goals originally set out in the Academic Improvement Program, the Scholarship Matching Program, and the Health Care Education Quality Enhancement Challenge Grant. The program shall be administered according to rules of the State Board of Education and used to encourage private support in enhancing ¹community colleges by providing the ¹community college system with the opportunity to receive and match challenge grants. Funds received prior to the effective date of this act for each of the three programs shall be retained in the separate account for which it was designated.

- (2) Each ¹community college board of trustees receiving state appropriations under this program shall approve each gift to ensure alignment with the unique mission of the ¹community college. The board of trustees must link all requests for a state match to the goals and mission statement. The Florida ¹Community College Foundation Board receiving state appropriations under this program shall approve each gift to ensure alignment with its goals and mission statement.
- (3) Upon approval by the ¹community college board of trustees and the State Board of Education, the ordering of donations for priority listing of unmatched gifts should be determined by the submitting ¹community college.
- (4) Each year, eligible contributions received by a ¹community college's foundation or the State Board of Education by February 1 shall be eligible for state matching funds.
- (a) Each ¹community college board of trustees and, when applicable, the Florida ¹Community College Foundation Board, receiving state appropriations under this program shall also certify in an annual report to the State Board of Education the receipt of eligible cash contributions that were previously unmatched by the state. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules providing all ¹community colleges with an opportunity to apply for excess funds before the awarding of such funds.
- (b) ¹Community colleges must submit to the State Board of Education an annual expenditure report tracking the use of all matching funds.
- (c) The audit of each foundation receiving state funds from this program must include a certification of accuracy in the amount reported for matching funds.
- (5) The matching ratio for donations that are specifically designated to support scholarships, including scholarships for first-generation-in-college students, student loans, or need-based grants shall be \$1 of state funds to \$1 of local private funds.
- (6) Otherwise, funds shall be proportionately allocated to the ¹community colleges on the basis of matching each \$6 of local or private funds with \$4 of state funds. To be eligible, a minimum of \$4,500 must be raised from private sources.
- (7) The ¹community college board of trustees, in conjunction with the donor, shall make the determination of whether scholarships established pursuant to this program are endowed.
- (8)(a) Funds sufficient to provide the match shall be transferred from the state appropriations to the local ¹community college foundation or the statewide ¹community college foundation upon notification that a proportionate amount has been received and deposited by a ¹community college in its own trust fund.
- (b) If state funds appropriated for the program are insufficient to match contributions, the amount allocated shall be reduced in proportion to its share of the total eligible contributions. However, in making proportional reductions, every ¹community college shall receive a minimum of \$75,000 in state matching funds if its eligible contributions would have generated an amount at least equal to \$75,000. All unmet contributions shall be eligible for state matching funds in subsequent fiscal years.
- (9) Each ¹community college entity shall establish its own matching grant program fund as a depository for the private contributions and matching state funds provided under this section. ¹Community college foundations are responsible for the maintenance, investment, and administration of their matching grant program funds.

- (10) The State Board of Education may receive submissions of requests for matching funds and documentation relating to those requests, may approve requests for matching funds, and may allocate such funds to the ¹community colleges.
- (11) The board of trustees of the ¹community college and the State Board of Education are responsible for determining the uses for the proceeds of their respective trust funds. Such use of the proceeds shall include, but not be limited to, expenditure of the funds for:
- (a) Scientific and technical equipment.
- (b) Scholarships, loans, or need-based grants.
- (c) Other activities that will benefit future students as well as students currently enrolled at the ¹community college, will improve the quality of education at the ¹community college, or will enhance economic development in the community.
- (12) Each ¹community college shall notify all donors of private funds of a substantial delay in the availability of state matching funds for this program.

