  - a. How will requested funds be spent? Include supporting documentation.

Grant funding was requested to assist in reconstructing the four sets of columns on the Dixie Highway landing, located on the eastern side of the National Register of Historic Places-listed Lake Mirror Promenade. Large vertical cracks in all four sets of columns were observed following a windstorm event in early 2016. Subsequently, the columns were stabilized by temporary canvas bands, and following an evaluation by the City's Facilities Division, determined to be irreparable. This project will consist of removing the existing columns and salvaging the Corinthian capitals and bases, if possible. The large rectangular bases will remain as-is. Molds will then be created from the existing columns, and new concrete columns will be cast from the molds. Finally, the columns will be assembled and reinstalled on site, and new electrical conduit will be installed to power the existing light fixtures, which will be reused. When complete, the Dixie Highway Landing columns will appear exactly as they were designed in 1928.

b. Identify expected program results and the expected benefit associated from the requested funds.

The grant funding will reconstruct and help to maintain a major design/focal element of the Lake Mirror Promenade, ensuring the safety of the public in visiting and enjoying this local and statewide historic landmark.

d. What specific measures will be used to document performance data for the project, if it receives funds?
