LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

SB 28: RELIEF OF CLIFFORD WILLIAMS BY THE STATE OF FLORIDA

This bill, which was passed unanimously and has been **signed by the Governor**, compensates Clifford Williams, who was wrongfully convicted and spent 43 years in prison.

SB 400: ELDER ABUSE FATALITY REVIEW TEAMS

Now law, SB 400 creates teams statewide to review closed cases where the death of an elderly person is confirmed to have been caused by abuse or neglect. The teams will identify potential gaps in the delivery of services to the elderly or the need for policy changes.

HB 835: ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE

The bill establishes a Dementia Director position within the Department of Elder Affairs to coordinate the state's policies and programs for addressing Alzheimer's disease. **This bill has been signed into law.** For the second year in a row, I was able to secure \$319,000 for the Alzheimer's Association Brain Bus.
