Funds in this Section for the University of Florida West Palm Beach Global Center for Technology and Innovation (GCTI) (Senate Form 2715) are provided for the design and construction of educational facilities focused in the areas of engineering, law, business, and other areas involving Financial Technology on a campus to be located in Palm Beach County, Florida. Such uses are contingent upon: (1) the University of Florida receiving one or more donations of land in Palm Beach County comprising at least 13 acres; and (2) upon the University of Florida obtaining, within 60 days of the effective date of this law, at least \$100,000,000 in commitments for cash gifts to be used in support of this endeavor and with commitments that such gifts be paid in full on or before July 1, 2027. If the University of Florida Board of Trustees determines that the contingencies are not successfully met, the funds provided in this section for the University of Florida West Palm Beach Global Center for Technology and Innovation (GCTI) (Senate Form 2715) may be used by the University of Florida for the purposes set forth above in a location outside of Palm Beach County deemed appropriate by a majority vote of the University of Florida Board of Trustees.</p>
