# 2026 Legislation Introduced

#### SENATE BILL 30

#### RATE FILING FOR PROPERTY INSURERS

Expands the powers of the consumer advocate in insurance proceedings and caps property insurance rate increases.

#### SENATE BILL 32

## INJUNCTIONS FOR PROTECTION IN CASES OF REPEAT OR SERIOUS VIOLENCE

Expands protective injunctions to cover single acts of "serious violence," not just repeat violence.

#### SENATE BILL 34

#### HISTORIC CEMETERIES PROGRAM

Strengthens the Historic Cemeteries Program by requiring local governments to approve zoning/land-use changes of excess land sold by historic African American cemeteries for maintenance funding.

#### SENATE BILL 36

#### USE OF PROFESSIONAL NURSING TITLES

Clarifies which doctoral titles nurses may use and requires them to specify their profession when using the title "Doctor".

#### SENATE BILL 38

### PARITY FOR NONNURSING SERVICES UNDER LONG-TERM MANAGED CARE PLANS

Requires AHCA to reimburse licensed non-nursing providers at equal or greater rates than unlicensed providers under Medicaid LTC.

# 2026 Legislative Bills Introduced Continued

#### SENATE BILL 40

#### MEDICAID PROVIDERS

Expands Medicaid managed care contract requirements to improve access and transparency.

#### SENATE BILL 42

### SPECIFIC MEDICAL DIAGNOSES IN CHILD PROTECTIVE INVESTIGATIONS

Balances child-protection investigations with safeguards for families of children with rare/complex diagnoses.

#### SENATE BILL 46

### NONPARTICIPATING AND OUT-OF-NETWORK NURSE REGISTRIES AND HOME HEALTH AGENCIES

Creates broad protections ensuring patients can use out-of-network nurse registries and HHAs, with reimbursement parity.

#### SENATE BILL 54

#### USE OF SUBSTANCES AFFECTING COGNITIVE FUNCTIONS

Requires autopsies and toxicology screening for mass shooter suspect (deceased or arrested) and mandates training on psychotropic drug effects for law enforcement and school safety staff.

#### SENATE BILL 56

#### RESIDENTIAL IMPACTS FROM MINING ACTIVITIES

Enhances protections for residents near construction materials mining activities.
