I traveled to Orlando for the Florida Association of Counties (FAC) meeting which gave me the opportunity to meet with County Commissioners from across Senate District 3. We started early with the Small County Coalition breakfast, where I was honored to receive their "Outstanding Leadership" award for my work on rural broadband. Later in the day, I served on a panel for FAC's Access 67: Expanding Broadband Access in Florida. As you can see from the photo below, there is a LOT of interest in this subject and we had a great conversation about how to keep moving forward to make sure that every Floridian has access to high-speed internet.

The ACCESS 47 Initiative of the Florida Associat of Counties (FAC) is focused to policy solutions assist rural and urban communities deliver effec public safety, healthcare, economic developmen and education. The COVID-19 pandemic hurther illustrated the digital divide leaving uncerved an underserved communities disconnected from distanced learning, remote work, and telehealth opportunities.

#### The ACCESS 67 panel will offer local, state, and fieldraig perspectives on the challenges of closing the digital divide through public policy. Recent state legislative developments will be discussed highlighting the efforts of the Florida Legislature through the Department of Economic Opportun Office of Broadband. Industry and policy leaders will discuss solutions to address the impacts of the lack of ACCESS to critical telecommunicatio and information technology resources in Florida.

Policy topics to be covered include: general/state of access in Florida's counties, Broadband federal recovery funding, local solutions (county initiative state legislative/executive/DEO developments, hallenges/opportunities of expansion, mapping, a

Speaking of broadband, I have the privilege of serving as co-chair of the NewDEAL Forum's National Broadband Task Force, which met for the first time this month. The mission of the Task Force is to identify barriers limiting access and affordability of high-speed internet. As you are aware, Florida's rural broadband limitations are neither new nor unique. But more than a year into a pandemic that's made the deficiencies all the more apparent, many remote Florida communities are still without reliable internet access. I am looking forward to the work of this Task Force to continue moving forward on this critical issue.

### **QUICK REMINDERS**

The American Rescue Plan included the largest Child Tax Credit ever and historic relief to most working families. Many families received their first round of payments on July 15th and will continue to receive payments of \$250 or \$300 per child on the 15th of each month (August will be the

Saturday is the start of the 2021 Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday, which runs from July 31 – August 9, 2021. Qualifying items will be exempt from tax, including certain school supplies, clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$60 or less per item, and the first \$1,000 of the sales price of personal