1011.94 University Major Gifts Program.—

- (1) There is established a University Major Gifts Program. The purpose of the program is to enable each university to provide donors with an incentive in the form of matching grants for donations for the establishment of permanent endowments and sales tax exemption matching funds received pursuant to s. 212.08(5)(j), which must be invested, with the proceeds of the investment used to support libraries and instruction and research programs, as defined by the Board of Governors.
- (2) The Board of Governors shall specify the process for submission, documentation, and approval of requests for matching funds, accountability for endowments and proceeds of endowments, allocations to universities, restrictions on the use of the proceeds from endowments, and criteria used in determining the value of donations.
- (3)(a) The Board of Governors shall allocate the amount appropriated to each university based on the amount of the donation and the restrictions applied to the donation.
- (b) Donations for a specific purpose must be matched in the following manner:
- 1. Each university that raises at least \$100,000 but no more than \$599,999 from a private source must receive a matching grant equal to 50 percent of the private contribution.
- 2. Each university that raises a contribution of at least \$600,000 but no more than \$1 million from a private source must receive a matching grant equal to 70 percent of the private contribution.
- 3. Each university that raises a contribution in excess of \$1 million but no more than \$1.5 million from a private source must receive a matching grant equal to 75 percent of the private contribution.
- 4. Each university that raises a contribution in excess of \$1.5 million but no more than \$2 million from a private source must receive a matching grant equal to 80 percent of the private contribution.
- 5. Each university that raises a contribution in excess of \$2 million from a private source must receive a matching grant equal to 100 percent of the private contribution.
- (c) The Board of Governors shall encumber state matching funds for any pledged contributions, pro rata, based on the requirements for state matching funds as specified for the particular challenge grant and the amount of the private donations actually received by the university for the respective challenge grant.

- (4) Matching funds may be provided for contributions encumbered or pledged under the Eminent Scholars Act prior to July 1, 1994, and for donations or pledges of any amount equal to or in excess of the prescribed minimums which are pledged for the purpose of this section.
- (5)(a) Each university foundation shall establish a challenge grant account for each challenge grant as a depository for private contributions and state matching funds to be administered on behalf of the Board of Governors or the university. State matching funds must be transferred to a university foundation upon notification that the university has received and deposited the amount specified in this section in a foundation challenge grant account.
- (b) The foundation serving a university has the responsibility for the maintenance and investment of its challenge grant account and for the administration of the program on behalf of the university, pursuant to procedures specified by the Board of Governors. Each foundation shall include in its annual report to the Board of Governors information concerning collection and investment of matching gifts and donations and investment of the account.
- (c) A donation of at least \$600,000 and associated state matching funds may be used to designate an Eminent Scholar Endowed Chair pursuant to procedures specified by the Board of Governors.
- (6) The donations, state matching funds, or proceeds from endowments established under this section may not be expended for the construction, renovation, or maintenance of facilities or for the support of intercollegiate athletics.
- (7) Each university shall notify all donors of private funds of a substantial delay in the availability of state matching funds for this program.

1013.79 University Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program.—

- (1) The Legislature recognizes that the universities do not have sufficient physical facilities to meet the current demands of their instructional and research programs. It further recognizes that, to strengthen and enhance universities, it is necessary to provide facilities in addition to those currently available from existing revenue sources. It further recognizes that there are sources of private support that, if matched with state support, can assist in constructing much-needed facilities and strengthen the commitment of citizens and organizations in promoting excellence throughout the state universities. Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature to establish a trust fund to provide the opportunity for each university to receive support for challenge grants for instructional and research-related capital facilities within the university.
- (2) There is established the Alec P. Courtelis University Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program for the purpose of assisting universities build high priority instructional and research-related capital facilities, including common areas connecting such facilities. The associated foundations that serve the universities shall solicit gifts from private sources to provide matching funds for capital facilities. For the purposes of this act, private sources of funds shall not include any federal, state, or local government funds that a university may receive.
- (3)(a) There is established the Alec P. Courtelis Capital Facilities Matching Trust Fund to facilitate the development of high priority instructional and research-related capital facilities, including common areas connecting such facilities, within a university. All appropriated funds deposited into the trust fund shall be invested pursuant to s. 17.61. Interest income accruing to that portion of the trust fund shall increase the total funds available for the challenge grant program.

- (b) Effective July 1, 2009, the Alec P. Courtelis Capital Facilities Matching Trust Fund is terminated.
- (c) The State Board of Education shall pay any outstanding debts and obligations of the terminated fund as soon as practicable, and the Chief Financial Officer shall close out and remove the terminated funds from various state accounting systems using generally accepted accounting principles concerning warrants outstanding, assets, and liabilities.
- (d) By June 30, 2008, all private funds and associated interest earnings held in the Alec P. Courtelis Capital Facilities Matching Trust Fund shall be transferred to the originating university's individual program account.
- (4) Each university shall establish, pursuant to s. 1011.42, a facilities matching grant program account as a depository for private contributions provided under this section. Once a project is under contract, funds appropriated as state matching funds may be transferred to the university's account once the Board of Governors certifies receipt of the private matching funds pursuant to subsection (5). State funds that are not needed as matching funds for the project for which appropriated shall be transferred, together with any accrued interest, back to the state fund from which such funds were appropriated. The transfer of unneeded state funds shall occur within 30 days after final completion of the project or within 30 days after a determination that the project will not be completed. The Public Education Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund or the Capital Improvement Trust Fund shall not be used as the source of the state match for private contributions. Interest income accruing from the private donations shall be returned to the participating foundation upon completion of the project.
- (5) A project may not be initiated unless all private funds for planning, construction, and equipping the facility have been received and deposited in the separate university program account designated for this purpose. However, these requirements do not preclude the university from expending funds derived from private sources to develop a prospectus, including preliminary architectural schematics or models, for use in its efforts to raise private funds for a facility, and for site preparation, planning, and construction. The Board of Governors shall establish a method for validating the receipt and deposit of private matching funds. The Legislature may appropriate the state's matching funds in one or more fiscal years for the planning, construction, and equipping of an eligible facility. Each university shall notify all donors of private funds of a substantial delay in the availability of state matching funds for this program.
- (6) To be eligible to participate in the Alec P. Courtelis University Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program, a university shall raise a contribution equal to one-half of the total cost of a facilities construction project from private nongovernmental sources which shall be matched by a state appropriation equal to the amount raised for a facilities construction project subject to the General Appropriations Act.
- (7) If the state's share of the required match is insufficient to meet the requirements of subsection (6), the university shall renegotiate the terms of the contribution with the donors. If the project is terminated, each private donation, plus accrued interest, reverts to the foundation for remittance to the donor.
- (8) By October 15 of each year, the Board of Governors shall transmit to the Legislature a list of projects that meet all eligibility requirements to participate in the Alec P. Courtelis University Facility Enhancement Challenge Grant Program and a budget request that includes the recommended schedule necessary to complete each project.

- (9) In order for a project to be eligible under this program, it must be included in the university 5-year capital improvement plan and must receive approval from the Board of Governors or the Legislature.
- (10) A university's project may not be removed from the approved 3-year PECO priority list because of its successful participation in this program until approved by the Legislature and provided for in the General Appropriations Act. When such a project is completed and removed from the list, all other projects shall move up on the 3-year PECO priority list. A university shall not use PECO funds, including the Capital Improvement Trust Fund fee and the building fee, to complete a project under this section.
- (11) The surveys, architectural plans, facility, and equipment shall be the property of the State of Florida. A facility constructed pursuant to this section may be named in honor of a donor at the option of the university and the Board of Governors. No facility shall be named after a living person without prior approval by the Legislature.

University Implementation and State Oversight of Common Program Prerequisites Has Improved (Report 10-43)

- Update of a 2008 OPPAGA that found significant problems with the implementation of the state's common program prerequisites policy
 - Universities were not consistently implementing common prerequisites for nearly two-thirds (65%) of programs we reviewed
 - Transfer students could be denied admission to university programs or required to take additional courses, which represents additional costs to the student and the state
 - The Board of Governors and Department of Education had not effectively monitored and enforced the common prerequisites policy
- Implementation and monitoring of the common prerequisites policy has greatly improved since our 2008 report

The Board of Governors and Department of Education Improved Oversight of the Common Prerequisites

- The board created an annual review process for the common prerequisites
 - Our prior report noted that the board and the department had not systematically monitored how the common prerequisites were implemented since the policy was established in 1996
- The board strengthened its communication with state universities about the common prerequisites
- The department has taken action to monitor transfer students' problems with the common prerequisites
 - Online system that allows students and colleges to communicate problems they encounter related to common prerequisites

Florida Colleges and Universities Are Addressing Textbook Affordability (Report 10-49)

Overview

- Progress report for OPPAGA's 2008 examination of textbook costs and whether institutions were implementing cost containment efforts
 - Textbook costs increased faster than inflation and averaged about \$120 per course
 - Florida's colleges were using textbook cost containment mechanisms more than universities
- Since our review, the federal government and the Florida Legislature passed textbook affordability legislation and institutions have developed regulations and policies

Textbook Affordability – Congress

- The Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008
 - required institutions and publishers to provide more information on textbook prices and revisions
 - required institutions to disclose the retail price and International Standard Book Number of every required and recommended material
 - required publishers to indicate whether textbooks are available in any other format and at what price
 - required publishers to supply textbooks in bundled and unbundled formats

Textbook Affordability – The Florida Legislature

- 2008 Legislature passed Ch. 2008-78, Laws of Florida
 - Prohibited college and university employees from receiving money for requiring a specific textbook
 - Allowed employees to accept free materials from publishers, royalties from publications, and honoraria for peer review services
 - Required colleges and universities to post required textbooks for all courses on their website no less than 30 days before first day of classes
 - Directed the State Board of Education and Board of Governors to adopt policies and procedures
- 2009 Legislature directed the Florida Distance Learning Consortium to develop a plan to promote and increase open access textbooks (digital texts that can be accessed on-line for free)

Florida Colleges and Universities Are Addressing Textbook Affordability

- The State Board of Education adopted rules to address/implement each legislative requirement in the Florida College System
- DOE established minimum text guidelines and requirements in rule and established a Textbook Affordability Workgroup
- The Board of Governors established a task force on textbook affordability and required universities to adopt regulations to establish textbook adoption procedures
- In 2009, the Orange Grove Texts Plus initiative was launched and offered approximately 170 open access texts

Textbook Affordability Monitoring Efforts

- DOE reports that it will monitor through surveys and college website reviews
 - first surveyed institutions in March 2010
 - no plan to regularly survey
- Board of Governors had no plans to monitor textbook regulation implementation – pointed to board of trustees as responsible for institutional compliance

Methodology

- Compiled education budget reduction strategies over the last three weeks from all 50 states
- Focused on FY 2010-11 strategies; some information on FY 2011-12 strategies as well
- Used third party sources to develop an initial list of strategies for each state
 - National Conference of State Legislatures
 - Southern Regional Education Board
- Asked other states' appropriations staff to verify our initial list and add other strategies as appropriate
- Some states were able to verify their information; others were not

Four Major Categories

- 1. Reductions in general operating funds for colleges, universities, and other postsecondary institutions
- 2. Reductions in funding for student financial assistance programs
- 3. Reductions in funding for categorically funded, earmarked, or specific programs
- 4. Tuition policy strategies

General Operating Funds Reduction Strategies

- 1. Overall reduction in general operating funds for institutions
- 2. Overall reduction in operating funds with specific requirements for how the reduction will be accomplished
- 3. Eliminate funding for specific institutions with low enrollments (proposed)

Overall Reductions in General Operating Funds

- 35 states made overall reductions in general operating funds
 - A few states targeted their reductions to specific systems (e.g., community colleges,...)
- The reductions ranged from 1.1% in Wisconsin to 14.5% in Iowa (universities)
- Overall reductions were often paired with cost saving measures (initiated by institutions, governing boards, or the state legislature)

Overall Reductions With Specific Required Decreases

- Nevada (6.9% overall reduction)
 - Suspended funding for longevity payments and merit pay increases for classified employees of the Nevada System of Higher Education
 - Included a 4.6% pay cut for nontenured higher education employees

Eliminating State Funding for Specific Institutions

- Texas (Proposed by the House for 2011-12)
 - Eliminates state funding for 4 of the 50 community colleges in Texas; based on significant drops in student enrollments or contact hours at these four colleges over time

Cost Saving Measures Examples

- Employee furloughs or layoffs (4 states)
- Higher faculty workloads (3 states)
 - Utah estimates that increasing the number of instructional hours taught by faculty will allow it to reduce 545 faculty and staff positions
- Colorado increased employee contributions for health and retirement benefits
- Oklahoma authorized the refinancing of bonds for the university system's Master Lease Purchase and Endowed Chairs programs. The refinancing of the Master Lease program saved the state \$16.5 million in bond payments for Fiscal Year 2010-11

Cost Saving Measures Examples Continued

- South Carolina enacted regulatory reform bills that provide a variety of cost saving opportunities for institutions by allowing more flexibility in the areas of human resources, procurement, and maintenance and construction of capital projects
- South Carolina established a Commission on Higher Education Cost Reduction to identify and facilitate the implementation of practices and policies aimed at reducing the cost of providing higher education
- lowa has proposed prohibiting sabbaticals for universities during Fiscal Year 2011-12, saving an estimated \$165,000
- Nevada has proposed for upcoming fiscal years to reduce overall funding but allow more flexibility in the use of revenues generated from non-state sources such as tuition and registration fees

Reductions in Student Financial Assistance

- 15 states reported reductions in state funding for student financial assistance
 - Need-based Aid Programs (8 states)
 - Merit-based Aid Programs (2 states)
 - Tuition assistance for students attending private institutions (3 states)
 - Nursing or health related scholarships (2 states)
 - Teacher scholarships (2 states)
 - Unspecified (7 states)
- Michigan reduced state funding for student financial assistance by 61%

Categorical Funding Reduction Strategies

- North Carolina made the following reductions to categorically funded programs
 - Reduced targeted funds for centers and institutes in the University of North Carolina system by \$14 million
 - Reduced aid to university hospitals by \$8 million
 - Reduced the university system advertising budget by \$2.5 million
- Pennsylvania eliminated the state funding provided to several universities/programs that were not stateowned or affiliated (they had been receiving state funding). Examples: Drexel University and Thomas Jefferson University Medical School
- Virginia reduced funding (\$2.0 million) for the Eminent Scholars Program

Tuition Policy Strategies

- 1. General tuition increases
- 2. Special fees created or increased
- 3. Eliminate tuition waivers
- 4. Excess hours penalties

General Tuition Increases

- 12 states increased general tuition and fees
 - In many states, tuition rates are set by state governing boards or individual institutions
- Tuition increases ranged from 4% at Georgia's two year colleges to 56.4% at one Maryland community college
- Concerns over large tuition increases led South Carolina's Budget and Control Board to place a moratorium on campus construction projects at those colleges and universities that raised tuition by 7% or more

Special Fees and Tuition Waivers

- Georgia continued a special institutional fee, which ranged from \$100 per semester for students at two-year colleges to \$200 per semester for students at research universities
 - The Board of Regents created this temporary fee in 2008 to help institutions meet budgetary reductions – it has been re-established each year by the board as a part of its budget reduction strategies
- North Carolina repealed a tuition waiver for nonresident athletes on full scholarship, saving an estimated \$9.4 million
 - The state previously reimbursed the university system for loss of revenue due to these waivers

Excess Hours Penalties

- North Carolina increased to 50% the tuition surcharge for students exceeding 140 credit hours in a traditional four-year program in Fiscal Year 2010-11, saving an estimated \$1 million
- The Utah Legislature authorized institutions to absorb overall budget reductions (7%) where they felt they would have the least impact. However, the Legislature asked them to consider looking at covering more of the cost of instruction with tuition for those students who accumulate credit hours in excess of 125% of the number of hours required for graduation
